





That she was employed as a waitress and hostess; that  
her principal duties consisted of sitting, drinking, dancing and  
talking with patrons of said establishment; that she was instruct-  
ed by the management of said establishment that her duties were  
to be as above stated; that during the period of time that she  
was employed by said establishment there was an average of twenty  
girls working there every evening; that she and other girls work-  
ing there were required to report to work at four o'clock in the  
afternoon and worked until two o'clock in the morning, excepting  
that on Saturday each girl was required to report to work at  
three o'clock in the afternoon and remain until two o'clock the  
following morning;

That she was instructed by the management of said  
establishment that when she was requested to have a drink with a  
patron that she was to order a drink purporting to contain intoxi-  
cating liquors, but that in fact she was served what is commonly  
known as a "B" drink, which drink was made to resemble a drink  
containing intoxicating liquors, but in fact contained none such  
intoxicants; that said "B" drinks were charged for at the same  
rate as a drink containing intoxicating liquors.

1 That as a result of drinking said "B" drinks affiant has  
2 suffered a kidney infection which has necessitated medical treat-  
3 ment; that she has been informed by her physician that said kidney  
4 infection was caused by her drinking said "B" drinks; that each  
5 week the management of said dine and dance establishment gave a  
6 bonus to the girl who had ordered the most "B" drinks during the  
7 week; that she would drink as high as 15 to 40 "B" drinks each  
8 evening.

3 RICHARD PAHL, personally appearing and being first duly sworn  
4 deposes and said on oath: I am nineteen years of age. I was  
5 born in Homer Michigan August 30th 1917 and am a minor. I came  
6 to San Diego on December 11th on a vacation with my friend Mr. Leo  
7 McCarthy. I live in Los Angeles. We thought we would see the  
8 sights down here and take a trip to Tijuana Mexico to see what  
9 it was like. I got here late in the afternoon and we thought  
10 we would have a drink or two but I was refused service in one  
11 or two places because they could see I was a minor so we asked  
12 some fellows on the street where we could get a drink and they  
13 told us to "go down to Cardinale's at Fourth and F Street--they  
14 dont bother about your age there". So we went down there and  
15 we had some drinks. My friend thought I had too much and so he  
16 told the percentage girls who were getting us to buy drinks  
17 that I was only 19 years old. The girls and the two bartenders  
18 who served us didnt pay any attention until we spent all of our  
19 money and my friend and I got into an argument. He tried to  
20 make me leave the place but by that time I had bought so many  
21 drinks at the solititation of the percentage girls that I guess  
22 I was drunk and I got mad and wouldnt leave the saloon. After  
23 we had spent all our money with them and they allowed us to get  
24 drunk then they had a policeman who was there on duty arrest  
25 us and take us to jail. We kept buying liquor because the girls  
26 kept asking us to. I spent all the money myself, my friend did  
27 not spend any. In order to get me to buy some more drinks one of  
28 the girls who said she was hard up gave me her room number and  
29 address and then finally said she would come to our hotel after  
30 work. I felt sorry for the girls as they seemed to have a hard  
31 time to make a living from what they told us. I spent about  
forty six dollars (\$46.00) at the Cardinale saloon on this  
occasion. I realize that I did wrong but there seemed to be  
a lot of other young fellows around there. I think that I was  
short changed too as I laid money on the bar and when I turned  
around the bartender had taken it up and I didnt find the change.  
After they took my money and got me drunk they sent me to jail  
where I was kept all night. Later I had to pay a fine in court.

3 Leo McCarthy personally appearing and being first duly  
4 sworn deposes and says:

5 On Friday December 11th I came down to San Diego for a vacation  
6 with my friend Richard Pahl. We got in town a out 4:00 PM and  
7 were walking around to see the sights. We had never been here and  
8 didnt know the town. We also thought we would take a trip to  
9 Mexico as we had never been there. We wanted to have a few  
10 drinks but some places would not sell my friend any because he looked  
11 under age. He is 19 years old and they said they couldnt serve  
12 liquor to a minor. So we asked some fellows on the street where  
13 we could get some drinks and they told us to go over to Cardinale  
14 place at Fourth and F streets. We went over there and as my  
15 friend had quite a lot of money he started buying drinks. There  
16 were a lot of girls there who were soliciting the men to buy  
17 drinks. They told us they worked there and they kept asking  
18 Mr Pahl to buy more drinks until he had too many. Then I tried  
19 to take him out of the place but he was too drunk and he became  
20 quarrelsome and started to fight with me. By that time the bartenders  
21 and the girl solicitors or percentage girls as they are called  
22 had got him to spend all his money about forty five or fifty  
23 dollars and so when they had all his money and he was drunk they  
24 had some policeman who was there take us to jail. We were kept  
25 in jail all night. In order to get us to buy more drinks one of  
26 the percentage girls gave us her room number and address where  
27 she said she and one of the other girls lives. She finally said they  
28 would come to our room that night after they got through work.  
29 Mr Pahl is 19 years of age, and really should not have gone in there  
30 as it seems to be a very low type of place but I didnt think he  
31 would drink so much that he would get drunk. The bartenders should  
have stopped serving him liquor when I told them and the girls that  
he was only 19 years old.
