

PROTEST.

Whereas, a petition has been filed with the City Council asking for a license to conduct a saloon at 1419 D St., between 5th & 6, therefore be it:

Resolved, that we the members of the ^{Salomith Street} South Ch. E church, in ~~session~~ ^{meeting} assembled, earnestly protest against said proposed saloon and urge that the application for a license therefore be denied:

First, because any saloon does harm.

Second, because the proposed site is at the junction of all street cars of the city where great numbers of children and youths must necessarily congregate while waiting for cars.

Third, because a saloon in that special place, being on the great thoroughfare of the city, will be an eyesore to San Diegans and tourists alike, give the latter a bad impression and so result in positive damage to the city, even from a financial standpoint.

The above preamble and resolution was moved, duly seconded discussed and unanimously carried at a meeting of the church held this 25th day of Dec. 1904.
