NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Special Event Permit – San Diego Brew Fest

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Peninsula

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 2

LOCATION: Preble Field at NTC Park in Liberty Station (see attached map)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for the San Diego Brew Fest that would occur on January 7, 2023 at the Preble Field at NTC Park in Liberty Station. The event would include beer/alcohol, food trucks, lawn games, a stage, entertainment, sound amplification, generators, fencing and/or barriers, portable restrooms, canopies, tables, and chairs. Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 8 AM to 5 PM on January 6, 2023 to January 7, 2023 from 12 PM to 7 PM. Set-up would occur from 8 AM until 5 PM on January 6, 2023, the event would occur on January 7, 2023 from 12 PM to 5 PM, and dismantling would follow from 5 PM until 7 PM. The parking lot on Cushing Road between Dewey and Chauncey would be used for dumpsters and portable restrooms and would be unavailable for public use.

A road closure associated with the event would include Cushing Road between Roosevelt and Dewey Roads on January 7, 2023 from 11 AM to 5 PM.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing,

licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

Applications to appeal CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**December 6, 2022**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2021, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

1. Appeals filed via E-mail: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. The [appeal application can be obtained here](#). You must separately mail the appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101**. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
2. Appeals filed In-Person: The appeal application can be obtained in the Lobby of the City Administration Building located at 202 'C' Street, San Diego, CA 92101. The completed appeal package must include the required appeal fee in the form of a check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101**.
