Sir; I desire to report the fact, that the restaurant known as Buon Gusto situated at the N.E. corner of 6th and I street, has become headquarters for lewd and dissolute persons, men and women, who use loud and profane, language, regardless of who may be in hearing;

They pretend to serve a meal, which in reality consists of about five cents worth of Chille Con Carne, which remains on the table and is not eaten, but beer and wine is served by the bottle until the customers become drunk and boisterous; Last night (Sunday) I saw from 4 to 6 bottles on some of the tables, but no sign of anything to eat, which clearly violates the restaurant liquor ordinance,

Detectives Boisseree-Wisler and officer McAlmond can testify to the above statements.

I sent for the two parties named and have investigated the circumstances and cautioned them to stop the disorder and unseemly conduct in their restaurant. I recommend that Angello Maggiora and Louis Fornaca, proprietors of the Buon Gusto Restaurant, be placed upon probation until further notice, and in the event that they do not conduct their restaurant properly in the future, that their restaurant license be summarily revoked.
