NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Special Event Permit – LA VUELTA SUMMER CRUISE NIGHTS

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Barrio Logan

COUNCIL DISTRICT: 8

LOCATION: Logan Avenue between 26th Street and Evans Streets

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Special Event Permit for a summer cruise series that would include a display of parked and slowly moving vehicles that would occur in Barrio Logan on Logan Avenue between 26th Street and Evans Streets from 5 PM until 8 PM every other Wednesday from April 26, 2023 through August 16, 2023; May 10, May 24, June 7, June 21, July 5, July 19, August 2, and August 16. Noise associated with the events activities and set-up/dismantling would occur on the event dates listed above from 4:00 PM until 9 PM. Set up would occur from 4:00 PM until 5 PM, the event would occur from 5 PM until 8 PM, and dismantling would occur from 8 PM until 9 PM. Traffic delays should be anticipated during the event dates listed above.

Street closures would be associated with this event and would include Evans Street north of Logan Avenue to the cul-de-sac and the Logan Avenue cul-de-sac east of 26th Street from 5 PM until 8 PM on the dates listed above.

There would be no public parking available from 4 PM until 8 PM on dates listed above and would include on both sides of Logan Avenue between 26th and S. Evans Street; 26th Street and Logan Avenue to the dead end; S. Evans Avenue dead end east of Logan Avenue, and 100' for MTS temporary bus stops on temporary bus stop on west bound National Ave @ Dewey St. east of crosswalk, west side of driveway at 1985 National Ave #1127 (National Laundry and Dry Cleaning), bus stop. North bound National Ave, South bound National Ave @ Sampson St.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego

conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
