Gentlemen:

Your attention is directed to a matter that requires very serious and immediate consideration if the Code of Moral Law is to be upheld in the City of San Diego.

Taking advantage of a certain toleration of the public in respect to bathing attire that is intended to be of a physical benefit, some men are presenting themselves on the public beaches in a most repulsive manner, that is, by loosening the straps and rolling down the suit <sup>to</sup> the waist line.

The trunk style suit with either belt or suitable elastic material to cause the garment to conform to the body seems to be acceptable. However the rolled down suit is being worn in a most indecent manner and steps should be taken at once to eliminate this practice upon public beaches.

This problem has been confronted in beach cities around Long Beach and Los Angeles and suitable laws enacted to control the situation.

This club recommends that the City Council immediately investigate the condition and if regulations are not already available that such laws and regulations as are deemed necessary be enacted, and that sufficient funds be set aside to erect signs or notices of regulations at the beaches.
