IV. NON-AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT:

A. Kate Yavenditti: Ms. Yavenditti, member of Women Occupy San Diego (WOSD), commented that she was looking forward to listening to Chuck Sevilla tonight along with other members of WOSD. She expressed her feelings and experience with the San Diego Police Department. She further stated how it was important to hear the other perspectives, such as Chuck Sevilla.

B. Coleen Cusack: Criminal Defense Attorney Coleen Cusack commented that she also was looking forward to hearing Chuck Sevilla's presentation about police credibility.

C. Alicia Mason: Ms. Mason shared her past-experience with SDPD. She stated she made a complaint and she was given a letter that her complaint was treated as a level 2. She expressed her dissatisfaction to the classification and she requested justice for how she was treated by SDPD.

D. Francine Maxwell: Ms. Maxwell commented that a member of the CRB passed out a paper on SDPD curbing practice at the Citizens Advisory Board on Community Police Relations' meeting exemplifying to the community that it is a policy when it is not. Ms. Maxwell stated that the paper is a bulletin and not a policy.

V. **GUEST SPEAKER: Dr. Joel Day, Director of City of San Diego Office Boards & Commissions**

Joel Day provided the CRB with an update from the Mayor's Office. He reported that he is asking all Advisory Boards, including the CRB, to get standardized reports of how all Boards should be modeled. He will be using this information to come up with a format with key components on how Boards are run and show a study on how Boards using these components have grown and improved overtime.

Question from CRB: Will there be compensation for our mileage for Outreach Events? Mr. Day responded in the negative.

Question from CRB: When will we know if there are more people being nominated for the CRB? When will we receive this information? Mr. Day reported that this information will be coming from the CRB's Executive Director. The first thing that needs to happen is marketing the new Training Academy, so we can get new prospects.

C. Concerned Citizen Correspondence Regarding CRB Member & CRB Member Response to the Concerned Citizen. (Chair Joe Craver)

1st Vice Chair Hilpert provided the Board and attendees with an explanation for being mistaken as a citizen who was having issues with a neighbor. Because his identity was mistaken for another citizen with the same name, Mr. Hilpert reported that he was defamed by the concerned citizen who wrote a letter to the Mayor's office that included posts from his Social Media account from current and prior events. 1st Vice Chair Hilpert expressed the importance of being on the CRB and how much he cares for the Board. Chair Craver reminded the Board to be careful on what is posted on social media.

VIII. COMMITTEE REPORTS (DISCUSSION/ACTION):

A. Continuing Education Committee

(Taura Gentry)

- Update on 2/27 Committee Meeting Date- Although the Committee did not meet on 2/27, 2nd Vice Chair Gentry reported that at the last CRB Open Meeting she passed out list of upcoming trainings. She apologized for Chuck Sevilla not making his presentation. She plans to schedule him again as soon as she can. We scheduled the Wellness Unit of the SDPD to present at the April meeting. The Mid-City Division Community Relation Officers will present in May. The Southeastern Division Juvenile Services Team will present the following month. Daniel Orth, Lt. Kelso and Servin will present on Know Your Rights from a community and police perspective. 2nd Vice Chair Gentry expressed her reasons for bringing SDPD as speakers. She explained that the decision was based on feedback from the community asking questions about SDPD.

B. Outreach Committee

The members discussed continuing to explore with SDPD the creation of a center source of information on community meetings such as National Night Out and Coffee with a Cop. The Committee is working on getting input on other community organizations that the CRB should be participating at.
- Summary Past Events – Committee Chair O'Tousa reported they attended the Building Trust and CAST meetings with faith leaders and community. Two volunteers from the Board attended the de-escalation training/techniques for new SDPD officers.

C. Rules Committee:

(Doug Case)

- Update on 3/19 Committee Meeting – Committee Chair Case reported the work of the Committee. The first item was the Operational Standing Rule on the audit of Category II cases. The

Team leaders recently did a trial run of an Audit of Category II cases and the process went well. Two thirds of complaints received are Category II. Committee Chair Case explained the history of the Board working on this item.

- Operational Standing Rule on Audit of Category 2 Cases- Committee Chair Case explained the purpose of doing this type of audit. Category II complaints are investigated by each SDPD division. An audit should not take longer than 2 hours. A report will be written and presented to the Board at Closed Session. The Board will be looking at whether the complaint was classified correctly and if all allegations were investigated.

Doug Case moved for the Board's approval of the Operational Standing Rule on Audit of Category 2 Cases. Mary O'Tousa seconded the motion. The motion passed with a vote of 20-0-1

- Case Summaries for Publication Update – The goal is for the Board to be as transparent as they can for the community and giving them information on case statistics. The question to Outside Counsel was asked if they could redact summary to cases to show the public, and it was denied. The Committee came up with a list of potential elements which was sent to the CRB's Outside Counsel for feedback.
- Status on Procedure for Shooting Review Board Reports – Some of the members had an issue with the reports and its approach. In their next meeting they are going to be discussing and revising it.
- CRB Tactical Plan – We have the first draft of the CRB Tactical Plan and we are working on a 2nd draft.

D. Policy Committee:

(Brandon Hilpert)

1. Update on 3/12 Committee Meeting

- a. Procedure & Guidelines for SDPD Complaint Intake: 1st Vice Chair reported on information and a timeline of the steps on what the processes is for a complaint and what to expect.
- b. Development of Third-Party Mediation: CRB Board member Nancy Vaughn is working with the Committee on creating a huge spread sheet with other departments.
- c. Best Practices Research for Law Enforcement Investigations Involving Discrimination Allegations: CRB Board member Patrick Anderson is helping assist the team in this area.
- d. Procedure and Statistics for Internal Affairs Tolling of Cases: The Committee is looking at the stats on how long cases are being tolled and for what reasons.
- e. Complaint Process Guide Card Issued to All Sworn Personnel: There is going to be another complaint form that will have the complaint process steps on the back of the card.

E. Recruitment & Retention Committee: (Maria Nieto-Senour)

- Next Scheduled Committee Date – Committee Chair Nieto-Senour reported she needed to schedule a meeting of the Committee.
- New CRB Training Academy – Committee Chair Nieto-Senour reported they are in the process of creating steps and guidelines. The Academy will have a minimum of 7 and maximum of 14 people to train at a time.
- Interview Panel Improvements – Committee Chair Nieto-Senour reported that they are working on inviting two members of the community to participate on the panel.

F. Citizens Advisory Board on Police Community Relations (CAB) (Taura Gentry)

- 2nd Vice Chair Gentry reported that CAB has been working on their recommendations since 2017. She stated that she wanted to clarify a statement that was made earlier in the meeting regarding a Training Bulletin that was passed out at last night's CAB meeting. She did not pass it out as a policy. 1st Vice Chair Gentry referenced the Training Bulletin as an example when she was speaking. She further reported that CAB is working on scheduling a working retreat.

- G. Red Binder (Doug Case)
- Committee Chair Doug Case reported that the Red Binder is being reduced into a training manual/orientation binder for the new trainees of the CRB. Most of the information that will be taken out of the Red Binder will be placed on the website. They are currently creating a spread sheet to help figure out what should and should not be on the website and/or binder.

- H. 30th Anniversary Celebration (July 2019) (Brandon Hilpert)
- Date and Location – No report

IX. CHAIR'S REPORT (Chair Joe Craver)

- A. Reminder – 3rd Quarter of Volunteer Hours (Due on the April 1, 2019)
- B. Debriefing from Meeting Chief Nisleit – Chair Craver reported the cabinet discussed the status of complaint process improvements. This improvement will give the CRB Executive Director access to IAPRO to enable her to have information on all category complaints and having a joint complaint form and adding a section on the form that explains the process. They also discussed the status of auditing the Category II cases and putting summary of cases on the CRB website and data portal.
- C. Training of CRB on Case Review and Presentation Procedures– Chair Craver reported this is an ongoing and being developed and there will be a follow up.

X. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (Sharmaine Moseley)

- A. Caseload Update & Status of Case Reports –
- Earlier today, the Board started off with 21 active cases. Four of those active cases were placed on the Closed Meeting agenda for review and are now closed. The Teams read through one shooting review report and two Category II case reports. As a result, the Teams now have a total of 17 active cases. In fiscal year 2019, the CRB deliberated on and closed out a total of 42 cases.
- Team 1– 2 cases; Team 2 – 3 cases; Team 3 – 2 cases; Team 4 – 3 cases; Team 5 – 2 cases; Team 6 – 3 cases; and Team 7 – 2 cases
- B. Status of Ride-Alongs for New Members – Executive Director Moseley reported that member's Fitch and Montano completed their Ride-Alongs. She will follow-up with Maxine Clark.
- C. Other Items/Reminders (Polo Shirts) – 1st Vice Chair Brandon Hilpert reported that he still has the list of members who requested shirts. There has been a question on how to pay for the shirts.

XI. **SAN DIEGO POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT (Assistant Chief Al Guaderrama):** Assistant Chief Guaderrama reported that this is the first time he has stayed with the Board for 4 hours. He is very impressed with the Board and appreciates the dedication of the members. They might not always see eye to eye, but he appreciates the hard work of the Board.

XII. **BOARD MEMBER RIDE-ALONG REPORTS:**

- A. Member Fitch reported she asked her Ride-Along officer about mistrust with the police and what he thought about when a Black man is shot. This question led into a discussion with the Police officer about the social problems of criminalization and poverty and led to him answering that as a Police Officer they must do the best they can do for the community by listening to them.
- B. Member Gentry reported that her Ride-Along officer was very calm through the whole ride. There was not much action throughout the ride. She was in the Southeastern Division and learned about the issues that were happening in the area. She encouraged members to do a Ride-Along in the Southeastern Division.
- C. Member Montano reported he was surprised to see how many Police officers are present or available in one division for each watch. They seemed to be understaff.
- D. Member Yenpansook reported that she discussed with her Ride-Along what his approach is with his job. He stated that it is talking more with community members. He wants to be able to relate the people around him to show he understand and cares for them.
- E. Intern Jasmine Ribada reported that this was her first Ride-Along and it lasted 11 hours. She reported that she saw the difference between an officer who was been on the force less than a year versus one who has been in the force longer. The officer with less time on the force would show more motivation and care when taking suspects in by thinking through his processes and step, while an officer who has been in longer are more complacent and desensitize.

XIII. **ANNOUNCEMENTS/COMMENTS:** Nancy Vaughn announced that she plans to reserve a bus for the CRB to travel to the Museum of Tolerance in April.

Community Review Board on Police Practices (CRB)
Operational Standing Rule
Review of the San Diego Police Department's (SDPD)
Shooting Review Board Reports

When the Shooting Review Board (SRB) completes its review of tactics, training and equipment with regard to an officer-involved shooting, the Chief of Police sends a copy of the SRB report to the Community Review Board (CRB) via the CRB Executive Director. The original three-person Case Review Team will be assigned to review the report. If any member of the original Case Review Team is no longer serving on the Board, the Board Chair may assign a replacement, with priority given to Board Members who attended the original case presentation.

The Team will then review the SRB report, referring to the original Team Case Report and related IA documentation, as needed.

If the Team has questions or concerns about the SRB report, the Team may request the Executive Director or Board Chair contact the Chair of the SRB or the Executive Assistant Chief of Police to seek clarification.

The Team will then provide the full Board an oral summary of the findings of in the SRB in the case during closed session, including a short summary of the facts in the original Team Case Report. The Team will read the Shooting Review Board's report and verbally share any Team comments. No vote of the CRB Board is required. If the Board has concerns, however, it may vote to have the Board Chair send a letter to the Chair of the SRB and/or the Chief of Police.

5. Community Outreach

All members shall participate in at least one community outreach activity per quarter.

All members can speak about the role of the Board in public to provide education for the community. Only the Board Chair is the spokesperson for the Board on issues that require public comment.

6. Ethical Conduct

To promote public trust, integrity, and transparency, members are expected to adhere to the National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement (NACOLE) Code of Ethics. The NACOLE Code of Ethics includes Personal Integrity, Independent and Thorough Oversight, Transparency and Confidentiality, Respectful and Unbiased Treatment, Outreach and Relationship with Stakeholders, Agency Self-examination and Commitment to Policy Review, and Primary Obligation to the Community. The complete NACOLE Code of Ethics is attached as Exhibit A of these bylaws.

Any actual or perceived conflict of interest during case review shall be avoided. Conflict of interest exists when a member has an outside financial interest or a personal relationship with someone involved in the case or has intimate knowledge of the facts of the case. Members shall avoid any situation where they have a conflict of interest by immediately notifying the Executive Director and their Team Leader requesting either to be excused from review of the case or to have the case reassigned to a different Case Review Team. Active involvement in other boards, committees or organizations could pose an actual or perceived conflict of interest with membership on the Board. Board Members shall disclose all potential conflicts to the Executive Director immediately.

Section 3: Removal

A. Voluntary Resignation

Any Member of the Board can voluntarily resign by sending a letter or email of resignation to the Board Chair and the Executive Director. A member's written notice of resignation is required by the City Clerk and the Mayor's Office and becomes a matter of public record unless confidentiality is requested by the resigning member. Once the letter has been received, the position shall be considered vacant. Thereafter, the Mayor shall appoint and the City Council confirm a new member to fill the remainder of the term.

B. Removal for Cause

If a member is convicted of a felony or crime or moral turpitude, the member will automatically be suspended from participating in any capacity on the Board, pending a vote by the City Council upon recommendation from the Mayor to formally remove or reinstate the member from the Board all of which shall be completed within 30 days of the date of suspension.

A member may also be removed for cause including but not limited to the following reasons: (1) misuse of position as a Board Member, (2) misuse of police-issued

documents; (2) violation of state laws of confidentiality; (4) misconduct that impedes the member's ability to serve as an effective and impartial Board member; (5) unexcused absences from at least two consecutive meetings or by failure to complete case review as assigned by the Executive Director; (6) violation of the NACOLE Code of Ethics; or (7) a conflict of interest.

Upon receiving information that a member may be subject to removal for cause, the Executive Director shall investigate or arrange for an investigation of the situation. If after the investigation, it appears that cause exists for removal, the member shall be invited to meet with the Executive Director and the Cabinet. After that meeting, the Executive Director, in consultation with the Cabinet, shall determine whether to proceed with removal proceedings. If it is determined to proceed, the matter will be placed on the next regular Board Open Meeting agenda, ~~to be considered in Executive (Closed) Session~~. The member will have an opportunity to present a defense and answer questions. By a two-thirds vote, the Board may recommend to the Mayor that the member be removed. The affected member shall not be entitled to a cast a vote in the matter.

Upon recommendation of the Mayor to remove a member, a hearing by the City Council shall occur within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the recommendation.

C. Non-Reappointment

Any member can, at the end of their current term, be removed from the Board by non-reappointment at the Mayor's discretion during the annual appointment process. A non-reappointed member may continue to serve until his or her successor is duly appointed and qualified.

Article IV: Officers

Section 1: Officers of the Board

The officers of this organization shall be Chair, First Vice Chair, and Second Vice Chair. These elected officers shall be referred to collectively as the Cabinet.

All officers shall be members of the Board. The term of office is one year, coinciding with the start of the City's fiscal year on July 1 through the end of the fiscal year on June 30 of the following calendar year. No individual shall hold more than one office at any time. An individual may serve no more than two consecutive terms in the same office and becomes eligible again to serve in that office after a period of two years.

Section 2: Election and Succession

A. Election

Officers are elected at the last scheduled Open Meeting of the fiscal year to serve during the following fiscal year. If the last scheduled Open Meeting of a fiscal year is not held, officers shall continue to serve until their successors are elected and assume office.

The Nominating Committee (as described in Art. VI, section 3. A., of these Bylaws) will present at least one nomination for each office. Prior to the vote for each office, additional nominations will be taken from the floor. Officers will be elected individually in

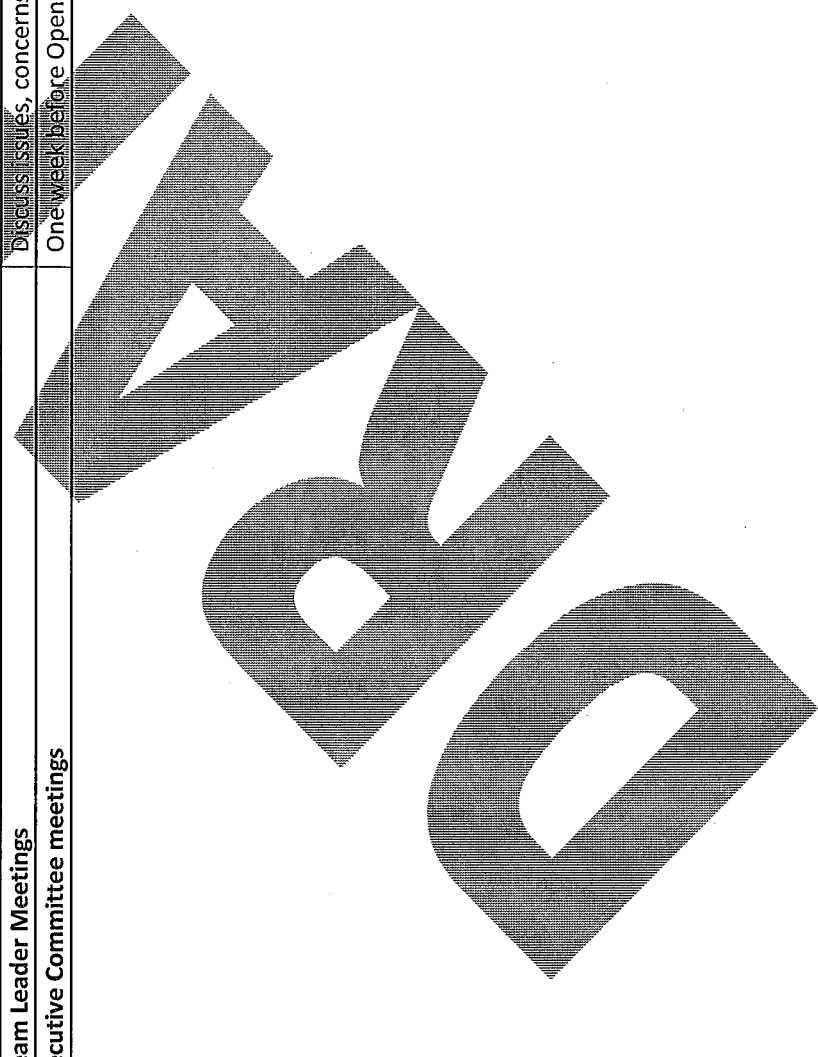
