9-1-1 Wait Times Down Significantly



Good public safety news for San Diego. In the City's most recent report, 9-1-1 call wait times were down significantly since the reforms we made to our dispatch system were enacted. In July, of the more than 57,000 emergency calls to our 9-1-1 system, more than 80 percent were answered within 10 seconds. <u>Read more...</u>

Camino del Sur Road Widening Project Begins

If you live along Camino del Sur, you will likely have noticed the road widening project that began earlier this summer. We received a number of calls about how the project was impacting traffic near Westview High School. Working with City staff, we were able to get the contractor to provide traffic control during working hours and open an additional lane each way during non-working hours. City traffic engineering also re-timed the traffic signals to improve traffic flow. This update was provided to residents via NextDoor.
