On March 16, 2018, Development Services Department **APPROVED** an application for Substantial Conformance Review (SCR), Process Two, under the Master Storm Water System Maintenance Program (MSWMP), Amended SDP 1134892 and PEIR 42891/SCH 2004101032, for maintenance of a concrete lined channel to include removal of sediment, vegetation, trash and debris within the Nestor Creek MMP Map 131(reaches 11&12). The Channel is in an urban area between 30th Street and the San Diego and Imperial Valley Railroad tracks.
