THE FOLLOWING IS REPORT ON Complaint on Golf course at Jackson and Whitman Streets, Council Document #260101.

~~I called on Frank Dana owner of this course and he says that he is not financially able to put up this fence at this time, he now has a 15 foot fence. I do not think that a 30 foot fence would keep out any of the few balls that seem to bother Mr. Dubuiz. Mr. Dana has changed the position of the tees, so that the balls are directed about 300 feet to the right and further from Mr. Dubuiz home.~~

~~In talking to Mr. Dubuiz he will not confine his complaint to the time since the change of the tees, but insists on complaining about the windows that were broken before the change, as there has been none broken since.~~

~~I talked to Mrs. Millan, 2828 Whitman Street, whose husband had signed the first complaint, and she and her children said that only two or three balls had fell in their yard since the change of the tees, and at the present time they did not bother them at all.~~


