# **NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL**

## **ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION**

**SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT**

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**PROJECT NAME:** Special Event Permit – San Diego Triathlon Challenge

**COMMUNITY PLAN AREA:** Mission Bay Park, Mission Beach, Pacific Beach, Peninsula, Ocean Beach  
**COUNCIL DISTRICT:** 2

**LOCATION:** Bonita Cove, Ventura Cove, and surrounding pathways/roadways (see attached maps)

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Special Event Permit for a triathlon and festival event that would include the, bicycling events, wheelchair/running/walking events, swimming, portable restrooms, tables, chairs, bleachers, canopies, fencing and/or barriers, drones, on site food preparation, food trucks, stages and entertainment, sound amplification, generators, that would on October 22, 2023 (see attached maps for swimming, biking and running routes). Noise associated with the event activities and set-up/dismantling would occur from 6 AM on October 20, 2023, until 5 PM on October 23, 2023. Set-up would occur over two days; October 20 & 21, 2023 from 6 AM to 6 PM each day, the event would occur on October 22, 2023 from 5 AM to 5 PM. Dismantling would occur over two days; October 22, 2023 from 5 PM to 9 PM and on October 23, 2023 from 7 AM to 5 PM.

Road closures associated with this event would include Mariners Way from the entrance to the park to the end of the park, eastbound direction from October 20, 2023 at 7 AM to October 23, 2023 at 7 AM, and an eastbound lane closure on West Mission Bay Drive from Gleason Road to Quivira Road on October 22, 2023 from 7:30 AM to 12 PM and westbound lane on West Mission Bay Dr from Quivira Road to Gleason Dr on October 22, 2023 from 9 AM to 2 PM. .

Approximately 120 parking spaces in Bonita Cove East parking lot would be closed from October 20, 2023 at 7 AM to October 23, 2023 at 5 PM.

**ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL:** City of San Diego

**ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities); Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land); Section 15311 (Accessory Structures).

**ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee

**STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:** The City of San Diego

conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section(s): Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which allows for the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alterations of existing public or private structures or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use; Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which allows for minor, temporary use of land that has negligible or no permanent effects on the environment; Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which allows for construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities, including, but not limited to, temporary use items in publicly owned facilities or other facilities designated for public use; and where the exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
