Fiesta Island is just such a place. I met a lady there on Sat. May 13, who was walking there using a walker accompanied by her dog and her handicapped adult daughter. It is a safe and beautiful open place for us all.

I need an area that welcomes both me as a walker, and my dog that is my loving companion who needs some free off leash time too. Being safe is an issue for us. Seeing the vastness of a natural setting is so very replenishing. Walking is my exercise and my meditation.

I urge you to keep Fiesta Island intact. No divisions, no roads, and no "upgrades." The only upgrade might be to remove the foxtails that plague our four legged lovers.





For at least 10 years now my husband, I and our good dogs Bandit (who died 4 years ago) and now Comet, have visited Fiesta Island weekly. We stay within the fenced area for unleashed dogs. It is the best exercise Comet gets all week (although he gets daily walks on the leash) because he can run, explore, hunt and sniff with nearly complete freedom.

If a road and fences are built in this area, dog owners would need to leash the dogs, at least for a while, and that would certainly change the experience and endanger the dogs. We spend about 40 minutes walking the loop from the parking lot, first next to the western part of the bay, then onto the path next to the nesting tern area, next east along the bay across from Sea World, then west by the bay for skiers and back up to the parking lot. It is good exercise for all of us, always enjoyable, and that path is used more than many other coastal areas in San Diego, not only on weekends but weekdays as well. This area should not be down-sized!

Why change it? It works for so many people and no money need be spent on this part of the island.

The center part of Fiesta Island could be landscaped and developed without affecting the beach zones which are used in so many ways. I don't park my car and set up my picnic on the beach, but lots of people do, and they clearly love doing it. People with horses bring their trailers and ride the horses in the shallow bay water -- another great use. None of these activities should be eliminated!

#### Gentlemen,

I wish to have the following input placed into your record regarding the current "Mission Bay Park Master Plan Update – Fiesta Island Amendment"

My name id Grant Reynolds. I was born and raised in San Diego, having lived on Crown Point, attending Crown Point Elementary School, Pacific Beach Junior High and graduated from Mission Bay High School.in 1960. I will be 75 this November..

From around the age of six, I had the pleasure of enjoying Mission Bay as a salt marsh. The wetlands were something to behold then. In the 50s the City destroyed the wetlands and placed the dredged material in locations such as Fiesta Island. Provisions to manage the various colonies of Least Terns required the City to set aside the Northern part of the Island for nesting.

I now live in a home overlooking Mission Bay Park. Every year I have watched the City spend money on Least Tern habitat, which is a total waste of taxpayer funds. The Tern population has dwindled to the point of extinction due the total failure of the City to manage the area properly. Rather than scrape the ground and treat it with herbicide every year, the City should build a series of moats and flood the area with sea water, thereby destroying the non-native terrestrial vegetation that reappears with the spring rains.

Simply put, Least Terns do not nest where any vegetation exists because they and their eggs are easily seen from by predators above. Unless the management plan is changed they will in fact become extinct.

The Least Tern is Federally protected species. The Least Tern is a part of the public trust, which the City is obliged to protect. Unless the Fiesta Island Master Plan includes a Least Tern management plan the restores the birds population as part of the current Master Plan, the City can be held accountable for its failure to preserve the Least Tern population in the areas that have been set aside for their preservation.

Bear in mid that all citizens of the state are beneficiaries of the public trust. In the event the a trustee cannot or is unable to protect the property of the trust, such as the Fiesta Island Least Tern population, then members of public as beneficiaries off the public trust have standing to bring a legal action against the parties responsible for the harm visited upon public trust property such as the Least Tern.

Based on the plans that we reviewed at Mission Bay High School on May 23, 2017, we have two areas of concern: The dog park area and the primitive camping.

The dog park area we are concerned with Option A and the boat ramp and road being placed within an off-leash dog park area. What makes the current dog park special is there are no roads or any concern regarding our dogs and exposure to high speed vehicles. Moreover, there is a boat ramp across the bay, why do we need another boat ramp? If you want to deter the environmental impact, why can't people use the boat ramps all ready available to them and they are relatively close to the bay?

We are further concerned about other populations using the dog park area for exercising such as joggers and cyclists. Some dogs react very negatively toward joggers and cyclists, which further increases safety concerns for both humans and canines.

The primitive camping area discussed has several concerns including campfires, which increases the risk of wildfires. Another concern is the type of campers who will utilize the camping area. We have all ready seen homeless people camping out in the center of Fiesta Island. By opening up a primitive campground, we fear these homeless people will increase the environmental impact due to throwing and leaving trash, substance use, unauthorized campfires, and are also known have unhealthy toileting skills. I work with this population and know of the safety concerns and environment health risks they impose on the area. In order to maintain this population, the taxpayers will incur a large cost in order to increase the number of persons patrolling the area and maintain safety and cleanliness for all who utilize Fiesta Island in a positive manner.

In addition, once the changes to Fiesta Island have been made, we find it becomes very hard to undo undesirable changes. It may take a few years to make the changes but it may take ten years to reverse the damage. In the short term, there is no reversing any environmental impact these changes will have especially those that are man-made such as the boat ramp, road, and campground.

We hope you will take our concerns into consideration as we are against Option A and would

prefer to leave Fiesta Island dog park area as a safe place to take our dogs without outside influence.

Approximately 30% of San Diego County residents own dogs (see <a href="http://www.theanimalcouncil.com/files/NPA\_1995SanDiego.pdf">http://www.theanimalcouncil.com/files/NPA\_1995SanDiego.pdf</a> for reference). Fiesta Island is the only area within or near the City of San Diego where dog owners can themselves participate in recreation (hiking, walking, running, beach-going/picnicking) alongside their off-leash dog. The only other similar location for off-leash recreation is the Ocean Beach Dog Beach; however, this area does not have the upland recreational opportunity that Fiesta Island provides. It also does not have a large fenced-in portion; Fiesta Island is particularly popular because of the over 90 acres of fenced land and beach area that provides a safe and worry-free area to run around with your dog. Fiesta Island is also unique in that it provides not only beach area, but also protected bay waters for swimming (no strong waves), and upland hiking areas. It is also a social space for dog owners and provides a sense of community to all who use it.

Aside from Ocean Beach Dog Beach, which provides only beach area, all other off-leash areas in the region are smaller upland dog parks where there is no room for the dog owners themselves to also recreate. Reducing the size of the off-leash fenced area in Fiesta Island, bisecting it with a road, or otherwise fragmenting Fiesta Island would be a significant impact on local and regional recreational resources, particularly because there are no other options with similar benefits. Many City of San Diego residents, including myself, see Fiesta Island in its current condition as a major benefit to living in San Diego, and a huge factor in our quality of life.

On a similar note, should Fiesta Island be fragmented or reduced in size, many dog owners who utilize the park would likely begin using the other few dog parks in the region more frequently, such as Ocean Beach Dog Beach or Nate's Dog Park in Balboa Park. Increased use in other dog parks in the region is likely to cause an increased degradation of these parks. The only way to mitigate the reduced utility of Fiesta Island and subsequent overcrowding in other regional dog parks would be to create a new dog park elsewhere. However, there are limited opportunities in the City of San Diego and surrounding areas for a large off-leash area commensurate with the area that Fiesta Island currently provides. Fiesta Island provides over 90 acres of fenced-in, off-leash recreational area, as well as additional hundred of acres on the island that provide additional off-leash areas. I believe that any development, fragmentation, or reduction in the fenced-in, off-leash area of Fiesta Island would be a significant and unavoidable impact.

I trust that the City will make the appropriate decisions to protect San Diegans' quality of life and preserve our recreational resources, and look forward to reviewing the EIR.

Good morning. I have a preliminary comment about the content of <a href="http://fiestaislandamendment.com/?page\_id=314">http://fiestaislandamendment.com/?page\_id=314</a>.

The second paragraph refers to the 2007 GDP - the 2007 version predates and was superseded by a modified plan voted on and recommended for approval by the Mission Bay Park Committee in December 2010.

My comment for the NOP is that it must include evaluation of issues relating to ADA and General Public Access between Option A and Option B, with particular attention to these issues for the southwest sector of Fiesta Island in Option B.

I would also like to see discussion of the possible impacts of displacing the Paddling facility, storage and launch area from the southwest sector as shown for Option B to an off-island location, specifically to the area adjacent to the boat ramp at South Shores where there will be substantially less security for the paddlers' vessels and equipment.

The boat ramp, as I understand it, is unnecessary for launching the Dragon Boats, Outrigger Canoes and any other "paddling" vessels which may be included in such an area. The proposed sand beach at the south end of the Fiesta Island sector is sufficient for launching purposes and a secure area for these users, who have never had a permanent, secure site in Mission Bay Park, unlike ZLAC, Mission Bay Yacht Club and the hotels have for associated boats and equipment.

For nearly ten years, we have been active, daily users of the dog off leash portion of Fiesta Island. As we are sure you are aware, this area has been recently determined to be the best dog park in America and one of the very best features of "America's greatest city". This off lease area has enabled the creation of a significant community of like-minded dog loving people who feel very strongly in the need to protect the area and demonstrate it by actively cleaning it on a daily basis to preserve this incredible asset.

Based on the Mission Bay Master Plan Update, we highlight the following points:

- The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement.
- In the Concept Plan, a roadway would be extended along Hidden Anchorage "cove", in the southwest area of the Island, with swimming proposed in the channel area south of the island, developed parkland, playground and restrooms. Increased pedestrian access to the interior of the island through the creation of trails is also planned.
- "Option A" proposes an extension of Fiesta Island Road to an area south of Hidden Anchorage to access a parking area, picnic tables, paddling facility/storage, pier, ramp and floating dock, a designated swimming beach area, and developed park with a children's play area and restroom, while providing for habitat areas (least tern and eel grass).

We feel there is a far better solution to accomplish these goals and that is to complete the development of the South Shores pavilion. There is currently a beautiful pavilion, picnic tables, and expansive beach on the South Shore with the only constraint is the inability to drive your car to the facility and therefore, it is never used! With the nominal cost of extending South Shores Park Road a few hundred yards we can:

- Does not increase parkland and will require no additional water
- We believe it represents the least expensive option to expand the overall usage of Mission Bay while capitalizing on existing facilities without jeopardizing the incredible dog park we already have

## Dear Planning Committee:

My husband and I are home-owners in the Pacific Beach neighborhood of San Diego, where we have lived for 25 years. We are writing to urge you in the strongest terms to adopt Option B, keeping the fenced-in dog park intact and NOT putting a road down the middle of the dog park. We strongly oppose Option A.

Our dog visits the fenced-in dog park Fiesta Island 6-7 days per week for approximately 60-90 minutes each day. In other words, a very conservative estimate of our use of Fiesta Island would be well in excess of 300 days per year. We start by throwing the ball in the sections between the main entry gate and the cluster of trees and benches, then walk along the east fence that borders the road until we get to the water, then go down along the sand and walk the perimeter of the entire area, ending up on the west beach before returning to the parking lot.

Option A would eliminate much of the east section, and virtually block access to the water on the east side by construction of a road. Through placement of a road running through the park, Option A would greatly and negatively impact the use, beauty, and feel of the dog park. Also, Option A provides for excessive development (a large parking lot with RV spaces, a dog competition area, an obstacle course, a children's play area, parking lots and storage buildings) with elements that are completely out of sync with the current use and feel of this dog park. Worst, because a road would now be incorporated within the park, instead of enjoying nature, we would watch cars and pick-up trucks go back and forth dropping off people and equipment, with the accompanying assault on fresh air.

<u>Please</u>, let's keep the natural and open feel of this area - there are so few places for dogs to run free (almost every other dog park is much smaller) and for their owners to simultaneously experience a waterfront wide-open natural space. Option A would alter, in an undesirable way, an area that already works for many, many people and their pets. On the many occasions that we have visitors, whether with dogs or without, we always take them to Fiesta Island and they are amazed at our fortune at having this resource right in the middle of the city.

The fenced-in dog park is an absolute treasure, a natural park surrounded by water, a wide-open space right in the middle of the city where you can almost feel like you are in the country. We have visited dog parks all over the country and have never seen anything that matches it. It deserves its recent selection as the best dog park in the United States. The last thing the city should be considering is development. Rather, the city should be focusing on maintenance, including- foxtail control and repair of the dirt/sand erosion in the parking areas along the west side of the park.

In sum, Option B addresses basic improvements needed while maintaining the essential natural feel of the area. Option A would be a disaster and would destroy this San Diego gem.

We urge you to adopt Option B and rejection Option A.

#### Dear Sirs;

As a long time resident of San Diego living on the Pacific Beach side of Mount Soledad, District 2, and a dog owner for 6 years I wanted to put forth my opinion on the development of Fiesta Island, specifically the 5f area. I am in favor of FIDO's "Option B". It is rare that a city as large as San Diego has an area that has been so precious to dog owners like our beloved Fiesta Island for so many years. The leash-free area we have provides sufficient space for owners and their dogs to roam freely and have enough space to avoid the problems of animal interactions often encountered at other leash-free parks. Over the past few years I have noted that there are more dog owners who enjoy the space that Fiesta Island offers. With the increasing numbers there is still space for all to interact in appropriate numbers. If the available space were smaller, i fear that there would be more problems.

After reviewing "Option A" and the reduced space allocated for leash-free dog space it mandates, I am very concerned that "Option A" will put our dogs at increased risks for interactions with automobiles, motorcycles, and bicycles that could be deadly at worst or injurious at a minimum. The smaller the off-leash space allocation as prescribed by "Option A", the more parking for dog owners gets condensed long the road with the associated closer proximity to vehicle traffic. # To Whom It May Concern,

It has come to my attention that Fiesta Island Dog Park will be undergoing a potential renovation. Two options appear to exist--an Option A, and a FIDO-sponsored Option B.

Indeed there are times when development of a plot of undeveloped space can be necessary to support the infrastructure of more users, such as upgrades or reinforcements to heavily-used walkways and pathways to control or minimize erosion. I have learned that the City is looking to develop the nearby Morena corridor, in part to address San Diego's need for continued growth. With San Diego being a dog-friendly demographic, I expect that growth stemming from the Morena corridor plan will result in an increase in the number of Fiesta Island Dog Park users, making it extremely important that we learn how to scale.

What I personally like about San Diego and Fiesta Island in particular, is even have successfully appeals to both tourists and residents. I also understand that FIDO loves the space so much, that they are willing to take a form of ownership and work hard to see that environmental issues that pertain to the park, for example as erosion stemming from dog park use, are addressed.

With that being said, it has come to my understanding that our City is still lacking a sustainable disposal method for all the dog waste produced by our doggie pals. In fact, I called the Miramar Landfill asking about what I could do with "pure dog waste and compost-able bags," and unfortunately I was instructed that my only option was to put the dog waste into the regular trash, where it would end up in the landfill. With the current method at Fiesta Island, dog waste is thrown in the trash and still ends up in the landfill. Now, according to my research, dog waste occupies 3.4% of San Francisco City's landfills and I have reports that dog waste can occupy as much as 4-5% of municipal landfills. Seeing that our City has a landfill, it seems wise for us to think of how to handle the additional dog waste produced by the additional growth expected from park goers, since it is often more prudent to sustain what we already have, before taking on more development.

I am a 12-year San Diego resident, with my first 10 years beginning in 2005, as an employee at General Atomics working in Rancho Bernardo and Poway, and more recently an entrepreneur, coming from the UAV/drone industry and hoping to use my skills at building systems that help our communities. My belief is that if we put even a fraction of our defense

budget into our local communities, we would solve a lot of issues. I have been volunteering my own time to create and plan an innovative way to deal with dog waste by ultimately processing it into energy at a small-scale through my own startup company called Beartha. I have attached a PDF and link to Smart Dog Waste Receptacle concept for you to consider. Before I heard of Plan A or a Plan B, my goal has been to develop a special smart waste receptacle that would benefit park goers and the City so I have come up with a form of low-cost Smart Dog Waste Receptacle, designed to accept source-separated dog waste in compostable dog bags and voluntarily pilot this effort at Fiesta Island with the goal of (1) diverting dog waste from our landfill, and (2) gathering data from park visitors when they use the special waste can. This data would certainly help the City in future park growth planning. I am hoping that the effort might scale to other dog friendly parks in the City, helping us divert our dog waste from reaching the landfill while at the same time, looking for sustainable and innovative ways to use the dog-waste, such as energy generation or composting the waste into fertilizer for non-edible crops.

I hope that you do consider working together with FIDO in preserving Fiesta Island via Plan B. Or perhaps there is a middle ground on promoting a lower-impact form of development that prevents further issues such as erosion but with a minimal aesthetic impact. One thing I've learned from public service is that it's best to harness and empower positive and passionate energy when it is being offered for free from those who care, and it appears that FIDO cares about the park and has both passion and a positive influence on the park. So I hope that we can leverage FIDO's energy, and my own, to help us create a win-win situation.

"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement".

The sentence above describes Option B without exception and therefore I strongly support Option B for the development of the fenced, off-leash area on Fiesta Island.

There is no other large, open area where we can exercise with our off-leash dogs in all of Southern California. We need to keep this area open and undivided by roads, fences, an amphitheater and boating facility. This is as much about the humans as it is the dogs. San Diego has steadily eliminated most of its open space. There is no other place where we can still walk, run or bike safely and legally with our off-leash dogs. This fenced area is a refuge in the middle of a developed city where humans and their dogs can try to maintain physical and mental health. We NEED open, undeveloped space. An open-space Fiesta Island is an incredible asset and once it is divided up, that is gone forever.

Fiesta Island was recently voted Best Dog Park in the United States. What a great thing to be known for! - 2. Please study the effect that the use of watering and maintaining the grass planned for the area will have. Southern California is a desert and waterhogging grass areas must be kept to a minimum.
- 3. How will increasing density on the island affect traffic flow? Hopefully traffic studies will be done to show how it will be

impacted.

- 4. Regarding the Least Tern protected habitat adjacent to our offleash area, the Audubon Society has said that having picnic tables and trash cans in the vicinity of the Tern area will draw crows and other predator birds into the area. These predators eat the Tern eggs and chicks. Having the large off-leash park in the area will prevent any food or trash that may attract these predators.
- 5. Please analyze the impact of an large number of increased special events that will be brought onto the island and the impact on the environment, traffic, aesthetics, noise as well as the cost of build-out and maintenance of necessary public services (restrooms, trash, etc.) that will be necessary for these events.
- 6. Please analyze the financial savings that would be incurred if the paddlers were placed on South Shore, where the infrastructure they specifically said they needed already exists versus recreating the same expensive infrastructure directly across the channel on Fiesta Island.
- 7. Please consider a fox-tail eradication plan for this area as fox-tails represent a grave health risk to dogs.

It is PERFECT in every way so PLEASE do NOT take this away from us!



### **Dear Planning Commission Members:**

I am a resident of San Diego and am writing in support of <u>Option B</u> supported by FIDO. It would not be possible to overstate our love for, and dependence on, this truly unique public space for our family.

We relocated to San Diego 2 years ago from Northern California and recently decided to make San Diego our permanent home. We are still house hunting, but one of our top criteria is that the house must be within 20 minutes of Fiesta Island. Pause on that. Here is a public space so unique that we are making major life decisions around proximity to the island. Why? Simply put, Fiesta Island offers an unparalleled experience. Nowhere else in the city, county, (state?) can we simultaneously:

- -Spend time together as a family, including the dog—by nature, they are social creatures who require quality interaction
- -Socialize our fat old rescue dog and build his confidence with new people, dogs and situations in a way that is not possible at smaller off-leash parks or on trails
- -Get some doctor-ordered low impact exercise for our creaky old mutt in the form of long, free form walks, swimming, and playing with other dogs
- -Get some low impact exercise for our creaky old selves—great for those trick knees and aching joints
- -Rub elbows with our neighbors and meet other dog owners and dog lovers
- -Enjoy the water, sun, sea breezes and dog kisses

One year ago, when we decided to finally get a dog, a rescue appealed to us for two reasons: we could invest in a cause (prevention of cruelty to animals) and perform a civic duty (reducing strain on government resources such as shelters and animal control). It was exceedingly tempting to adopt a roly poly puppy from a breeder, especially as this was our first pet and we wanted to make sure he was healthy and trained up properly. But in the end, we wanted to have a bigger impact. So we adopted from a local rescue organization . . and are ready to adopt 2 more. But the choice of getting a rescue animal often comes with sacrifices as a result of the animal's past neglect or abuse. In our case, it called for a substantial investment of time, and a lesser investment of money, in order to rehabilitate the dog both physically and behavior-wise (he's now mobile, medication free, fairly obedient, and loving life). He is seriously the cutest.

In closing, I echo the talking points other FIDO supporters have raised, but there are a few I'd like to reiterate:

- -My family is at Fiesta Island every weekend and 1-2 times during the week
- -This is one of the few public spaces in the city we actually use
- -We use it year round
- -There is nowhere else we can get this combination of outdoor family time/exercise/free form dog play/socialization/public interaction
- -Developing and maintaining the land carries its own costs; I would MUCH rather see my tax dollars spent on roads, sidewalks, water system infrastructure, mass transit, etc.

-There are so very many other options for tourists in this town, another option is not at all necessary. It just isn't. We have <u>never</u> run out of things to do with our guests when they come to San Diego.

I'm writing to express my support of FIDO's Option B proposal and my opposition to Option A proposed by the City of San Diego.

I've been taking my dog, Sunny, to the fenced off-leash dog park on Fiesta Island for over two years, two-to-three times a week. We walk/run the East & South facing beach, which is about two miles roundtrip. it's great exercise for both of us. We also utilize the trails on the mesa.

I can't begin to imagine why the City wants to develop nearly 40% of the park, removing land sorely needed for dogs and humans. In Diane Bell's column in the San Diego Union Tribune dated 5/16/2017 regarding San Diego's dog-friendly ranking, she states "A new survey shows that San Diego has the greatest number of dog-friendly restaurants of the 100 largest U.S. cities......But our City's overall dog friendliness is surpassed by San Francisco and (other large cities)......Where did we lose points? Dog parks. We only have 1.09 per 100,000 people, making us 20<sup>th</sup> overall." We don't need to lose off-leash space for our dogs, we need **MORE**, not less.

The City's Option A proposal looks great on paper, but if their vision becomes reality, just take a look at Capehart Off-Leash Dog Park located on Soledad Mountain Road in Pacific Beach to see what their proposed park might look like in ten years. Capehart was built in 2004 at a cost of \$632,000 (combined off-leash dog areas is 0.41 acres) and has been totally neglected for years. Trash, weeds, no shade structures, no grass (with the exception of the Small Dog Area that was re-sodded thru donations by the public), have created a very unhealthy and uninviting environment. Too many people & dogs, and not enough space (square footage per dog/person).

Capehart is a disgrace and the City wants to waste more of our money (that the city does not have) on "improving" Fiesta Island that removes much needed spaces for people and dogs. Capehart serves a population of over 73,227 (Pacific Beach & La Jolla), a park way too small to support an estimate dog population of 14,000+. Fiesta Island is the only other fenced offleash dog park in the vicinity of Pacific Beach and La Jolla west of Interstate 5. **The City of San Diego needs to create more off-leash dog parks, not take space away from them.** 

By the way, where does the money come from for the city's proposed Option A boondoggle? We can't even fill pot holes in the streets or keep enough police officers to protect us (I could go on) let alone proceed with the City's proposed Option A.

As the EIR review takes place I would like to see a focus on the following issues:

• Is a traffic study planned? Traffic will certainly increase with the Option A proposal.

- What impact will this have on traffic flow, bike and pedestrian safety?
- Will the study include the evaluation of the need for additional off-leash dog space? As I mentioned earlier, there are over 14,000+ dogs in the area that could utilize additional off-leash space.
- How will the amphitheater, when an event is taking place, affect the behavior of the dogs nearby? Could the noise unsettle them and cause problems? How will this affect traffic and access to the park?
- The current ruggedness of the park is part of what draws me to it. The openness is very inviting, but under Option A, the park would be broken up into many smaller areas. Is this really necessary and for whose benefit? Why can't another area of Fiesta Island be used for developing Option A?
- Does the park really need a non-motorized boat storage area when one could be constructed at South Shores boat launch area which is right across the channel? South Shores has many amenities including restrooms. Is this a good use of space right next to a proposed public beach? Will there be safety issues?
- Last but certainly not least, will the City water the grassy areas? According to Kathryn Ruiz, Deputy Director Community Parks 1 Division, the likelihood that the dog park will be watered is very low. If this dog park gets watered, why not all dog parks?

All day long you will see dogs and people enjoying the park and it is heavily used on the weekends and holidays. Over 15,000 people support FIDO and their Option B proposal. FIDO's Option B plan is simple and appears to be much more affordable than the City's proposal. Dear Rebecca Malone and the rest of the Planning CEQA Committee,

I am writing to provide some comments which I hope will be considered in the preparation of the Environmental Impact Report regarding the Mission Bay Master Plan Update. It is my understanding that there are two options being considered. Option A appears to be a developers response to significantly alter the current somewhat natural state of Fiesta Island to include a urbanized park complete with restrooms, a new paddling facility/storage area, a new ramp, pier, and floating dock, a new designation children's swimming area, a replacement of some off-leash dog acreage to compensate for the creation of a dog competition area, dog obstacle course, and again more restrooms.

Option B appears to be an earnest response to address serious environmental issues such as storm run-off, and protection of sand erosion from traversing vehicles while preserving the historical use of Fiesta Island. In addition, it does provide some nice upgrades such as the viewing pavilion.

If the main intent of this new master plan is to considerably increase the use of Fiesta Island and significantly alter its current composition than option A would most likely be the better choice. Yet that is not the stated intent of the public notice. It specifically reads "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement".

#### Based on this stated intent Option B is the more prudent choice.

Option A by its description will significantly increase water usage due to the nature of the proposed items/activities. Here are my challenges with this particular option.

- Urbanized park invite picnics which people bring food and drink which result in a rise of water consumption due to cooking and cleaning needs.
- A new pier, ramp, and floating dock will result larger water needs to clean vehicles.
- It should be already apparent that events like dog competition will increase crowds and water demands from the animals.
- Waste disposal (human and canine) both require large amounts of water.
- In addition to water usage concerns there would be a large impact of increased emissions and congestion over the area as more cars would traverse over Fiesta Island, particularly if a park and children's swimming pool is created. I have not witnessed too many people who bike to the beach to picnic nor travel with their children via bicycles.

As mentioned earlier, everything stated in option A works against the stated intent of the framers of the public notice. Clearly, I have a vested interest in this proposal as I am part of the nearly 40% of those who own dogs (<a href="http://www.seecalifornia.com/dogs/california-dogs.html">http://www.seecalifornia.com/dogs/california-dogs.html</a>) the proud owner of three Labrador Retrievers (Ruckus, Random, and Reason). I bring my dogs to Fiesta Island very regularly and I (and my dogs) have not found any need for an obstacle course as the bay area to swim in and the field area to run around work just fine. Fiesta Island has been a great place to meet old and new friends and it is quite friendly as compared to Dusty Rhoads or Dog Beach.

Some other items I would like to note:

- I do not understand why there is even a consideration of creating a new urbanized park as Fiesta Island is just across from Mission Bay Park. On the western side of the Fiesta Island is Ski Beach and Vacation Isle Park. On the southern side of Fiesta Island is South Shores Park.
- I do not understand the need for another paddling storage facility, ramp, and pier, when there is already the South Shores Launching Area.
- I do not understand the need for another children's swimming area as there are already multiple places such as Mission Bay, Carlsbad Lagoon, Liberty Station and Glorietta Bay under the San Diego-Coronado Bridge (
  <a href="http://www.sandiegouniontribune.com/sdut-sandiego-top-swim-spots-2013jul31-htmlstory.html">http://www.sandiegouniontribune.com/sdut-sandiego-top-swim-spots-2013jul31-htmlstory.html</a> ).
- San Diego also has a history of creating and preserving parks that serve the whole community yet used primarily by a few constituencies. For example, there is the Robb Field Skate Park, Coronado Skate Park, Balboa Park, and Chicano Park. Fiesta Island currently happens to be one that has been historical left alone to serve the pet community as well as cyclists, beach pit party enthusiasts all of whom enjoy the relatively undeveloped and natural state of the island.

# In conclusion Option B is the more prudent choice towards fulfilling the state public notice intent of the Mission Bay Park Master Plan Update.

Thank you in advance as I appreciate your time in reviewing my comments and I have optimism that they will be included in the final EIR. In addition, I look forward to having the opportunity to review the final EIR. I would also like to have the chance to be present when a final decision is deliberated and made.

As a someone who visits the Fiesta Island Leash Free Dog Park twice a week, I have reviewed Option A and Option B, and compared them to the present park (which meets all my needs, and judging by the number of other users there, the needs of a vast number of other users as well).

Both Option A and Option B will cost more money to construct <u>and maintain</u> than the current situation. Has this been properly budgeted for? Have all sewers/water mains/roads/pension funds for the City of San Diego already been paid for and this is "excess money" that needs to be used? Or will this be like so many other projects in the city that get started but either never finished, or finished but not maintained (becoming an eye-sore and a nuisance)?

Option A has some aspects that boggle the mind:

- How much is all that construction going to cost? How much has been budgeted for cost overruns? Will the construction affect the Least Terns, and have those lawsuits been budgeted for?
- Will the (undoubtedly beautiful) restrooms become hang-outs for homeless people, as they are at Ocean Beach? Does the City really have to learn this lesson again? Will the restrooms be connected to the City sewer system?
- Does the City really need another amphitheater? The current amphitheater in Balboa Park (the Starlight Bowl) is not exactly fully booked, is it? Nor do City budgets appear to be capable of maintaining the Starlight Bowl, let alone an additional amphitheater on a deserted Fiesta Island, far from tourists, customers, and the Park & Rec people needed to maintain it. And who thought the mix of a noisy amphitheater with dogs was a great idea?
- How will vandalism be averted? Will there be guards at night? The current Porta-Potties on Fiesta Island are tipped over by miscreants on a regular basis. Does the City have a plan to avoid mischief/destruction of more expensive facilities? How will the homeless people that currently live in RVs on Fiesta Island be kept out?
- There's a Public Swimming Beach planned in the middle of the Leash-Free Shoreline Parkland. Although <u>most</u> dogs and <u>most</u> children are well-behaved, how long until the antagonism/fights/lawsuits start? Has the City learned nothing from the La Jolla Children's Pool? And will the Lifeguard Tower here have the same problems as the one at the Children's Pool (see the Union-Tribune article for reference here: <a href="http://www.sandiegouniontribune.com/news/watchdog/sd-me-lifeguard-towers-20161008-htmlstory.html">http://www.sandiegouniontribune.com/news/watchdog/sd-me-lifeguard-towers-20161008-htmlstory.html</a> ? Is it sanitary to have little kids playing on a beach with canine fecal matter?
- Similar comments apply to the Boat Club. I like boats. I do not believe that boats belong in the \*middle\* of a dog park. The current waterski area works because it is adjacent to, but not in the middle of the dog park. One of the dogs I walk with on Fiesta Island has a bad shoulder joint, so he prefers to walk in the water. We walk all along the eastern and southern beach of the dog park in the water, which helps support his body weight \*and\* keeps his shoulder cool and therefore pain-free. This walk would now force us to go right through both the Public Swimming Beach and the Non-Motorized Launching Beach areas on Option A.

- The 1 km swimming course looks wonderful. I take it these swimmers will be protected from the motorboats/jet skis/rowing boats by magic? And neither this magic device nor the resulting lawsuits will cost the City taxpayers any money? And the water-skiers will still be able to get to the water-ski area?
- Who will maintain the turf areas indicated on the plan? Have you been to the dog parks in Balboa Park recently? Nate's Point, Morley Field and Grape Street have all had the grass die due to a combination of bad soil, over-watering, and wrong type of grass used. Do you think Park & Rec will do a better job on Fiesta Island? How much water will that cost, and is the water main already there, or will that be an expensive add-on?

Option B appears to be a lot closer to the current situation, and will therefore be substantially lower cost both to construct <u>and</u> maintain. I'm still not sure it's much of an improvement over the current situation (how dilapidated will the "View Pavilion" and "Pedestrian Bridge" be after a few budget cuts?), but at least it's not as much of a boondoggle as option A. There's something to be said for keeping a few areas of San Diego "undeveloped"... The dogs, dog owners, City taxpayers <u>and</u> the rabbits and Least Terns prefer it that way!

#### Hello.

I am writing to share with you how important Fiesta Island is to me, my friends, and my dog. I would like it to stay intact as it is now, not divided by a road, fences, an amphitheater, etc., and preserved for off-leash dog use. Additionally, it is an important place for human use.

Since we adopted our dog, Bailey, seven years ago, we often spend our lunch time or weekend evenings at Fiesta Island. Bailey loves to run off leash, and I am thankful that there is a safe place near our house that allows her to stretch her legs so to speak. I love that there are so many trail options as well as the beach. She loves to run into the waves and along the sand. It is truly her happy place. The fenced, off-leash area has been one of our regular outings over the years, and we go there year round.

My concern is the overgrowth of dangerous fox tails at this time of year. A few years ago, I heard the notorious foxtail sneeze as Bailey got one up her nose. Unfortunately it was a Friday evening which meant a trip to the emergency vet in Mission Valley (and a very expensive bill because she needed to be put under anesthesia to have it removed). I quote from the following statement in your notice:

"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement".

The sentence above describes Option B without exception and therefore I strongly support Option B for the development of the fenced, off-leash area on Fiesta Island.

There is no other large, open area where we can exercise with our off-leash dogs in all of Southern California. We need to keep this area open and undivided by roads, fences, an amphitheater and boating facility. This is as much about the humans as it is the dogs.

Given the huge problem of obesity in San Diego, anything the City of San Diego can do to encourage exercise should be a priority. If you go to the fenced area, you will see people and families exercising with their dogs. It is not like the small neighborhood dog parks where people sit on benches and drink coffee while the dogs play. Everyone in our area is actively exercising. San Diego has steadily eliminated most of its open space. There is no other place where we can still walk, run or bike safely and legally with our off-leash dogs. This fenced area is a refuge in the middle of a developed city where humans and their dogs can try to maintain physical and mental health. We NEED open, undeveloped space.

I lived in Pacific Beach during the October, 2007 wildfires. I can still remember the sounds of the horses and other livestock that came from Fiesta Island across the bay. I was so impressed that the City of San Diego had a vast, fenced, open space where it could safely evacuate large animals. An open-space Fiesta Island is an incredible asset and once it is divided up, that is gone forever.

Fiesta Island was recently voted Best Dog Park in the United States. What a great thing to be known for!

I beg you to consider the following environmental impacts and make the wise decision for future generations to maintain the large open space that is Fiesta Island:

- 1. Please evaluate the environmental impact that bulldozing the berm and soil to create a swimming beach at the south end of the area will have. To create a swimming beach, they will have to bring in tons of non-native sand. What impact/risks will that have on the existing flora and fauna?
- 2. Please study the effect that the use of watering and maintaining the grass planned for the area will have. Southern California is a desert and water-

- hogging grass areas must be kept to a minimum.
- 3. How will increasing density on the island affect traffic flow? Hopefully traffic studies will be done to show how it will be impacted.
- 4. Regarding the Least Tern protected habitat adjacent to our off-leash area, the Audubon Society has said that having picnic tables and trash cans in the vicinity of the Tern area will draw crows and other predator birds into the area. These predators eat the Tern eggs and chicks. Having the large off-leash park in the area will prevent any food or trash that may attract these predators.
- 5. Please analyze the impact of an large number of increased special events that will be brought onto the island and the impact on the environment, traffic, aesthetics, noise as well as the cost of build-out and maintenance of necessary public services (restrooms, trash, etc.) that will be necessary for these events.
- 6. Please analyze the financial savings that would be incurred if the paddlers were placed on South Shore, where the infrastructure they specifically said they needed already exists versus recreating the same expensive infrastructure directly across the channel on Fiesta Island.
- 7. Please consider a fox-tail eradication plan for this area as fox-tails represent a grave health risk to dogs.

If I were to really summarize my thoughts on the project, I'd have to say I support Plan B, but if it were possible, could we keep the obstacle course and canine event area, with restroom, rinse station, and water fountains.

I have overlooked the Plan A carefully to see what it offers to island frequenters and their canines, and this is what I concluded: I believe Plan A takes away too much of the island for human use. Dividing the recreational off-leash area with a road to add in a playground seems particularly redundant to me. Mission Bay is a large area, it hosts several playgrounds already and I don't think we need another one. I also have some concerns about children being around dogs. Parents don't always teach their children how to approach stranger's pets, and I don't want either the children or dogs to be injured when an unsupervised child goes sprinting for a dog hug and causes an alarmed dog to run away or bite. In regards to the watercraft area, both the storage and the launching ramp, I believe this would be a poor location for them. I think it would better serve watercraft and swimmers if the boat launch, and therefore storage, were located facing toward Crown Point, if possible. It will cause fewer swimmer-vs-boat incidents, and keep the swimming area calmer, and thus safer, especially for smaller dogs. It's also less likely to disturb the endangered nesting area, and keep the water conditions cleaner near that area. As to the addition of the Amphitheater, while not inherently opposed I don't particularly see a reason it should be added in this location. This returns to the primary issue of taking space away from the dog park for human use. I do like the idea of the Amphitheater, but I don't like the idea of having to reduce off-leash space for it. I'd like to know more about what sort of events would be hosted in this area, and if they are intended to bring revenue to the island, to have a full understanding before criticizing any further. Finally, I worry most about duration. This is a lot of renovation for the area, and a lot of it we, those of us who frequent the island, don't really need. I worry about not being able to take my dog walking on Fiesta for months. In an area like San Diego, that's a heavy blow. I'd much prefer it if we kept the south point as grassland and re-opened Fiesta to park-goers much sooner. \*I admit this is assuming the park will be closed during reconstruction.

Now those are the negatives, and I've spent a lot of time considering them, so it'd be unfair of me to say I didn't see some positive ideas in Plan A. There are some dog-oriented plans that encompass human comfort and conveniences and I find them very much in the spirit of the park as it is now.

The obstacle course and canine event area sound *fantastic!* I have always wanted to let my dog run an agility course but I have no space to put one. It'd also be amazing to be able to attend dog shows and talk to trainers better than myself.

The restroom, fountains, and rinse station, these are all perfect ideas. My dog has a long, double thick coat, and even if she's not swimming it gets full of sand. The rinse station is perfect for her. The fountains will be better than hauling 5-15 jugs of water out to the middle of the park, and those sometimes run out before the day is over. Access to water could be a literal lifesaver on hot days. Restroom: self-explanatory.

Adding dog-friendly equipment to the dog park settles well with me. Fiesta is the highest rated dog park in the US, as is. This would really make the park sit up and speak, if you can pardon the metaphor. We don't need a whole area dedicated to more human habitation, the whole of Mission Bay already does that. We could, however, do with a few more comforts such as flushing toilets and available water on hot days, and it couldn't hurt to add a little flare.

In conclusion: I support Plan B, but if compromise is available, keep the obstacle course and canine event area, with restroom, rinse station, and water fountains.

I quote from the following statement in your notice:

"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement".

The sentence above describes Option B without exception and therefore I strongly support Option B for the development of the fenced, off-leash area on Fiesta Island.

There is no other large, open area where we can exercise with our off-leash dogs in all of Southern California. We need to keep this area open and undivided by roads, fences, an amphitheater and boating facility. This is as much about the humans as it is the dogs.

As an elementary school nurse, I know that 25-30% of elementary-age children are overweight or obese. This is a public health nightmare and anything the City of San Diego can do to encourage exercise should be a priority. If you go to the fenced area, you will see people and families exercising with their dogs. It is not like the small neighborhood dog parks where people sit on benches and drink coffee while the dogs play. Everyone in our area is actively exercising.

San Diego has steadily eliminated most of its open space. There is no other place where we can still walk, run or bike safely and legally with our off-leash dogs. This fenced area is a refuge in the middle of a developed city where humans and their dogs can try to maintain physical and mental health. We NEED open, undeveloped space.

I lived in Pacific Beach during the October, 2007 wildfires. I can still remember the sounds of the horses and other livestock that came from Fiesta Island across the bay. I was so impressed that the City of San Diego had a vast, fenced, open space where it could safely evacuate large animals. An open-space Fiesta Island is an incredible asset and once it is divided up, that is gone forever.

Fiesta Island was recently voted Best Dog Park in the United States. What a great thing to be known for!

I beg you to consider the following environmental impacts and make the wise decision for future generations to maintain the large open space that is Fiesta Island:

1. Please evaluate the environmental impact that bulldozing the berm and soil to create a swimming beach at the south end of the area will have. To create a swimming beach, they will have to bring in tons of non-native sand. What impact/risks will that have on the existing flora and fauna?

- 2. Please study the effect that the use of watering and maintaining the grass planned for the area will have. Southern California is a desert and water-hogging grass areas must be kept to a minimum.
- 3. How will increasing density on the island affect traffic flow? Hopefully traffic studies will be done to show how it will be impacted.
- 4. Regarding the Least Tern protected habitat adjacent to our off-leash area, the Audubon Society has said that having picnic tables and trash cans in the vicinity of the Tern area will draw crows and other predator birds into the area. These predators eat the Tern eggs and chicks. Having the large off-leash park in the area will prevent any food or trash that may attract these predators.
- 5. Please analyze the impact of an large number of increased special events that will be brought onto the island and the impact on the environment, traffic, aesthetics, noise as well as the cost of build-out and maintenance of necessary public services (restrooms, trash, etc.) that will be necessary for these events.
- 6. Please analyze the financial savings that would be incurred if the paddlers were placed on South Shore, where the infrastructure they specifically said they needed already exists versus recreating the same expensive infrastructure directly across the channel on Fiesta Island.
- 7. Please consider a fox-tail eradication plan for this area as fox-tails represent a grave health risk to dogs.

Dear Ms. Malone,

I'm writing to publicly comment on the proposed Mission Bay Park Master Plan update for Fiesta Island.

I am a board member with FIDO, Fiesta Island Dog Owners, a non-profit group with over 12,000 members that has been working for years to preserve off-leash access to Fiesta Island, in particular the southwest 90-plus acres of Fiesta Island directly across from SeaWorld.

I would like to go on record as stating that the City of San Diego **should adopt Option B** for Fiesta Island. That option, put forward by FIDO, is the most closely aligned with the City's stated intent of "[respecting] long term existing uses on the island, [reducing] environmental impacts, [reducing] the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement."

Specific to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), I would like the city to **address these issues** in considering how and whether to develop the island, specifically in reference to issues with Option A:

### **Critical Environmental Considerations**

The environmental impact of moving the berms of soil surrounding the island must be studied to determine the effects of disturbing those areas. Since much of the original fill dirt was dredged from the basin or brought in from elsewhere, what is it potentially contaminated with? Disturbing it also increases the danger of the spread of invasive plants.

Also, creating a swimming beach presumably means importing sand, which would carry the potential of new invasive organisms and other dangers to the existing land.

The area of the park that is seasonally set aside for California Least Tern nesting must be considered as well. How will additional traffic, noise, exhaust and runoff affect that area of the island and the birds that next there? Additional roads and vehicles, and added fences could put pressure on this important nesting site.

The EIR should also address the yearly growth of foxtail grasses, which cause serious problems for dogs and owners both. A foxtail in an ear or paw can mean a trip to the vet at best, and anesthesia and surgery at worst. Erratic, although well-intentioned, mowing attempts by the city seem to be containing the foxtails for the most part this season in at least the most-used areas, but there is no systemic plan for addressing the issue. Expert advice from botanists or biologists is needed to recommend a specific program to eradicate foxtails for good in the off-leash dog area – hopefully using a well-planned and directed mowing program, not chemicals.

#### **Traffic and Roads**

Dividing this area by a road will create significant safety hazards for both dogs and people – what

speed limits will be set? Who will enforce them? How long until someone's dog digs under the fence and is hit by a car? – Also, the mere presence of a road will spoil the feel of getting away from it all in the middle of San Diego. That in itself is a priceless part of the undeveloped Fiesta Island experience. Increased use of the island would bring an increase in traffic, requiring studies on traffic flow, parking, and runoff from oil and additional residue from motor vehicles. How would hauling boats and parking boat trailers fit into the plan? Additional pavement will increase runoff, rather than letting the water soak into the soil as it does now, presenting additional negative environmental impacts.

# **Community Character and Growth**

I've lived in San Diego for nearly 40 years and have visited Fiesta Island hundreds of times over the years with friends, visitors from out of town, and always my dogs. As an open, relatively undeveloped area that allows both people and pets to enjoy quiet time away from the bustle of the city, it is unmatched in San Diego — and in fact, in any city I have visited. It is an excellent use of a relatively small area of the city's many miles of beachfront property. As a friend once remarked as we walked together with our dogs, "Everyone out here has a smile on their face."

Again, I urge you to protect Fiesta Island's off-leash area for the residents of San Diego, and to establish it as a permanent part of the Mission Bay Park Master Plan by adopting "Option B." Sincerely,

For my dogs and the park offers something no other park or open area in a big city possibly could: it is the combination of land and water; areas that are both inland and a beach; my dogs and I can walk, stroll around, freely run, swim, play in and out of the water and encounter countless other dogs and their accompanying humans. All of this is simply unparalleled anywhere else. It is unique, and has become one of San Diego's most known and special gems. 
I am writing to tell you I strongly support keeping the park intact and preserved for off-leash use.



### Hello.

I would like to provide the below statements as a part of the public comment on the topic of the Mission Bay Park Master Plan Update - Fiesta Island Amendment. Thank you for your time in considering them. I am for the protection or expansion of the Fiesta Island off Leash dog areas.

Aston is not just my dog he is member of my family and a licensed animal with The City of San Diego. I pay to keep him up to date on immunizations and to keep him licensed per The City of San Diego laws. As such his health and ability to function affects his ability to maintain licensure and remain within the city. The city has a responsibility to their residents with licensed animals and the families they reside with and should be considered a top priority when determining the development of Fiesta Island.

My family experiences daily frustrations with regards to the regulations against dogs within The City of San Diego and utilize Fiesta Island frequently throughout the year some months up to three times a week. We and many other families can be very limited to opportunities in utilizing outdoor areas next to our homes as the city board walks, beaches and park areas are off limits to some family members until certain hours of the day. Even within the right hours there is still the regulation for a leash wherever dogs are allowed and makes it even more important that The City of San Diego protect and not reduce the current off leash areas of Fiesta Island.

The Fiesta Island off leash dog area provides vital health benefits to my family and is the only place within the city that does so. Fiesta island provides the only off leash dog friendly trails within The City of San Diego. My family runs the off leash trails or shorelines of Fiesta Island and when we do we are very thankful that they are not developed paved surfaces. This provides my family with better physical health as running on concrete and asphalt is tougher on human and dog joints. You will already see evidence of people trying to avoid the concrete of the boardwalks when possible in the multiple foot prints in the dirt alongside the boardwalk around the south end of Crown Point. And would also indicate that non dog owners would benefit from not developing the trails of Fiesta island as well. I have introduced non dog owners to the island who enjoyed using it as is. Besides physical health the off leash time also provides my family members with better mental health. As this is important for a multiple reasons the reduction in aggressive behavior is one of the most important benefits to my dog. A less aggressive and healthy resident is a benefit to the whole city as well as the family.

Please do not disrupt the off leash dog trails with development they provide a great health benefit for my family and non dog owners as well.

The city should further consider how much of the city population, neighboring cities and vacationing families are like mine. In my 14 unit building there are 5 units with dogs. I have further heard the comment that the areas need to be developed to be made more handicap accessible. With regard to this comment I would like to push for the consideration of handicapped dog owners who also benefit from off leash areas.

Families also vacation with their animal family members. Fiesta Island off leash areas offer a very unique experience and one of a kind experience to draw people to the city. 

The only thing I would suggest to change is to help keep the foxtail population down so more fun can be had by humans and dogs. I think adding more areas will take away from local residents of San Diego with camping areas and an amphitheater. We have plenty of amphitheaters throughout San Diego and don't need another. Camping would create more areas for those that come to camp, but take away from those of us that aren't camping, there by limiting the areas we can use. Option B would be the best for the tax paying local San Diego resident.

I will leave you with my dog, Coco's last day, her favorite place to go in San Diego was Fiesta Island, so on her last day that is where we went. She was at her end with a long battle with cancer and we knew that the end of day was her time, so for her last day she got to do her favorite things. She got out of the car and headed straight down to the water all by herself (remember she was blind so that tells you how often we were there) and got right in the water and laid down. During the time we were sitting there a few dog owners who could tell it was the day came over and talked to me and patted her and let me know it would be okay, dog owners just know. These people were complete strangers to me, but Fiesta Island that day brought us together and they passed on their story and provided the needed statements to help me that day. As the time got closer to when we had to leave she couldn't get up and she was 100 lbs. so it was hard for me to try to lift her. The last stranger for the day showed up and could tell I was upset and that Coco was struggling. She went out of her way to help me get Coco up and to the car. She provided more needed words for me that day and also a hug. This island showed me their is still kindness and love out there when you need it.

I think adding to the island with more "commercial" activities will take away an authenticity to the island that I saw Coco's last day. The island brings people together and the ability to bring your dog brings more people together that most places cant do. I think the best thing is

to leave Fiesta Island the way it is currently.



"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement".

I am in <u>strong</u> support of Option B that is being proposed for the future planned usage of Fiesta Island, and I feel that Option B fits exactly the stated purpose of the above quote taken from the Public Notice.

I moved from New Hampshire to San Diego 15 years ago. The beautiful year round climate combined with a love of nature, walking, hiking, makes San Diego a perfect fit. Unfortunately, what I did find is that most of the natural local setting are much compromised. Restrictions and small park sizes are, in part, all understandable being located within the boundaries of a large city, but disheartening none the less. Parks like Rose Canyon and Marian Bear Park have trails that run parallel to highways. The San Diego River trail is over run with homeless, and the newer, very costly, section of the trail behind Fashion Valley has been covered with graffiti and the new lamp posts vandalized. It is an uncomfortable and dangerous area to walk even with a German Shepherd dog as my partner. Small neighborhood parks suffered from the water shortage and open grassy areas are now brown or muddy and, in most cases, unusable. Dog parks have become dust bowls.

Time and time again, I see money being spent to improve parks that are currently underutilized and question why we contemplate spending more to create new parks. I see new bathrooms in Bay park being taken over, trashed, and used as shelter and question where the money is to enforce that this does not happen. Why is the city not spending money to fix the current problems in all the established designated recreation areas? Can we do an analysis on how we can maintain the areas we already have and keep them in a condition that guarantees cleanliness and safety?

The Mission Bay Master Plan includes this statement:

"As an open landscape, Fiesta Island should be the place where city residents and visitors alike find the ultimate refuge from urban congestion, noise and visual clutter."

Fiesta Island is truly a unique gem within the city's park division. The most important and enjoyable feature is the ability to have large numbers of visitors utilizing the vast property without negative impact on the individual. # Dear Planning Board,

I am asking you to serve your voters by ensuring that the 93 acre fenced, leash-free area on Fiesta Island remains intact. The tax-paying citizens who use this area are asking that they be recognized as valid recreational users of public parklands, just like the other existing users of the island, and be allowed to retain their current space without roads and parking lots bisecting the area that they use 365 days a year. This part of the 485 acres of Fiesta Island is the only fenced leash-free area in San Diego County large enough to allow humans to exercise with their dogs. We ask that the city recognize this fact: that this is not about the dogs but about the thousands of active humans who currently use this area as a place to exercise. It's about what these humans want and need - a refuge from the stress of urban living. Other smaller existing fenced leash-free parks throughout San Diego do not allow this type of use. This large 93 acre contiguous area allows us to walk, run, and bike with our dogs. Once it is destroyed it can never be replaced. While the dog owners are the largest number of users over the course of the year, they are the only group that is losing quality space. Current plans call for a road to bifurcate our area to access a swimming beach and boat storage shed; thereby, creating three smaller dog parks with little beach access for the dog owners. Swimming beaches of Mission Bay are used only seasonally; another beach that will stand empty the majority of the year should not displace those of us who use this area year round. Per presentations by Park and Recreation at various city meetings, they indicate that there is no alternative site for the paddle storage area. However, South Shore was never evaluated as a possible location for this use, despite the paddlers previously stated willingness to consider the South Shore location. South Shores has existing infrastructure already in place (parking lots, restroom, etc) and by utilizing that area, a tremendous amount of money would be saved as the road, a bridge, fencing, restrooms and other improvements could be deleted from the fenced, leash-free area in the Fiesta Island plans. Please, in the interest of your citizens and fiscal responsibility, do not let our area be destroyed when there are logical and simple solutions available.

Most importantly, this includes, but is not limited to: increased noise polution (starting from none at all right now), which is especially pertinant given that it is located across from another important city attraction - Sea World; wall to wall traffic on crucial north to south highways like I-5 and surrounding east to west roads for longer periods of the day; and increased litter for the city to pick up. These are bigger consequences than the city has resources to address. Thus, development is only a lose-lose situation for the city and regular park users.

Also, a note about these regular park users: San Diego is renowned for its dog friendly reputation. With this many dog owners who make use of Fiesta Island on a daily basis, they won't be happy if Fiesta Island is changed in any way. If Option A passes, they will lose confidence in current city officials who ignore their voice on this matter and move forward and throw their support behind new people who run for city positions in the future.

In the end, the negative environmental, cultural, and financial effects are not worth price to San Diego's state and global reputation and would only deter future investment in our city. Additionally, there are plenty of other places east (inland) of Mission Bay worth consideration where the city could accomplish the same development goals.



#### I am writing in support of Plan B:

The Fiesta Island fenced, off-leash area has become very special to our family as we visit this area multiple times a week. We have two female black labs who are now 12, one of them is a little shy and the sheer size of the park is a blessing. We can avoid others by taking a detour and that cannot be done at other "dog parks" in the city nor will it be feasible if Plan A is implemented with a road, fences, an amphitheater, etc. My girls and I spend many mornings at the park and enjoy seeing the sunrise over the water with the city on the horizon, watching the first planes take-off from Lindbergh Field, and socializing with other dog families who are now our friends. I cherish this peaceful and rejuvenating time with my girls, not only is it good for the body, but also good for the soul. In addition, as a fitness trainer, I am always impressed to see so many healthy dog owners out getting exercise with their pups!

Our beloved area was recently voted "Best Dog Park in the USA" by USA Today. Unfortunately, this 90- plus acre, leash-free area has not even been designated as an official dog park – it's time for that to change! In 1972, the city passed Ordinance O-10843 which banned dogs from all city beaches from 9am to 6pm except for Fiesta Island and OB dog beach. Because of this ordinance, Fiesta Island and OB dog beach are the ONLY places where off-leash dogs can enjoy the shoreline at any time of the day. Not only do my labs love the water, but so do my children, and the fenced-in area is a place where as a family we can ALL safely enjoy the beach. (No fences at OB dog beach.)

Reading through the Public Notice I find:

"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement."

- This area is already used by thousands of individuals and families who get exercise with their dogs in the fenced-in area 365 days a year all day long, rain or shine. It is literally the most used area in Mission Bay.
- Plan B is obviously the option with the smallest environmental impact and the least amount of development.
- Plan A will be the most expensive option to implement and will require more water and maintenance thereby continuing the expense well into the future.

In addition, Plan A includes a public restroom in place of the "port-a-potties". I live in Mission Hills near Presidio Park and would not step foot into one of those public restrooms, or get within 50 feet of one. They are a haven for drugs and transients. I weekly observe the San Diego police clearing out the homeless from this beautiful park, wasting time and resources that should be put to better use protecting our city. With regard to the planned development of Fiesta Island, I am asking that you expand the park per Option B for the following reasons:

Safety is a huge factor. I take my dog to this park because the others are too small. Overcrowded conditions promote dog fights resulting in many injuries to both pets and their owners. Such conditions exist on just about every other dog beach except Fiesta Island because of its wide open spaces. If it is reduced in size it will not only create problems on the Island, but will result in even more overcrowded conditions at other dog parks as off-leash areas shrink in size and the dog population grows.

Moreover, the increased traffic will pose a safety hazard. Aside from dogs, there are bicyclists, joggers and horse riders that frequent the area. With a road being built across the Island for use by people who are more interested in getting to the amphitheater than enjoying a leisurely run, ride or walk, the chances of people, including children, and animals being injured or killed because of the increased and faster traffic flow will rise astronomically.

Along with the increased traffic will come elevated noise levels. And it's not just the concerts and traffic on weekends alone that will become an issue. There will be people setting up and practicing, so that the noise will be constant throughout the week. Gone will be our escape from the din of the city!

In addition, people who are handicapped and parents with babies currently enjoy the freedom of being able to push wheelchairs and strollers in a safe, open, flat area where they can find pleasure and relaxation in beautiful sea breezes and views that they ordinarily could not enjoy because of rough or sandy terrain. That place would be gone.

Thank you for consideration of these comments.

The Recreation Element of the City of San Diego's General Plan begins with the following:

"Park improvement is among the most important of the undertakings now before the City. It should have the cordial cooperation of all."

San Diego Union editorial on the City Park System, July 6, 1910

## Purpose

To preserve, protect, acquire, develop, operate, maintain, and enhance public recreation opportunities and facilities throughout the City for all users.

With this spirit, I applaud the project to update the Mission Bay Park Master Plan and urge you to consider the entire park possibilities and issues and not just those on Fiesta Island, as they are connected in every way, except perhaps our human need to divvy things up for planning purposes. Let us never allow the limits of any specific planning area to divorce us from connecting issues and solutions in the rest of the park.

- 1. I would very much like to understand the impacts of the proposed Option A grading down the current cap/berm system in order to create a proposed "off-leash swimming beach" with a road to it. In the early years of this plan update, I saw a draft grading plan for the area but could not find out the details associated with it, i.e. how much material would be removed and to where. As I understand it, historically, the dredgings that form Fiesta Island, under the cap and berm system, were stopped from being dumped in the ocean. Will analysis of what's under there be done through testing during the environmental review? Option B leaves the existing berm system in place except for potential changes needed to improve the berm and access to and from the existing tidal beaches.
- 2. How can a maintenance plan to minimize foxtails inside the dog park be

established and undertaken? It is imperative that the area be managed as a dog park for either Option A or B and that means planning to change the landscape to manage for eradication of foxtails and then management to minimize them through a program of weeding and mowing. Projects to undertake this should be considered in the environmental review so that projects to change and manage the landscape, as a natural landscape minimizing foxtail seeds from propagating can take place after adoption. This could entail initially scraping down the areas with foxtails and then replacing and replanting with native shrubs. Ongoing mowing and appropriate times (prior to the foxtail seeds themselves forming and to stop propagation) and weeding as required needs to be allowed.

- 3. How much sand would have to be imported and from where to create the proposed beach, at what cost and how would it be retained there? Woudn't it just wash away over time?
- 4. Would there be additional significant impacts associated with moving the proposed boating facilities in Option A out of the dog park elsewhere on Fiesta Island? Could the EIR discuss other ways to address the proposed paddler locations such as at South Shores or elsewhere on Fiesta Island such as across from South Shores along the South Pacific Passage?
- 5. The Mission Bay Master Plan includes this statement: "As an open landscape, Fiesta Island should be the place where city residents and visitors alike find the ulimate refuge from urban congestion, noise and visual clutter."

Planning to add an unknown number of new large Special Events degrades the ability for anyone to find Fiesta Island as a refuge from anything if more and more weekends are finding the island closed for Special Events. What are current numbers of daylight hours Fiesta Island is closed for access due the Special Events? What are the impacts to losing access to our "refuge from urban congestion" by adding too many additional Special Events? What is the significance threshold for this? Isn't this a Significant Land Use and Planning Impact? The loss of access needs to be understood and quantified.

- 6. What are the impacts and costs for Public Sevice including ongoing public safetly impacts of adding restrooms as proposed in Optioin A? Yes it's convenient, but it's also expensive and creates other problems. There are already issues with 'urban campers' on Fiesta Island. Adding restrooms would add to that.
- 7. What is the current water quality in the channel where Sea World operates and where Option A proposes a new swimming beach? What are their discharges like? How often are they tested? What kinds of fecal matter from what species are in the channel now, by percentage? Other pollutants and sources?

8. Do least terns use the fenced area setaside for them in the SW corner of Fiesta Island? How many over the past few years have nested there? How many successfully?

Is there difference between the species in that area and the species inside the fenced area? What kinds of snakes and other creatures live there now? I've seen pictures of snakes and I've seen rabbits myself. Option A would be more detrimental to the habitat for both direct and indirect impacts.

- 9, I noted in the NOP the description of Option B as including "picnic tables" and want to clarify that this was only meant to refer to existing meet-up tables that have been placed there by volunteers and not to be a "picnic" area. Picnic areas are not advisable in the dog park and FIDO does not propose them.
- 10. What would be the size of and the cost for the proposed "Special Event Hillside Amphitheater" in Option A. I have not been able to find anything about it's size or why it's proposed there when there is already a amphitheater in the South Shores Plan nearby and it has also been brought up for the De Anza Area. What is the planning rational and need for this facility in Fiesta Island or De Anza when it's been in the South Shores plans for decades?
- 11. With respect to the Planning Policies and the proposed Update
- 11a. General Plan Recreation Element Policy states:

RE-A.7. Establish a policy for park design and development which encourages the use of sustainable methods and techniques to address water and energy conservation, green buildings, low maintenance plantings and local environmental conditions, such as soil and climate (see also Conservation Element, Section A).

and especially:

RE-B.4. In planning, with respect to existing parks, give consideration to preserving the existing uses.

Off-leash dog use was established by ordinance on Fiesta Island and at OB Dog Beach in 1972 when dogs were banned on other City beaches. This Plan Update proposeds to significantly reduce off-leash dog use and as some kind of trade-off, retain this usage behind the fenced area, mostly. But the mostly is a pretty big deal, because the introduction of a public road through the existing space in Option A - and related fencing and gates, intrude unacceptably to thousands of daily users and diminishes what is unique about this open space - it's connected openness and intact size and circumference.

In reviewing the entire Recreation Element, there is no policy that requires or even mentions paving new roads into existing open space as is proposed in Option A.

The rationale for this road at the beginning of this planning process in 2006 was that there was a road planned there in the previous plan (circa 1994 and this section probably earlier than that), so we're going to put a road there in this new Plan. But I can find no justification for adding this road from a new planning perspective based on policies and the smart growth approaches of the current General Plan. Not in the Mobility Element, nor any other. Rather, "walkability" is a priority for "smart growth" in other General Plan Elements. In meeting with Coastal Commission staff to inquire directly about any requirement to put a road through to any beach in California, the answer is, generally no. You can plan them or not plan them based on other requirements. So whether or not the Option A road goes into the Plan is a choice, not a requirement and appears is inconsistent with other policies.

Adding a road through that open space in Option A is not justified from a usage, environmental or a cost basis. I attended a meeting with Coastal Commission staff in the earlier years of this planning project. A Dragon Boat paddler representative and I met together with CC staff to discuss our views of the Plan. It was their position that we should work out our differences. The specific conflict is the road. Users with dogs do not what the area divided and are supporting reducing access on the rest of Fiesta Island. I inquired to the paddler rep: How often would they really need that road to put-in or take out their boats. His answer, after they get them in there: "about once/year." I remain flabbergasted that this road was being demanded for that amount of use, when other underutilized access-points exist.

Another staff person told me that a road was needed in order to get to the proposed beach because "it was too far to take your cooler." I could find no policy related to this, in fact, "smart growth" policies pursue design that supports public health, i.e. how about a beach that people do have to walk to? Coastal Commission staff at the time told me, "there are about 12 miles of underutilized beaches around Mission Bay Park."

In sum their boats are currently stored elsewhere without conflicts and there is plenty of additional available space to add any new boats. From a planning perspective is off-leash use really compatible with boat storage? Dog owners don't mind, but I've heard boat owners say, "I don't want them peeing on my boat." I don't think there is a way to stop dogs peeing on anything that attracts them in the area.

11b. In the Introduction to the current Plan Update on the City's website you find the following:

"The fundamental goal of the Master Plan Update is to identify these new demands and chart a course for the continuing development of the Park which will sustain the diversity and quality of recreation and protect and enhance the Bay's environment for future generations to come."

In reviewing the existing Mission Bay Park Master Plan Update and Design Guidelines, South Shores/Fiesta Island you find the following:

"As a goal... South Shores should be intensively used park area that attracts visitors to a variety of public and commercial recreation venues yielding, in aggregate, a summary view of the park's grand quatic identity. For its part, Fiesta Island should remain essentially open yet supportive of a diversity of regional-serving public land and low-key, for-proft recreation and natural enhancement functions." (bold and italics in original)

Option B best allows for the combination of the old with the new, i.e. of reducing off-leash access in the rest of the island while preserving the open-space and natural recreation aspect of the remaining fenced area.

At this time, I want to see these principles in the new "smart growth" General Plan applied to this Plan update. The promulgation of policies related to sustainability, xeriscaping and overall natural landscaping are best expressed in Option B.

Finally and most importantly, I do find the policies cited above in the following: the NOP states: "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects the long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use and is economically feasible to implement."

In merely looking at Option A vs Option B, Option B on its face, is less expensed (no bathrooms, road, grading and filling for a new beach, amphitheater, fencing/gates etc), has fewer environmental impacts, and no new water or sewage usage). It also does the most to respect the long-term existing use on Fiesta Island for off-leash dogs established officially by ordinance in 1972 when dogs were banned from other City beaches with the exceptions of OB Dog Beach and Fiesta Island. By reducing the amount of Fiesta Island being used for off-leash use in the Plan Update for the rest of Fiesta Island, it only makes sense to conclude that Option B does the best job of respecting that use while reducing it elsewhere on Fiesta Island.

I am hopeful that the staff, after its analysis, will conclude to recommend that Option B best fits the stated intent.

"Option B" supports a parking area that will not extend as far, and will provide for a view pavilion and view plaza; picnic tables; running trail; maintenance/emergency trail; native, least tern and eel grass habitat areas; and dog off-leash non-native vegetation play areas, for a total of approximately 93 acres of dog off-leash use within this southwest area.

Except for this southwest area of the Island, all other recreation and design aspects of the island would be identical between the two options.

I am writing to express my concerns in regards to the City of San Diego's current Mission Bay Park Master Plan.

We live in the UTC area and hit Fiesta Island regularly at all times throughout the year. My husband and I enjoy taking our small chiweenie, Brown, for a run on the trails throughout the island as well as along the water. Fiesta Island is without a doubt Brown's favorite place on the planet! It is the perfect place for outdoor exercise with ones' furry friends. Currently, there is easy access and plenty of open space to utilize. Others that are there walking or running get to be near the water, have access to trails, and see scenic views of downtown – it is always evident that everyone is enjoys their time there!

For those reasons and more, I have outlined below many concerns with the city's current proposal to develop Fiesta Island:

First, the proposal states that the intent is "to reduce environmental impact. However, developing an area with roads, arenas, playgrounds, and restrooms is likely to increase resources utilized and have a negative impact on water, air, land and noise. I believe that the city's planning department should present a current state environmental impact report compared with a projected report if such modifications should occur. The reports should at minimum include water utilization estimates, potential long-term land disturbances (i.e. waste) and the impact on air pollution. The San Diego community should be presented with these analyses before any decision is made about their public park.

Second, it appears from the current proposal that people's direct access to water would also be in jeopardy. I see this as one of the biggest benefits of Fiesta Island for those with or without pets. The direct beach access to the water for those who love water sports or want an easy way to spend the day with their families swimming or grilling is imperative. More recently, I have begun paddleboarding (Brown also enjoys the SUP at Fiesta!) and appreciate how great the beach access with car is. Also, the proposal includes developing the area with fences and additional pavement for roads and parking. This will not only increase congestion in the area but really take away from the unique, openness of Fiesta Island.

And last but not least, the off-leash dog portion of the island is a very special place, unique to San Diego. It is such a great space for the dog's to run, swim, play and socialize — and, the pure joy and excitement on their faces is amazing. There is a reason it was voted best dog park in America. And Brown certainly agrees! Reducing the size of this area, the accessibility, and adding fences would really destroy such a great place in San Diego.

Regarding the analysis to be done on the impact land plan changes may have on Fiesta Island, particularly the off-leash dog park area, I would appreciate if the following would be addressed:

- Impact on recreational use of Fiesta Island if the off-leash dog area is altered. Fiesta Island's unofficial off-leash dog park won "best dog park in the USA" recently. Do we want to lose that title by altering it? Would it benefit San Diego to make this famous dog park finally official? If this park is altered, Would traveling dog owners look for other dog-friendly cities to visit instead? Where else in the county of San Diego could dog owners go to have such a large off leash area to play with their dogs? The large open space there now lets dogs of different temperaments have space to run and play without much forced interaction with other dogs or people if not wanted. My dog is anxious, so smaller dog parks don't work for her. At Fiesta she gets tons of exercise due to the large space that is unavailable anywhere else. Hi.

I am writing to explain why I believe we should both not develop Fiesta Island, and why we should also preserve the large, fenced-in, off-leash dog training area that exists there. My concerns are these:

- What is the **source of funding for the construction and long-term maintenance** of the project?
- How would the <u>inevitable increase in traffic</u> on and off the island be handled/mitigated? How would <u>different use areas be segregated</u>?
- What would be the \*effective\* reduction in leash free area? Not the calculated loss in area, but how much would still be usable by current users.

I'll admit that some of the changes proposed look enticing at first glance, for example the public restrooms with dog wash, but the more you look at it and think about it, the more obvious it becomes that the changes should be made somewhere else

ECONOMICS: Without funds for maintenance, there will be no; upkeep of the proposed bridges, tunnels and fencing, no salary for the proposed lifeguard, no "native vegetation" area, no "parkland with turf", no effective bio-swale constructs protecting water quality, etc. And anyone with a dog will tell you that maintaining "native vegetation" or fancy "turf" in a dog park is not only expensive, but impossible. I do not believe income from the changes could possibly offset the cost of maintaining them. As shown, the plan is fiscally irresponsible.

USABILITY: The bridges over, tunnels under, roads through, fences everywhere suggest that we are trying to co-locate things that don't play nicely together. While it is obvious that a lot of thought has been put into the logistics of making the area more useable by a wider variety of San Diegans, the result is still a nightmare from a usability standpoint. I have, at times, had to wait 20-30 minutes to get off the island, or had it take 20 minutes to get around it to where the dog park is.

AFFECT ON CURRENT USERS: The dogs that \*need\* Fiesta Island are dogs that run fast and play hard. They bark at boats. They knock over small children. They splash without regard to, well, pretty much anything. Some of them startle at skate boards, bicycles and the like. Many, if not most, of these dogs would have to avoid areas now being shared, not only with Least Terns, but now with swimmers, boaters and, presumably, bikers, roller blade skaters, small children, etc.? Also, these dogs need space and when you pile more of them into a smaller space, you risk having more "incidents". What is proposed is a compromise, but one where both sides lose. Everyone would always be a little bit unhappy. The modifications would never live up to the hype. In exchange, the current users will have lost, not the calculated 6.5% of their area, but more like 50% of their area.

On a personal note, **Fiesta Island's \*large\* off-leash area has <u>directly reduced stress and improved physical fitness</u> in our family. <u>Please don't change it.</u> As I'm sure you know,** 

having a pet and exercising are two things known to make people happier, but the transition in our family since we rescued "Indi" and began taking her to Fiesta Island has been significant. We discovered first-hand that our entire family is happier if our dog gets to run and play with other dogs, not in a tiny neighborhood dog park where we sit on a bench and play with our respective cell phones, but at Fiesta Island, where we can talk to each other while she zooms around showing us how to make friends with total strangers.

## Dear City Planning Representative:

As a San Diego city native (currently residing in Clairemont at 3957 Biddle St. San Diego, CA 92111) and a weekly user of Fiesta Island Recreational Areas and Dog Park, I'm opposed to any development on the island beyond making repairs to existing infrastructure. If I must choose between the two development options currently being considered, then I strongly endorse Option B for the re-planning of Fiesta Island because this plan involves less development and preserves more of the open space that so many of us in San Diego hold dear.

Year-round I bike, kayak, hike, and walk my dog at Fiesta Island. I have a small Terrier Mix that absolutely loves to go off leash in the dog park in order to run and play with other dogs. It's our main source of exercise and plays a critical role in our collective health and well being. I have friends from all over San Diego county who routinely drive 45 minutes or more to Fiesta Island to enjoy the off leash area.

I'd like to point out that the development proposed in Option A already exists at South Shores Park about 1.5 miles north of Fiesta Island. South Shores is an ample boat launch/dock with an RV waste collection site. Even in the Summer months there's never a line for the boat ramp. This area serves as a much more practical launch site because of its multiple directions of accessibility from the 5 freeway and its massive parking lot with plenty of overflow parking at adjacent lots.

There's a serenity to the Fiesta Island off leash area that would be lost forever to the Option A development proposal. Option A would divide the open space with a road to a parking lot and a boat launch which will reduce access for off-leash users and bring with it increased traffic and pollution. I'd prefer my open space without an asphalt expressway running through it. I know the legions of joggers and cyclists that use fiesta on a daily basis would prefer not to breathe any more exhaust or risk any more exposure to being hit by vehicles than they already do.

I am writing regarding the proposed options for the Southwest Island portion of Fiesta Island, Mission Bay, as referenced in the planning document for developing the requisite EIR (
http://docs.sandiego.gov/citybulletin\_publicnotices/CEQA/PN%201619%20Notice%200f%20Preparation%20Mission%20Bay%20Park%20Master%20Plan%20Update%20Fiesta%20Island%20Amendment%20050917.pdf)

I have been an resident of San Diego since 1974. I have owned dogs almost continuously throughout my life; they are family members, both in my childhood and as I raised my own children (now adults). I have lived in various parts of the county, from east to north, and travelled throughout the county when my sons played youth soccer.

Throughout the years and places, the most enjoyable off-leash experiences we have had with our dogs has been at the Fiesta Island dog park. We visit this site with our dogs every week, multiple times each week. This site offers the most unique environment because it is large and diverse: people and dogs of all sizes and demeanors can find a place to relax and enjoy themselves at this site. It truly is like no other. It draws from an expansive group of people, from old to young, observers to athletes, with and without canine companions. I have seen many non-dog people enjoy the park and even seek interactions with dogs and their owners. I've learned that for some of these non-dog persons, they have lost a dear companion (canine or human) are seeking comfort by visiting with others in the relaxed environment of Fiesta Island. Not surprisingly, this dog park has been ranked as the top dog park in the nation by USA Today readers (http://www.10best.com/awards/travel/best-dog-park/.

Throughout the years we have also enjoyed the island for biking, hiking, scouting (yes, we did that too) and camp fires. It offers an isolated piece of nature without all of the commercialism found in the immediate surroundings. If we wanted more roads or more fences, more turf or playgrounds, we can easily go anywhere within an immediate 1-mile radius and find it. We should not destroy the last remaining natural open park on our coastline - not one that is on cliffs, but right at the waterline. Can you find another gem like this along our California coast? I've looked to no avail and I challenge you to identify one, especially one that allows an off-leash experience for dog families.

As you develop your EIR, you will need to address at minimum, the impacts of Option A and Option B on the local Aesthetics, Air Quality, Biological Resources, Historical and Tribal Cultural Resources, Geology/Soils, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, Hazards/Hazardous Materials, Hydrology/Water Quality, Land Use and Planning, Mineral Resources, Noise, Public Services, Recreation, Transportation/Traffic, Utilities and Service Systems. As described by the City and shown in their "Precise Plan" map, Option A will Introduce a significant impact to every one of those topics and reshapes the whole Southwest area. The introduction of playgrounds does not improve the site, and are not needed especially with the numerous playgrounds already located at Mission Bay park.

As proposed, **Option B entails minimal impact**, **preserving** the Air Quality, Biological Resources, Geology/Soils, Greenhouse Gas Emissions, Hazards/Hazardous Materials, Hydrology/Water Quality, Land Use and Planning, Mineral Resources, Noise, Public Services, Recreation, and Transportation/Traffic. Option B preserves the open play areas and encourages the appreciation of our native (and non-native) vegetation areas. It's also been my experience that people and canines alike prefer real ground surfaces, not turf.

For all of these reasons, I support Option B as outlined in your proposal and if completed correctly, I expect a comprehensive EIR will too. Option A will significantly diminish the site in terms of basic environmental impact, and I believe equally important, how the current broad range of users experiences the site. It is clear that Option B will allow the site to move forward with some improvements, none of which will negatively impact the environment or the users.

# San Diego Planners,

I'm writing to express my support of "Option B" for leaving the fenced-in southwest area of Fiesta Island largely as-is while designating it as an official city dog park. Many San Diegans appreciate its unique quality as a large dog park in a metro area. Out-of-towners remark about the wide open spaces with panoramic views, access to sandy beaches, and distance from vehicle traffic. People both with and without dogs come here daily to exercise. As a daily park user and San Diego booster myself, I'm proud that Fiesta Island still exists in its current state with great potential for improvement, but think that the appropriate level of improvements doesn't align with the proposed "Option A".

I'm concerned with the environmental impact of adding of acres of turf when, in recent years, the city had to let its parks' grass dry up due to the state mandated water conservation. Perhaps adding new turf to San Diego parks isn't the most environmentally friendly idea at a time when increasingly volatile weather patterns may continue to threaten San Diego's water supply for the foreseeable future.

Also of concern, the effects of bringing vehicles and their accompanying noise, pollution, and disruption that much deeper into the southwest area of Fiesta island, closer to the protected least tern nesting site. I expect a suitable alternative layout could be found that offers water sports users access to the bay without impinging on what ought to remain a car-free area.

# How and Why I Use the Dog Park....

- 1. My husband, my dog and I go to the park more than twice a weekend due to the easy access and its the closest dog park to my house
- 2. Going to the Fiesta Island off leash dog park is my main form of exercise on the weekends. I work a lot indoors during the week so it makes me incredibly happy to be able to walk/jog in this wonderful park without the crazy crowds or bad parking. Its so calming and makes me really appreciate the location of where I live.
- 3. My dog has serious anxiety and the OB/Del Mar dog beaches are too crowded for her to feel comfortable. She gets confused when there are too many people near her and I'm afraid she will run away since there are no fences/serious boundaries at the OB Beach (a parking lot or small embankment doesn't count as a serious boundary). Del Mar is too far to go for a quick 60 minutes of cardio since it takes 60 minutes just to get there and park.
- 4. I love taking my out-of-town guests to the park. I want to prove to them that San Diego really is the best place and is really supportive of their canine companions. (Recently, I gave directions to a lady who was trying to find the park. She was driving in circles and wasn't sure where should could let her dogs off the leash. Once she realized the size of the off-leash dog park she could not believe it. She said she just moved here from Manhattan and could not believe that she got to walk around with her dogs at park like this! She'd never seen a park this big.)

# Reasons for Keeping the Dog Park Intact/Establishing a Permanent Dog Park...

I cannot express how valuable the size of this area has been to me. The three mile walk has been everything in my weight loss effort. A few years ago now I had to not go on a family vacation, as I could not have physically done the planned activities. And I swore that would never happen again. I started walking with my shepherd/great dane mix, forcing myself to do the full 3 mile circuit of the Fiesta Island Dog Park. At first it was hard. I'd never pushed myself on our neighborhood walks. But eventually it started to get easier. I don't know how many times I would have "quit at a mile ..." except it was still another mile to get back to the car! And eventually I added climbing the hills. And walking the full beach periphery - which can be longer at low tide. I have gone from 250 lb when I started to 190 lbs. now And this winter I wend on a two week trip to England with my family and I not only did iI do it t - with miles of walking and a 5th floor walk-up apartment involved - but I \*planned\* the whole trip! I cannot overstate what the 3-mile distance of the "walk the full perimeter" at Fiesta Island Dog Park has meant to me.

I adore the Fiesta Island Dog Park. Just to let you know what else it means to me:

- It has let me get away from the sound of cars, and most of the sound of the city, and relax. It is almost the only place here by the beach where this can be done. I have some health issues, and this quite, the relaxation the size of the area makes possible, has a wonderful positive effect on my mental wellness for days. Sometimes I take my book out under the tree and read, just to be quite for a while.It is the size of the park,the ability to get away from the cars, that makes this possible.
- Simply the size of the park keeps it cooler on hot days. Like many near the bay, we don't have air-conditioning. Sometimes my husband and I just hang out there in the summer, always in the dog park area, the large expanse of unpaved area and the breeze that blows through can make an otherwise miserably hot day almost pleasant. my husband has health issues too, it is important for us to have a cool location on the hottest days.

My understanding of the goal for this area is to "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement". I strongly support Option B. Continuing this area and possibly even enlarging it, meets this goal. Any water used by the off leash pets is provided by their owners/walkers, there is little or no economic impact with the exception of occasional mowing the Foxtails in the grassy area. The area is already dredged for seaweed removal due to the recreational use of the area and adding the small beach area utilized by our pets adds a minimal amount of time to the existing routine maintenance for the area. Thank you for consideration of these comments.

The Recreation Element of the City of San Diego's General Plan begins with the following:

"Park improvement is among the most important of the undertakings now before the City. It should have the cordial cooperation of all."

San Diego Union editorial on the City Park System, July 6, 1910

### Purpose

To preserve, protect, acquire, develop, operate, maintain, and enhance public recreation opportunities and facilities throughout the City for all users.

With this spirit, I applaud the project to update the Mission Bay Park Master Plan and urge you to consider the entire park possibilities and issues and not just those on Fiesta Island, as they are connected in every way, except perhaps our human need to divvy things up for planning purposes. Let us never allow the limits of any specific planning area to divorce us from connecting issues and solutions in the rest of the park.

- 1. I would very much like to understand the impacts of the proposed Option B grading down the current cap/berm system in order to create a proposed "off-leash swimming beach" with a road to it. In the early years of this plan update, I saw a draft grading plan for the area but could not find out the details associated with it, i.e. how much material would be removed and to where. As I understand it, historically, the dredgings that form Fiesta Island, under the cap and berm system, were stopped from being dumped in the ocean. Will analysis of what's under there be done through testing during the environmental review? Option A leaves the existing berm system in place except for potential changes needed to improve the berm and access to and from the existing tidal beaches.
- 2. How can a maintenance plan to minimize foxtails inside the dog park be established and undertaken? It is imperative that the area be managed as a dog park for either Option A or B and that means planning to change the landscape to manage for eradication of foxtails and then management to minimize them through

a program of weeding and mowing. Projects to undertake this should be considered in the environmental review so that projects to change and manage the landscape, as a natural landscape minimizing foxtail seeds from propagating can take place after adoption. This could entail initially scraping down the areas with foxtails and then replacing and replanting with native shrubs. Ongoing mowing and appropriate times (prior to the foxtail seeds themselves forming and to stop propagation) and weeding as required needs to be allowed.

- 3. How much sand would have to be imported and from where to create the proposed beach, at what cost and how would it be retained there? Woudn't it just wash away over time?
- 4. Would there be additional significant impacts associated with moving the proposed boating facilities in Option A out of the dog park elsewhere on Fiesta Island? Could the EIR discuss other ways to address the proposed paddler locations such as at South Shores or elsewhere on Fiesta Island such as across from South Shores along the South Pacific Passage?
- 5. The Mission Bay Master Plan includes this statement: "As an open landscape, Fiesta Island should be the place where city residents and visitors alike find the ulimate refuge from urban congestion, noise and visual clutter."

Planning to add an unknown number of new large Special Events degrades the ability for anyone to find Fiesta Island as a refuge from anything if more and more weekends are finding the island closed for Special Events. What are current numbers of daylight hours Fiesta Island is closed for access due the Special Events? What are the impacts to losing access to our "refuge from urban congestion" by adding too many additional Special Events? What is the significance threshold for this? Isn't this a Significant Land Use and Planning Impact? The loss of access needs to be understood and quantified.

- 6. What are the impacts and costs for Public Sevice including ongoing public safetly impacts of adding restrooms as proposed in Optioin A? Yes it's convenient, but it's also expensive and creates other problems. There are already issues with 'urban campers' on Fiesta Island. Adding restrooms would add to that.
- 7. What is the current water quality in the channel where Sea World operates and where Option A proposes a new swimming beach? What are their discharges like? How often are they tested? What kinds of fecal matter from what species are in the channel now, by percentage? Other pollutants and sources?
- 8. Do least terns use the fenced area setaside for them in the SW corner of Fiesta Island? How many over the past few years have nested there? How many

successfully?

Is there difference between the species in that area and the species inside the fenced area? What kinds of snakes and other creatures live there now? I've seen pictures of snakes and I've seen rabbits myself. Option A would be more detrimental to the habitat for both direct and indirect impacts.

- 9, I noted in the NOP the description of Option B as including "picnic tables" and want to clarify that this was only meant to refer to existing meet-up tables that have been placed there by volunteers and not to be a "picnic" area. Picnic areas are not advisable in the dog park and FIDO does not propose them.
- 10. What would be the size of and the cost for the proposed "Special Event Hillside Amphitheater" in Option A. I have not been able to find anything about it's size or why it's proposed there when there is already a amphitheater in the South Shores Plan nearby and it has also been brought up for the De Anza Area. What is the planning rational and need for this facility in Fiesta Island or De Anza when it's been in the South Shores plans for decades?
- 11. With respect to the Planning Policies and the proposed Update
- 11a. General Plan Recreation Element Policy states:

RE-A.7. Establish a policy for park design and development which encourages the use of sustainable methods and techniques to address water and energy conservation, green buildings, low maintenance plantings and local environmental conditions, such as soil and climate (see also Conservation Element, Section A).

and especially:

RE-B.4. In planning, with respect to existing parks, give consideration to preserving the existing uses.

Off-leash dog use was established by ordinance on Fiesta Island and at OB Dog Beach in 1972 when dogs were banned on other City beaches. This Plan Update proposeds to significantly reduce off-leash dog use and as some kind of trade-off, retain this usage behind the fenced area, mostly. But the mostly is a pretty big deal, because the introduction of a public road through the existing space in Option A - and related fencing and gates, intrude unacceptably to thousands of daily users and diminishes what is unique about this open space - it's connected openness and intact size and circumference.

In reviewing the entire Recreation Element, there is no policy that requires or even mentions paving new roads into existing open space as is proposed in

### Option A.

The rationale for this road at the beginning of this planning process in 2006 was that there was a road planned there in the previous plan (circa 1994 and this section probably earlier than that), so we're going to put a road there in this new Plan. But I can find no justification for adding this road from a new planning perspective based on policies and the smart growth approaches of the current General Plan. Not in the Mobility Element, nor any other. Rather, "walkability" is a priority for "smart growth" in other General Plan Elements. In meeting with Coastal Commission staff to inquire directly about any requirement to put a road through to any beach in California, the answer is, generally no. You can plan them or not plan them based on other requirements. So whether or not the Option A road goes into the Plan is a choice, not a requirement and appears is inconsistent with other policies.

Adding a road through that open space in Option A is not justified from a usage, environmental or a cost basis. I attended a meeting with Coastal Commission staff in the earlier years of this planning project. A Dragon Boat paddler representative and I met together with CC staff to discuss our views of the Plan. It was their position that we should work out our differences. The specific conflict is the road. Users with dogs do not what the area divided and are supporting reducing access on the rest of Fiesta Island. I inquired to the paddler rep: How often would they really need that road to put-in or take out their boats. His answer, after they get them in there: "about once/year." I remain flabbergasted that this road was being demanded for that amount of use, when other underutilized access-points exist.

Another staff person told me that a road was needed in order to get to the proposed beach because "it was too far to take your cooler." I could find no policy related to this, in fact, "smart growth" policies pursue design that supports public health, i.e. how about a beach that people do have to walk to? Coastal Commission staff at the time told me, "there are about 12 miles of underutilized beaches around Mission Bay Park."

In sum their boats are currently stored elsewhere without conflicts and there is plenty of additional available space to add any new boats. From a planning perspective is off-leash use really compatible with boat storage? Dog owners don't mind, but I've heard boat owners say, "I don't want them peeing on my boat." I don't think there is a way to stop dogs peeing on anything that attracts them in the area.

11b. In the Introduction to the current Plan Update on the City's website you find the following:

"The fundamental goal of the Master Plan Update is to identify these new demands and chart a course for the continuing development of the Park which will sustain the diversity and quality of recreation and protect and enhance the Bay's environment for future generations to come."

In reviewing the existing Mission Bay Park Master Plan Update and Design Guidelines, South Shores/Fiesta Island you find the following:

"As a goal... South Shores should be intensively used park area that attracts visitors to a variety of public and commercial recreation venues yielding, in aggregate, a summary view of the park's grand quatic identity. For its par, Fiesta Island should remain essnetially open yest supportive of a diversity of regional-resving public land and low-key, for-proft recreation and natural enhancement functions." (bold and italics in original)

Option B best allows for the combination of the old with the new, i.e. of reducing off-leash access in the rest of the island while preserving the open-space and natural recreation aspect of the remaining fenced area.

At this time, I want to see these principles in the new "smart growth" General Plan applied to this Plan update. The promulgation of policies related to sustainability, xeriscaping and overall natural landscaping are best expressed in Option B.

Finally and most importantly, I do find the policies cited above in the following: the NOP states: "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects the long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use and is economically feasible to implement."

In merely looking at Option A vs Option B, Option B on its face, is less expense (no bathrooms, road, grading and filling for a new beach, amphitheater, fencing/gates etc), has fewer environmental impacts, and no new water or sewage usage). It also does the most to respect the long-term existing use on Fiesta Island for off-leash dogs established officially by ordinance in 1972 when dogs were banned from other City beaches with the exceptions of OB Dog Beach and Fiesta Island. By reducing the amount of Fiesta Island being used for off-leash use in the Plan Update for the rest of Fiesta Island, it only makes sense to conclude that Option B does the best job of respecting that use while reducing it elsewhere on Fiesta Island.

I am hopeful that the staff, after its analysis, will conclude to recommend that Option B best fits the stated intent.

I now have a dog of my own. I take her to the Fiesta Island off-leash dog area about 4 or 5 times per week. It is a wonderful resource for both me and my dog. I can go for a run, ride my bike, go for a swim, or do exercises on the beach while my dog is free to run around and play with the other dogs. Even if my dog isn't up for a run, I still frequent this area for my own exercise in a beautiful place with happy dogs and people.

Fiesta Island is beautiful and the size of the dog area is one of the most important factors to me. I already do 2 loops around the off-leash area in order to get a long enough run. If the size of this area were to be diminished, I would be a lot less likely to use it for my own exercise and would probably frequent the area less often. Access to the shoreline is extremely important to me. The entire reason I visit Fiesta Island is because it provides the same environment as the beach, but it allows my dogs! Being denied access to the water would be devastating and I would likely greatly reduce my use of Fiesta Island. I do not want this area blocked by additional roads or fences. This would ruin the natural beauty of fiesta island.

The foxtails cause my dog a bit of discomfort as they cause her allergies and also lodge in her fur. Yet, I have never witnessed any aggressive behavior by off-leash dogs at Fiesta Island Dog Park. My observations have lead me to the conclusion that the significantly compact, smaller surface area of those two off-leash dog beaches are the cause for the behaviors I have witnessed. My wife and I regularly visit the dog park on Fiesta Island. It is a great place to let the dogs wander and run about. In San Diego it is generally difficult for dog owners to find places that dogs can run in the open for significant distances. Almost all places which provide nice walking experiences (Mission Bay, La Jolla Cove, San Clemente Canyon) require dogs to be on leash and most do not allow dogs at all between 9 am and 4 pm. Most dog parks, like the one near Balboa park, are small (about 1 acre) spots where lots of dogs are crowded in. So, Fiesta Island is a very unusual and splendid location.

It is very unfortunate that it hasn't been designated as an off-leash dog park. So, I strongly support the FIDO Option B which does establish a significant park for dogs on Fiesta Island. This will be the only really nice San Diego park for dogs to exercise within many miles of where we live in the University City neighborhood.

I am a San Diego native. I have lived in San Diego for most of my 54 years. As a child, I rode my horse on Fiesta Island in the 1970's. We would ride there from the last horse stables in Mission Valley. To this day, horses riding along the shore is a welcome sight, though riders now have to trailer horses to the Island. These days, I visit the island with my two dogs several times each week. There is no area as well suited to training and exercising off lead. Fiesta Island was recently acknowledged as the best dog park in San Diego. That proud designation referred to the entire island, including but not limited to the fenced area.

The island is vital to my quality of life. I will be devastated to see it developed at all. It is where I can connect to a bit of nature and walk with my dogs. I train advanced obedience skills and retrieving in the trail area across from the youth center. I take my older dog to the fenced area to walk along the beach. She has trouble breathing, so the water there keeps her cool. Other parks in San Diego are too hot and you cannot visit them early enough. Dog Beach in OB is far too crowded. If Fiesta Island is developed, whatever remains of the off lead allowed areas will become overcrowded, too.

San Deigans lose more and more open space as the city bursts with people. With the lose of space, our quality of life steadily declines. It feels as if there is no room left for people like me, who need a touch of a natural environment in our daily lives. Other regional parks such as Tecolote Canyon are so hot and airless as to be unusable for us. I cannot work my dogs off lead there. They are pointless for us, of no value whatsoever. If you cannot access an area, you cannot use it. They are great for other hikers, I'm sure. But not for me. I need the ocean breeze and so do my dogs.

When my child was smaller, we would walk around the island. He, too, feels peace and beauty in the natural environment. Once, he even found a tiny baby octopus under a rock just above the tide line. (We released it into the water and it swam away.) He also found a pinniped bone there once. I have found several snake skins myself. As it is now, Fiesta Island is a magically natural space, a salve to the soul.

Mission Bay Park is very nice, I'm sure. But it's manicured lawns hold little allure for us. We love the hills, berms and daisies on Fiesta Island. We love to watch the shore birds and sea lions and even the caterpillars in the spring. All that will be gone once Fiesta Island is developed to look just like the rest of Mission Bay. More ball fields. More parking lots. More of what we already have too much of.

The public notice states, "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement"

Back in the mid 70's, the city adopted a leash law. In return for the loss of freedom and flexibility, Fiesta Island was to be set aside as an off lead area for dog owners to be able to walk and exercise their dogs. Off lead activities should be retained throughout the entire island. As San Diego

has grown, the dog owning population has exploded. Nearly one third of San Diego households have one or more dogs. Now is not the time to reduce the area available to dog owners to properly and legally exercise their dogs. The prevalence of owners who violate the leash law is a clear indication that there are inadequate resources for dog owners currently. Reducing off lead areas will only make this problem worse. Please do not betray a long standing promise to San Diego dog owners. Keep the Island entirely open for off lead dog activities.

The current Fiesta Island environment uses little water. Only the Youth center is irrigated at all. This is ideal for native animal species who make the island their home. San Diegans get a precious chance to connect with nature, watch the seasons, enjoy animals and the wildlife has the benefit of an undeveloped space within the city. It is economical, water wise and perfect as it is. And of course, you cannot spend less money than no money at all. Development dollars would be better spent on other parts of the city.

If developers must be employed and public funds wasted on developing what is already a perfect space, the option that preserves the most possible dog friendly space would be best. I dislike both proposed options, but option B would be preferable to the other option.

I hope you make the right decision. Please protect open space in San Diego for the enjoyment of all San Diegans. Leaving Fiesta Island perfect and undeveloped is a fantastic and frugal investment in the quality of life for all our citizens.

I understand that the City is considering a development of the Fiesta Island area and that the potential development may have an impact on the off-leash dog area currently located on Fiesta Island. I am writing to express my strong opposition to Option "A," as set forth in the May 9, 2017, Public Notice.

I believe that Option "A" will negatively impact Fiesta Island and the residents of the City of San Diego. **I oppose Option "A."** 

I believe that Option "B" will adequately satisfy the objectives stated in the Public Notice, namely: "to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement." Option "B" will satisfy this objective and preserve the jewel San Diego has in Fiesta Island. **I support Option "B."** 

I have been a frequent visitor to Fiesta Island for many years. I use the off-lease dog area on a weekly basis, sometimes more frequently. This is a **unique** park that provides safe and accessible access to the shoreline for humans and dogs. The size of the park provides exercise opportunities for both humans and their pets. Fiesta Island provides immeasurable benefits to visitors and residents alike and there are simply **no comparable substitutes** for the opportunities available at Fiesta Island. This is borne out by the fact that the Fiesta Island off-lease dog park was recently voted the "Best Dog Park" in the United States in a USA Today poll.

Developing the area, adding roads, constructing fences, or further segregating the Fiesta Island spaces would detract from the appeal of the area, reducing the utility and attraction by both visitors and residents. The small (or non-existent) benefits from this alteration of the area would be dwarfed by the harm and detriments.

I have questions regarding the intended use of the park and the potential conversion of current parkland that is publicly accessible into public land that is leased to private contractors with greatly restricted access. I also have concerns regarding the infrastructure improvements that would be required to support a potentially significant increase in use in the event the area is redeveloped consistent with Option "A." I am concerned that this increased use and the required infrastructure improvements would negatively affect the ecology and aesthetics of the ares. This would likely reduce the appeal of the redeveloped area, fundamentally undermining the objective stated in the Public Notice.

Moreover, I am concerned that the elimination (or the redevelopment of the area in that reduces the appeal of the area) would result in a dispersal of residents and visitors to other areas. This will lead to an increased use of other park areas (despite the lack of comparable alternative park area). This increased use will negatively impact other park areas, resulting in a further dispersal of visitors to those other park areas. The ripple-effect of the redevelopment of Fiesta Island would impact all of San Diego County, including nearly every park area in the region. I am concerned that these impacts are inadequately considered.

In short, **I am opposed to Option A and I support Option B and the preservation of Fiesta Island.** There are simply too many negative consequences to Option A and scarcely few benefits. The overlooked consequences would be disastrous for the region and the residences of San Diego.

Dear Ms. Malone:

I am writing to let you know that I strongly **support OPTION B** for the development of the fenced, off-leash area on Fiesta Island. There is no other large, open area where we can exercise with our off-leash dogs in all of Southern California. We need to keep this area open and undivided by roads, fences, an amphitheater and boating facility. And believe me, this is as much about the humans as it is the dogs.

San Diego has steadily eliminated most of its open space,- there is NO other place where we can still walk, run or bike <u>safely</u> and <u>legally</u> with our off-leash dogs. This fenced area is a refuge in the middle of a developed city where humans (and their dogs) can try to maintain physical and mental health. We NEED open, undeveloped space. We hear every day how overweight and unhealthy children and adults have become so anything we can do to encourage exercise should be a priority. If you go to the fenced area, all you will see are people and families exercising with their dogs. It is not like the small neighborhood dog parks where people sit on benches and drink coffee while the dogs play. Everyone who uses this area on Fiesta Island is actively exercising.

As a veterinarian, I am aware that almost 50% of all homes now have a dog and there are almost 800,000 dogs in San Diego County. Yet while there are over 40,000 acres of public parkland available, outside of Fiesta Island, there are only about 50 acres designated for off-leash use.

It is a fact of life that dogs have become an important part of family life. These dogs need exercise and with so few areas where they can be off-leash, the importance of keeping this 90-acre area open and intact is critical. As the population of San Diego grows, you simply have to plan on an increased need for the growing dog population of the future. Just like their human owners, a well exercised dog is a happier and better adjusted member of society. Other facilities, such as the amphitheater, playground and paddleboat facility, that are being placed within the off-leash area according to Option A have other locations on Fiesta Island or elsewhere in Mission Bay Park where they could go. Off-leash has NO OTHER option!

Additionally, I will ask that the foxtail problem also be addressed as it is a serious health risk to the dogs and an expensive condition for owners to treat if the dogs get a foxtail under their skin, in their ears, on worst of all, inhaled into their nasal sinuses.

I have read your entire public notice and the thing that struck me was the following statement in your notice:

"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement".

The sentence above describes Option B without exception.

## Option B:

- -Respects <u>our</u> long term use of the space as an off-leash area as a 'long term existing use'.
- -Virtually eliminates environmental impacts to the area. (No grading to create new beaches, amphitheaters, roads; no importation of non-native sand for beaches; no disruption of the existing birds and other animals that live there to name just a few.
- -Not only reduces but eliminates the use of water.
- -And while Option A will cost millions of dollars to build and maintain, Option B requires

minimal buildout expense and virtually no maintenance.

# So, again, I would hope that the analysis of Option B concludes that it is the better alternative based on this criteria that you have established.

At this time, I would like to directly respond to your request for input regarding the upcoming EIR. Below are some of the issues I would like reviewed and considered in the process:

- 1. Please evaluate the environmental impact that bulldozing the berm and soil to create a swimming beach at the south end of the area will have. The dirt used to fill Fiesta Island was from the marshland that was dredged away in the process of making Mission Bay. Rose Creek, with all of the contaminants (including heavy metals) from industrial waste that was pumped into it in the first half of the 1900's, drained directly into the marsh soil. Is that soil still contaminated? (Option B does not include this bulldozing)
- 2. To create a swimming beach after bulldozing, they will have to bring in tons of nonnative sand. What impact/risks will that have on the existing flora and fauna? (Option B does not include a beach)
- 3. Please study the effect that the use of watering and maintaining the grass planned for the area will have. Not to mention the amounts of water that will be wasted while we are constantly in a drought situation. (Option B does not include grass)
- 4. Aesthetically, all of the many users of Fiesta Island love the fact that it is primitive and minimally developed,- a refuge from the city's urban clutter and noise. That is exactly what draws all of the current users to this island. The changes planned within the fenced area in Option A will definitely change the aesthetic pleasure we draw from

how it exists today. Roads, grass, picnic tables, playgrounds abound throughout Mission Bay Park. Do we really need more?

- 5. How will increasing density on the island affect traffic flow? Hopefully traffic studies will be done to show how it will be impacted. Especially if long trailers hauling boats begin to use the roads if the paddle boat facility is built on the south end of the current off-leash area.
- 6. Historically, Fiesta Island has been used as an off-leash area for decades. An ordinance in 1972 officially made it an off-leash area when dogs were banned from all other public beaches (with the exception of Ocean Beach). Specifically, use of the fenced 90-acre area as an off-leash area was started in the 1990's when the city granted permission for off-leash users to begin using that area as it was no longer being used for sludge processing.
- 7. Land use: While there are approximately 40,000 acres of public parkland in San Diego, outside of Fiesta Island, there are only about 50 acres of space designated as off-leash. A recent study showed that out of large US cities, San Diego ranked 20th as far as dog parks, having only 1.09 parks per 100,000 people. And we must consider that San Diego is a very dog-friendly city with almost 800,000 dogs living here.
- 8. The parks of San Diego provide different types of recreational opportunities for different user groups. Open parkland for picnics and play, sports fields, shoreline access for boating, beaches for swimming, etc exist throughout Mission Bay Park. Why shouldn't off-leash users be given similar consideration, especially an area like the fenced area on Fiesta Island where people are actively recreating with their off-leash dogs. We ask that you recognize off-leash use as a valid recreational use of the area and give it adequate space. The other uses you wish to place in this area can easily be placed elsewhere on Fiesta Island or in Mission Bay Park.
- 9. Regarding the Least Tern protected habitat adjacent to our off-leash area: The Audubon Society has said that having picnic tables and trash cans in the vicinity of the Tern area will draw crows and other predator birds into the area. These predators eat the Tern eggs and chicks. Having the large off-leash park in the area will prevent any food/trash that may attract these predators. There is obviously no trash or discarded food in a dog park that the dogs won't get to first. (Option B does not encourage scavengers near the Least Tern Preserve)
- 10. Please analyze the impact of an large number of increased special events that will be brought onto the island and it's impact on the environment, traffic, aesthetics, noise as well as the cost of build-out and maintenance of necessary public services (restrooms, trash, etc) that will be necessary for these events
- 11. Land use/traffic/environmental impact: The primary reason for the road through the 90-acre area is to access a paddle boat facility/storage area on the southern end of the area. The paddler clubs provided a list of the amenities they needed in 2006 when the plans were beginning to be developed. They requested: a beach, close

proximity to restrooms, running water, parking lot, direct access to Mission Bay and the ocean and they specifically told the planner that those could be provided "at South Shore OR Fiesta Island". ALL of that infrastructure already exist in the severely underutilized area directly across the channel from Fiesta Island on South Shore! Why would we spend millions of dollars to recreate those amenities and in the process displace the off-leash users who have been using the area for decades??? Plus, add to the traffic by placing the paddle site on Fiesta Island. Even worse, the environmental impact that grading, the building of roads and parking lots, destroying existing vegetation and animals, building a new beach, etc will have on the existing environment must seriously be considered.

- 12. Please analyze the financial savings that would be incurred if the paddlers were placed on South Shore, where the infrastructure they specifically said they needed already exists versus building a road and recreating the same expensive infrastructure directly across the channel on Fiesta Island. (Option B requires minimal buildout and maintenance)
- 13. More traffic will bring backups with idling cars releasing emissions into the air and dripping oil and antifreeze onto the pavement. How will his affect the environment?
- 14. If events are held in the planned amphitheater, how will this affect the noise and tranquility we currently enjoy at Fiesta Island. They stopped the fireworks at Sea World, partly because of the noise they create. (Option B has no amphitheater)
- 15. Right now there are birds, lizards, ground squirrels and other animals that also 'use' the area with the dogs. What will the impact on these species be by bulldozing, placing grass, tot lots, amphitheaters, roads and parking lots in the middle of the area. (Option B allows the status quo to exist)

In the Mission Bay Park Masterplan Update, dated August 2, 1994, and subsequently amended in 1995,1997 and 2002, it states:

"As an open landscape, Fiesta Island should be the place where City residents and visitors alike find the ultimate refuge from urban congestion, noise and visual clutter."

I hope that the EIR will consider this goal of the Masterplan and if nothing else, keep the fenced off-leash area open, unchanged and that place where we can take "ultimate refuge from urban congestion, noise and visual clutter."

I'm writing this email to give my strong support for Option B in the Fiesta Island plan.

As a native San Diegan, I have spent many, many hours at Fiesta Island with various activities—windsurfing, kayaking, picnicking, attending Overthe-Line, and most especially, walking with my dogs.

I go to the Off-Leash fenced dog area at least five or six times every week (sometimes twice) with my dogs, and it is the most fabulous place to exercise both them and myself! (In fact, I'm sure you know that it was voted #1 Dog Park in the United States.) I want to emphasize the idea of **my** exercise because I need to move also, and walking around the entire fenced-in area is about two miles, or half of the 10,000 steps that are recommended daily. At other, smaller, dog parks, there is no room for me to exercise—I can only stand around or walk a few yards. At the Fiesta Island dog park, I see people of all ages—from toddlers just learning to walk to senior citizens who use a walking stick or even a walker—getting in some fresh air and exercise. There are also people of all ages using the park to jog or ride their bikes with their dogs happily running next to them.

In addition to the exercise, both the dogs and I are able to socialize—I have made several friends among the regulars who go at the same time as I do, and of course, the dogs have their buddies that they can run and play with. As a ten-year volunteer at the San Diego Humane Society, I have observed how much dogs need regular socialization and exercise in order to be good pets. The expansiveness of the park at Fiesta Island allows the dogs so much room that any show of being territorial is very, very rare.

I have often gone to other areas of Mission Bay Park, and I can tell you unequivocally that the dog park on Fiesta Island is the most well-used part of the park. People are there with their dogs every day of the year, rain or shine. (That's me that you'll see in a yellow slicker on rainy days!) Even on the most sunny, warm days in July and August, Fiesta Island is booming, but other areas of the park have plenty of parking available, and South Shores is almost a ghost town—that would be a perfect spot to revamp for paddlers and boaters.

I would also like to address a few specific points made in your notice: <!--[if !supportLists]-->• "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island"—The off-leash dog park is definitely a long term existing use, and one enjoyed by tens of thousands of people from all over the world.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->• "reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use"—Option B has very few changes and no developed parkland needing water and upkeep. I especially like this point because we really don't need more developed, turfed, asphalted acreage on Mission Bay.

<!--[if !supportLists]-->• "and is economically feasible to implement"—again, the relatively small changes in Option B will be economically feasible not only to implement but also to maintain.

As you can see, there are so many reasons to designate the entire current fenced area as a dog park as is planned in Option B. Dear Planning Committee,

I am a San Diego resident strongly opposed to the Fiesta Island Precision Plan - Option A, which further develops an environmentally sensitive habitat, an open natural space and currently an off-leash dog site.

I hope you will consider the following points:

1. Historically, the original intention for Mission Bay Aquatic Park was to create and protect a multi-use recreational marine park, open to the public, and to preserve the tidelands and natural habitat. While the original plan has been modified over time, the essential intent of the Aquatic Park remains intact.

I believe, to cut roads across the current fenced in area that is an off-leash dog park, creating increased parking, boat storage, RV parking would cause immediate denigration of the natural space.

To date, the dog owners have lived in unique harmony with this space, understanding, appreciating and respecting the ecological balance, such as the Least Tern nesting site. A core group of owners (FIDO) work diligently to assure regular maintenance and caretaking of the off-leash area.

- 2. The off-leash dog area is an incredible outdoor experience, untainted by structures, with unobstructed views of the city, and bay. People come from all over the U.S. to enjoy San Diego and hundreds of thousands of visitors end up along Mission Bay. People visit the dog park to enjoy a relaxing walk, exercise their dogs and socialize. An amphitheater, several bridges, dog arenas are all misguided, expensive ventures that will only serve to obliterate the peacefulness of this rare and beautiful gem.
- 3. While I am an avid sailor and small boat owner, I wonder what privileged person will get to store their boat at the proposed "Boat Club" on the island, supposedly for public use? If the City Planners are desperate to create such a location, look a few meters across the inlet and you will see a wide open expanse **in existence at South Shores**, with covered picnic tables, a huge amount of parking, a launch ramp, lovely walkways and bikeways, RV parking and restrooms. In all my years, I have never seen this parking area overwhelmed, which suggests there is already ample parking and facilities within one mile of Fiesta Island.
- 4. Directly to the west of Fiesta Island is another enviable recreation area the Ski Beach boat ramp, off Ingraham street on Vacation Isle. Again, ample parking, launching facilities, restrooms.

In brief, substantial resources already exist for those wishing to access the bay with their watercraft, or just picnic.

Over the years, I have talked to many visitors walking their dogs on Fiesta Island. Some are young folks with a day off from work walking their dog; some are tourists wanting to stretch their legs and exercise their dogs; some are older folks getting out of the house to enjoy a beautiful day where they can safely walk and sit with their dog. I have met people in wheelchairs, with walkers and with terminal illnesses, who have chosen to spend their time, with their dog, on Fiesta Island. It's a slice of paradise that supports community, health and healing.

I came upon a young man not long ago who was turning around in a 360 degree circle in the middle of the dog park. He looked lost, or like he had lost his dog. I asked him if he needed help.

He said: "I can't believe this. I can't believe this exists...look, this whole place, I can't believe it, it's beautiful."

City Planners: This is why we plead with you to preserve what exists and not destroy it with so called "improvements". The early city planners had a vision to protect the precious asset that is Mission Bay Aquatic Park for all to share and enjoy and it is incumbent upon all of us to caretake that vision.

I implore you to visit Fiesta Island and walk the perimeter, see it in its natural

form and beauty. Laugh, as I do, watching the gawking pelicans diving for fish, the dogs running full tilt into the water after balls and Frisbee's, then relax under the shade of the giant eucalypts and share some stories with total strangers. This is the watering hole, where owners gather and dogs drink water provided by caring individuals. It's simple, it's free, it's open to everyone to experience and enjoy.

I am a native San Diegan (1967) and dog owner. I am writing to express my opinion of the proposed changes to Fiesta Island and support of the adoption of Option B.

As the owner of two dogs, I am a daily visitor to Fiesta Island. I adore the ease and simplicity of driving onto the island and parking area I choose, areas that always has a space available no matter what busy event is going on; being able to walk 1 step into the fenced area and releasing my pups off the leash and away they go. I'm so fortunate to live in a city that has such a park, where I know my dogs will be getting at least an hour of joyful play and exercise in an uncomplicated nature filled space. I personally am grateful to know that my health is improving with this daily walk too. And on days when I am pressed for time, I can drop in at any of the other entrances and do a quick walk on any of the alternate routes.

I typically follow the same walk, starting at the main gate and loop from the west, towards the back, around the anchorage, to the trees and out, my dogs know the route perfectly and I love it. In the early spring, after the rainey times, its thrilling to watch the earth as far as I can see become swept over in a green blanket of sprouting foliage, watching it grow on a day to day basis. When the daisies and flowers bloom, seeing the dogs bounding and bouncing up and through the growth with unbridled passion is thrilling for all to see. So many pups with pollenyellowed chest and paw fur, proudly enjoying the annual bloom with no restrictions. Frequently, I will chose walk in the middle of the back field area, directly through the fields of flowers and enjoy the birth of spring, thankful to be able to create my own path. When the Lest tern area gate is closed, I personally get so excited, because it is one of the first signs of summer coming.

In the winter, even after the heaviest of rains, I will go with the dogs, because they need to run and I know the park will be muddy in some places, but just fine in most of the hard pack areas and a muddy happy dog is a delight to see. And I know it will dry out just fine and be as it always is. On days when I am pressed for time, I can drop in at any of the other gates and do a quick walk on many of the alternate routes.

Because all who are there are dog lovers, its easy to strike up a conversation with a stranger about our dogs and the park, what a unique slice of community in a shut off world, people walking with heads up and saying hi to one another instead of heads down looking at a screen. I have made "fiesta" friends that I see there daily including Frank, the happiest city employee Ive ever encountered, who drives around saying hi to all while he manages the trash maintenance, meeting the dog walkers and Gus and his pup crew at the trees bringing water for all and folks from all over San Diego out for a simple walk in a nature setting that is as it has been for decades.

I am also the co-founder of a local dog rescue called The Rescued Dog, and with every adoption, I talk to the adopters about the magnificent Fiesta Island and encourage them to visit frequently with their new family member as they build a bond and create routines. I am often thrilled to run into so many of the dogs I have been a apart of rescuing and seeing them run

free in such a happy 'doggie disneyland' and the owners that often comment that they didn't realize how amazing Fiesta Island is.

I understand a large part of these proposed changes have to do with the non motorized boat clubs, and I can understand that point of view. However, is there not another slice of these 500 acres that can be used for that need? Why chop up and overengineer our section, that is a happy place for 100s of people to use daily, for a very small community of special interest sporting clubs with a limited need and duration of use throughout the year. We, the dog park folks, use it daily, its free and that means accessible to those with limited means, it provides a secure and safe place for people of all genders and age to walk and feel safe from danger.

# To whom it may concern,

I would like to express my support for FIDOs "Option B" regarding future development of Fiesta Island. The large area, 5F, that is currently a leash free area for dogs is a valuable asset to many dogs, dog owners, children and our community. I have enjoyed this area for the past 6 years with my Jack Russell Terrier. I'd like to summarize my observations of the benefits to the stakeholders: 1. Dogs: This is the only large area in San Diego that dogs can freely run and play in fields, on the sand, and swim in the bay. Many dogs do not benefit from the small areas that other dog parks offer. Most of the dogs that enjoy Fiesta Island leash free area are rescue dogs or dogs that require large space to run and play. I now know many of the dogs and have watched their behavior change from timid/frightened or aggressive to animals that can socially interact with other dogs and people. The large space and variety of terrain affords them the opportunity to gradually integrate with others. They are not forced to be in closed and small spaces, encouraging conflict. . Many dogs, including mine, learn to swim in this park. Excellent form of exercise and endless entertainment. The physical and psychological benefits of this park cannot be underestimated. 2. Dog owners: The current leash free park provides and opportunity for dog owners to socialize their dogs to other dogs, children, and adults. Many of us cannot walk or run fast enough "on leash" to adequately exercise our furry friends. Also, the dog training classes that are frequently offered are very important. It is very difficult to find training classes with adequate space. Many public parks and schools do not allow off leash training courses, for public safety. Also, the benefits of long leisurely or not so leisurely activity is important to Public Health in general. I know that this is the only exercise may of the adults gets - they have to get out an exercise their dogs. The owners can proceed at their own pace, while still keeping an eye on their dog. 3. Children: Many children are afraid of dogs. On numerous occasions, my dog has swam out to children playing in the water. Later, I find out, when the parents come to thank me, that their child was terrified of dogs other than their own. Well, they just played with mine for about an hour! This off leash area is frequented by responsible dog owners. Most of us closely watch the reaction of our dogs and that of other dogs and people. I have been able to identify the children who are afraid of dogs and take an active role in introducing dog and child via play (and with the permission of parents). My dog has spent endless hours in the water with children and the children laugh, scream with joy and have a great time. This gives the adults opportunity to relax and enjoy watching their children be entertained. The large areas

in the park allow the dogs to run past children or stop and enjoy affection. This allows kids who are uncomfortable with dogs an opportunity to gradually be introduced to all types and sizes of dogs. 4. Our community: Happy and well adjusted rescue dogs benefits the community. These dogs receive the exercise and gradual interaction with other dogs and people that is not otherwise available. So, they are better behaved when they encounter other dogs and people in public places. Also, I met a woman who moved from Arizona to San Diego "because of Fiesta Island's off leash dog park". Obviously, she enjoyed the physical and psychological benefits to her dog from this open area. She also stated that she was impressed that San Diego values dogs and saw this as a wonderful value statement.

The large leash free dog part is enjoyed by many dogs and dog owners. We have no other paces like this in San Diego. To limit the size or introduce cars, boats, motorcycles, etc.. into this area would significantly reduce the benefits to the users of this park. Many of us would not be able to use this space because of the potential for injury due to other than foot traffic and the confinement of animals in small spaces. The ability to socialize with our animals, play in the sand and water and fields with our dogs and enjoy these activities with other people and dogs makes San Diego very special. These activities to us are comparable to the importance of surfing, jet skiing, basketball, soccer, etc. that other people enjoy.

Please consider adopting FIDOs "Option B" to the future development of Fiesta Island.

Please resist the temptation to try to achieve two goals by giving in to the false rationalization that the dog park will be "almost as good" if it is cut in half. Much more than merely some land on a map will be lost. Keep San Diego a leader and a wonder among large cities.

## Dear Ms. Malone,

I am writing in support of Option B of the Fiesta Island plan amendment.

In the 1970's and early 1980's I was a regular runner on the Fiesta Island roadways. Now, I am a frequent walker in the off-leash area with my dog. I walk there with my dog because it's a large, open area, unlike my neighborhood. In my neighborhood, I stop at every street corner and wait on traffic, before continuing. This stop and wait, then start and stop again does little to exercise my dog or get my heart rate going. The off-leash area does multi-duty for me; I walk around 1½ miles each time. This helps my personal health battle with hypertension and weight. And it tends to wear my dog out; a tired dog is a good dog in my experience, and well-behaved dog citizens are good for the public. When we walk around the shoreline and through the interior of the island, the bay views and the open sky refresh my spirit. Both my physical and emotional well-being are enhanced by these mini-adventures on Fiesta Island. This area provides me with a different park experience than the manicured grass and concrete tables and parking lots of east Mission or Crown Point. I enjoy Fiesta Island precisely because it is not developed or programmed with hardscape. It is a small oasis in the middle of a large city.

I have several concerns and areas that I believe the EIR should evaluate for both Option A and Option B.

First, the very southwest portion of the island is a Least Tern protected space. Option A would add grass, a playground and a swimming beach which could contribute to added trash, waste and food in this area, drawing more predators into close proximity to the Least Tern area. Option B does not add these kinds of features that would encourage more predators near the protected terns. The

concern is that predators would eat the Least Tern eggs and chicks. In fact, if my dog is any indicator, food waste and even some debris gets picked up really quickly in a dog area. Yes, debris or trash; she picked up a deflated soccer ball once which we played with until we reached a trash can for disposal. The Options must be evaluated for the potential to impact the terns.

Second, Option A shows two large sections of turf, which requires lots of water. Option B does not add grass and trees. In 2014, I opted to remove grass in my yard due to the drought and the ballooning of my water bill from the City of San Diego. I not only reduced the grass area, but also eliminated large trees and shrubs that were water hogs. They were replaced with drought tolerant plants and ground cover. My old-fashioned water spray irrigation system was removed and replaced with a drip water system. My yard is now much more environmentally sustainable and my water usage was cut by more than 50%. So, if that's good for my home, and the City of San Diego encourages water-wise planting, why would we want to add grass and trees on Fiesta Island? And where would the water come from? The nearest reclaimed water supply is near Rose Canyon and Highway 52. These options must be evaluated for the cost to construct extensive landscaping, water infrastructure, and the cost to maintain over time the landscape and water system. Option B is a sustainable and low impact plan to implement.

Third, Option A adds redundant facilities at the shoreline: a swimming beach, boat launch and storage areas. I say redundant since right across the channel sits South Shores with a huge swimming beach, picnic pavilion, boat launch, lots of paved parking and even bathrooms with running water-all of which are virtually unused. Option A would cost millions to create. The area needed to grade to manufacture a new beach is quite large. What are the environmental concerns about this grading? What kind of sand would be required to make a new beach? And where would the "foreign" sand come from and what is the impact using it to create a new beach? These issues must all be evaluated. Option B creates none of these potential negative impacts.

Fourth, the proposed city plan Option A adds an amphitheater for special events. This highlights a lack of an organic planning process for Mission Bay. The South Shores plan includes an amphitheater, which has never been completed. Now, Fiesta Island Option A has added a second amphitheater right across the channel.

And, as an observer and participant in the De Anza Revitalization Planning workshops, an amphitheater is also included in that area. Really? Three amphitheaters in Mission Bay? The cost of a special events amphitheater and the construction involved seems un-necessary for one site, let alone three. Option B does not add this feature.

And finally, traffic on the island continues to grow as island usage grows and special events close the island many weekend mornings. The causeway entry to the island currently is one lane in each direction. This area must be improved for safety and ease of entry and exit. This is one area where money could be well spent to improve access. Idling cars emit more greenhouse gases as people wait to come and go; air quality is a critical issue to evaluate in the Master Plan. Traffic and the causeway entry must be evaluated for pollution and safety in the overall Master Plan for Fiesta Island.

I have been a regular, on average six days a week, at the Fiesta Island dog park for the past eight years. There is a reason it was voted "The Best Dog Park in the USA". The beauty of this dog park is it's size and the ability of dog owners to get exercise with their pets. Breaking up this area into smaller fenced in areas defeats this purpose. My husband and I have been doing an informal survey of people we meet at the dog park. When asked what changes they would like to see, 99.9% of them responded, "Don't change a thing".

Given plan A and plan B I would support plan B but that even seems like too much. If given a plan C I would like to see the following:

- 1) Designate the fenced in area as a dog park in the Mission Bay master plan.
- 2) Pave the parking lot at the main gate and pave a parking lot by ski beach to prevent run off.
- 3) Put in permanent stairs at the south end of the west beach and at the west end of the south beach to prevent erosion and make it a safer access to the beach. That's it. Leave the rest of the dog park alone.

#### Concerns:

- 1) If you develop the island how do you handle increased traffic. With only one lane exiting the island you can already hold up traffic when trying to turn left.
- 2) Water quality. Putting a children's swimming beach on the south beach is ridiculous. What parent would want there kids swimming there. I don't even like my dog to drink the water. Putting a dock here would also be difficult given the tidal flow.
- 3) Tot lot. You can't have unleashed dogs and a tot lot and swimming beach for children. If you fence these areas you restrict the contiguous walking area for the dog owners. We have enough small fenced dog parks in this city. The large contiguous walking area surrounded by water on three sides is what makes this dog park so ideal.
- 4) Put the boat house at South Shores Park. You already have facilities there.
- 5) The foxtails have gotten worse since the grading and cutting down of the natural vegetation. Years ago the dog park would be covered with yellow and white flowers in the spring. These plants would grow 3 feet high and crowd out the foxtails and deprive them of light. I certainly do not want to get rid of the foxtails with toxic chemicals and risk my dog's health.

As for the rest of the island I really don't have a strong opinion but less development is always better. Where is the money coming from to maintain all of the new developments? I remember a few years back the city didn't even have enough money to maintain the fire rings and had to rely on private donations.

I think have a safe, large space where dogs can run and swim is a huge amenity adding to the desirability of the area. Pacific Beach also has one of the highest levels of off-leash dog citations and having this area offsets, in part, the urge to let one's dog off-lease on the ocean beaches (Tourmaline, Law Street, etc). - 3. Size is also important. Too small an area and dogs get more aggressive.
- 4. Foxtail eradication is a big issue. I do not let me dogs run free in the grassy area because of them.
- 5. I would really like the area not to be blocked by a road...I can't imagine how that would work.

#### Good Afternoon.

As a native San Diegan and a long-time, frequent visitor to the off-leash dog park area at Fiesta Island with my Rhodesian Ridgeback, I feel compelled to comment on this subject. For full disclosure, I currently serve as the treasurer for Fiesta Island Dog Owners (FIDO), a non-profit organization with approximately 14,000 supporters who are dedicated to preserving the current off-leash area as represented in OPTION B (FIDO's Plan).

The existing, 90-acre off-leash area at Fiesta Island is an oasis for people from all walks of life to exercise with or without their dogs. It is often referred to as "Doggy Disneyland." As a testament, the Fiesta Island Dog Park was recently voted by USA Today readers as the best dog park in the nation! Frequently, I meet people visiting this area for the first time and they are overwhelmed with how spacious and varied it is: you can stay on dry land, wade in the water, walk in the sand, or all of the above. You can choose to go a short distance or walk the entire, approximately two-mile area. That is why I support adopting OPTION B (FIDO's Plan) which will preserve the current off-leash area intact. To have this area divided by a road, amphitheater, and other amenities would negatively impact the thousands of people and dogs who use this area on a daily, year-round basis to promote a healthy lifestyle.

## To quote from the Public Notice:

"The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement."

Clearly, OPTION B (FIDO's Plan) completely fulfills this intent, and the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) should support this conclusion, for the following reasons:

- It respects long term existing uses on the island: active human recreational area where owners openly walk, run and bike with their dogs. *Option A will divide the acreage resulting in smaller areas similar to the numerous neighborhood dog parks*.
- It reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use. *Option A will INCREASE developed parkland AND water use (amphitheater, road, grass areas).*
- It is economically feasible to implement: minimal improvements. Option A will have significant costs for a new road, an amphitheater, and several other improvements, not to mention ongoing maintenance costs.

The EIR should also address getting rid of, and managing, the foxtails which are so prevalent and detrimental to dogs.

Fiesta Island is a special place. It is unique. It is a treasure in the middle of a developed city where people and dogs can enjoy limited, safe solitude to exercise in a spacious, undeveloped area. It is one of the many reasons why San Diego is America's Finest City. Let's keep it that way by adopting OPTION B (FIDO's Plan)! Thank you.

Fiesta Island is one of the last remaining open space areas left in San Diego and Option B would best preserve this space. The off leash dog area was recently voted the best dog park in the nation. I walk the perimeter of the off leash area daily with my dog and have met many people from out of town who say how fortunate we are to have this full area for the dogs where you can walk uninhibited without the threat of vehicles or crossing a road. There are many who run and ride their bikes throughout the off leash area on a daily basis and people come from all over San Diego County to enjoy the peacefulness every day. There are also so many parks such as Mission Bay Park that regulate where and when you can bring your dog ON a leash if at all or risk being fined. This is a gem of an open space area that San Diego should be preserving. People from out of town always say they wish they had an area like this and this is what makes San Diego a great city.

There is currently a road that goes around the perimeter of the island which is heavily traveled particularly on the weekends. Once you are within the boundaries of the off leash area you are relatively unaware there is a road there. It does not make any sense to add an additional road which will greatly increase the noise pollution as well as exposure to emissions along with more traffic. The area is home to many birds besides that which is located in the least tern area as well as native vegetation that would be effected by the increased noise and potential hazmat issues. The additional road would disturb the current habitat and and construction in the area may increase the potential for release of toxic gases beneath the soil.

The main purpose of the road is to provide an area for a non-motorized boat such as a kayak and boat storage. A kayak can be put in the water anywhere around the island as seen everyday on Fiesta Island where you just pull over and drop it in the water. This is not necessary and carving an asphalt road through the area which will release chemicals into the ground does not seem worth the risk. The area around DeAnza Cove already has plenty of asphalt parking space where a boat storage area could be accommodated and a boat launch area.

The enforcement of regulations on Fiesta Island has also been lax despite the increase of use. I have observed campers which have been in the same spot for days as well as people drinking alcohol and leaving trash all over. Public safety issues are of concern already and where is the money coming from to maintain any additional structures etc in the area? I strongly propose you opt for Option B and preserve this area.

I am a long time (>25 years) resident of the City of San Diego and a frequent user of the Fiesta Island leash free dog area. My husband and I have no children, so have not realized the benefits of the taxes we pay to support public education, but we have been grateful to have the benefit of the current leash-free area of Fiesta Island

I see the great benefit that Fiesta Island has been to the citizens of San Diego as well as local wild life, and I am alarmed about the adverse impacts that will be caused by the increased traffic in this area. These impacts include increases in air and water pollution, impacts to the environment of Fiesta Island, increased noise and decreased numbers of wildlife, some endangered if traffic in this area is increased.

I support Option B and keeping the off-leash area as is, with no additional roads dividing the area or other development. I utilize this area two – three times per week, both for my own exercise as well as my dog's. I am a frequent jogger, and my vet has advised that I cannot run with my dog on a leash based on joint problems my dog has. My husband and I are both native San Diegans and in our 70's. We visit Fiesta Island fenced off-leash Dog Park at least 3 times a week, for our own health and to exercise our two large dogs. Plus we participate several times a year in Fiesta Island dog park clean ups, both in an organized group and individually.

Although there are other off-leash dog parks in San Diego, most of these are too far away, deficient in proper safety fencing, severely impacted by traffic and lack of parking, or too small for our large dogs to get proper exercise. Fiesta Island is unique in this respect, as it fulfills all our requirements and we are always able to park and enjoy our time there, even during the busiest seasons. Access to the shoreline is critical for us, as one of our dogs (Lucy) had surgery and a metal plate inserted in her left back leg. Because of her disability, her Vet has stressed the importance of swimming exercise. Fortunately Lucy loves to swim and spends most of her time at Fiesta in the water, which benefits her greatly.

We have observed on our weekly visits that the Fiesta Island fenced off-leash park is also used by a variety of people, and not all arrive with dogs. I strongly oppose this option.

I belong to the Fiesta Island Dog Owners Meetup group. We regularly walk our dogs (I have 3 of them) on Mondays. I'm also a member of a Doberman Meetup group that brings their dogs out on the weekends.

My dogs relish ALL of the open space that Fiesta Island currently offers. We generally walk across the grass field from the parking lot, then down to the beach on the East side. All the while, our dogs are playing, running in and out of the water splashing and having a wonderful time.

After reaching the fence, we usually climb up the hill to the grassy area and sometimes walk back down to the beach (past the fenced in area). Other times we walk along the West side of the hill, then cross back mid-way to the shady trees where the dogs have a drink of water before we return to our cars.

This is a treasured time (for exercise, socializing, and especially for seeing how happy our dogs are getting to run around, play and swim in the perfect environment for them). As soon as I reach the Tecolote Rd. exit, my dogs become frantic with excitement because they are so happy they will soon arrive at their favorite place.

Many, many other dog owners utilize the site. It would be a major shame to infringe on the current space allocated to off-leash dogs.

I'm including a couple of pictures showing how much my dogs relish running in the field and playing in the water. I sincerely hope you make the right decision and leave the existing off-leash dog area intact.



Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am writing in support of Option B for Fiesta Island, as it relates to the City's recent notice of the Preparation of the Mission Bay Park/Fiesta Island Program Environmental Impact Report. I am a long time (>25 years) resident of the City of San Diego and a frequent user of the Fiesta Island leash free dog area. My husband and I have no children, so have not realized the benefits of the taxes we pay to support public education, but we have been grateful to have the benefit of the current leash-free area of Fiesta Island

I see the great benefit that Fiesta Island has been to the citizens of San Diego as well as local wild life, and I am alarmed about the adverse impacts that will be caused by the increased traffic in this area. These impacts include increases in air and water pollution, impacts to the environment of Fiesta Island, increased noise and decreased numbers of wildlife, some endangered if traffic in this area is increased.

I support Option B and keeping the off-leash area as is, with no additional roads dividing the area or other development. I utilize this area two – three times per week, both for my own exercise as well as my dog's. I am a frequent jogger, and my vet has advised that I cannot run with my dog on a leash based on joint problems my dog has. Fiesta Island is the only place that I know of where I can jog, and let my dog off leash to go at his own pace and for a decent distance. I am concerned I would no longer be able to use the area as I do now if Option B is not approved. We are writing to show our support for Option B which respects long term existing use, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement.

We have used the large off-leash area for our dogs for 7 years, and hope to use it for a long time. Living in an urban area, it's often difficult to find a park large enough for our dogs to roam and socialize safely in an off-leash area. Having a permanent off-leash area maintains an important sense of community. We've met folks from all walks of life (pun intended) and enjoy the "networking" established at the Park.

Going to the Fiesta Island Off-leash Park is an education for us and our dogs - we've met several horses (our rescued greyhound was fascinated), a rescued wolf from Montana (also there to socialize and adapt), and various pet-parents whom advise and lament about canine behaviors and medical conditions. Like humans, they need interaction and lots of exercise to maintain a long life. A few years ago, our then puppy learned to swim, in a dog life jacket, of course, with the help of other people's adult dogs (mainly lab-mixes, if you know dogs). It didn't take long, but she's a water lover now. Having access to the water and a large enclosed area, is essential to her size, she's considered "giant" at 120lbs. And our rescued greyhound, as an ex-racer, loves to run for the fun of it. Both need a large fenced area for adequate exercise.

Being able to substantially walk and run with our dogs in a large area, while being off-leash, is vital to our lives as well as theirs. Limiting access or acreage does not address the unique quality of the off-leash area. In fact it becomes unsafe and detrimental to both human and dog, alike, if Option A exists.

One final thought, having a pet(s) is now considered important to our society, and with the animal and rescue shelters nearly full, adopting a dog is just as important. #### Subject: Mission Bay Park Master Plan Update - Fiesta Island Amendment

My wife and I have been Pacific Beach residents since 1976. We have always had 2 dogs (larger breed types).

We are concerned with the thought of losing ANY of the designated leash-free dog area on Fiesta Island for our dog run exercises. The dogs, especially larger breeds, DO need to "unwind" and in the past, we have run them in several areas around the city. These areas are NO LONGER off-leash areas and we cannot use them. They are listed below.

- 1. Van Nuys Canyon (north PB canyon). The area around it has built up so much that a dog run off leash is no longer possible.
- 2. San Clemente Canyon (off Rt. 52). This area, which was once a beautiful area for off-leash runs, is no longer available for off-leash.
- 3. Kate Sessions This area at once was a great area for Off-leash exercise but is no longer available for off-leash.



So, currently the only "close by" areas for our larger dogs to run are: 1. Dog Beach (OB) area which is kinda small and limited. 2. Capehart Dog Park – very very small for larger size dogs to get ANY exercise. 3. Fiesta Island – outstanding area and contained also because of the berms at the edges of the bay.

I believe that the Fiesta Island dog run should NOT be tampered with at all. It was already voted one of the top dog run areas in the entire country. That, in of itself, should be taken into account when decisions are being made to CHANGE the area. How can the city receive such an honor for this area, yet be even thinking of modifying it in any way? This is on the internet and people visiting our "finest city" with a dog may certainly want to go to use it. It is a large area where dogs can certainly stretch their legs if they want. There are also some beautiful shade trees in the middle and lots of tables for people to take a break. And there are some elderly people who often stop there to relax out of the heat. The city does a very good job of clipping the area when it begins to be overgrown with weeds, fox-tails, etc. This area is also used for parking when the Over-the-Line is in operation and they certainly need the parking spaces. Sometimes there are some dogs who are not as well behaved, but because of the LARGE space of this area, it is always easy to avoid interactions, since there are so many trails to walk through and the larger the area, the less chance there is of dogs getting into scuffles. There is always plenty parking in several areas to choose from with an adequate number of porta potties if needed.

It does NOT require any water or any other maintenance other than this clipping once or twice a year. Recently handicapped parking has been installed. *Option B is the only sound option.*

Dear Planning Committee,

I am a San Diego resident strongly opposed to the Fiesta Island Precision Plan - Option A, which further develops an environmentally sensitive habitat, an open natural space and is currently an off-leash dog site.

I hope you will consider the following points:

1. Historically, the original intention for Mission Bay Aquatic Park was to create and protect a multi-use recreational marine park, open to the public, and to preserve the tidelands and natural habitat. While the original plan has been modified over time, the essential intent of the Aquatic Park remains intact.

I believe, to cut roads across the current fenced in area that is an off-leash dog park, creating increased parking, boat storage, RV parking would cause immediate denigration of the natural space.

To date, the dog owners have lived in unique harmony with this space, understanding, appreciating and respecting the ecological balance, such as the Least Tern nesting site. A core group of owners (FIDO) work diligently to assure regular maintenance and caretaking of the off-leash area.

- 2. The off-leash dog area is an incredible outdoor experience, untainted by structures, with unobstructed views of the city, and bay. People come from all over the U.S. to enjoy San Diego and hundreds of thousands of visitors end up along Mission Bay. People visit the dog park to enjoy a relaxing walk, exercise their dogs and socialize. An amphitheater, several bridges, dog arenas are all misguided, expensive ventures that will only serve to obliterate the peacefulness of this rare and beautiful gem.
- 3. While I am an avid sailor and small boat owner, I wonder what privileged person will get to store their boat at the proposed "Boat Club" on the island, supposedly for public use? If the City Planners are desperate to create such a location, look a few meters across the inlet and you will see a wide open expanse in existence at South Shores, with covered picnic tables, a huge amount of parking, a launch ramp, lovely walkways and bikeways, RV parking and restrooms. In all my years, I have never seen this parking area overwhelmed, which suggests there is already ample parking and facilities within one mile of Fiesta Island.
- 4. Directly to the west of Fiesta Island is another enviable recreation area the Ski Beach boat ramp, off Ingraham street on Vacation Isle. Again, ample parking, launching facilities, restrooms.

In brief, substantial resources already exist for those wishing to access the bay with their watercraft, or just picnic.

Over the years, I have talked to many visitors walking their dogs on Fiesta Island. Some are young folks with a day off from work walking their dog; some are tourists wanting to stretch their legs and exercise their dogs; some are older folks getting out of the house to enjoy a beautiful day where they can safely walk and sit with their dog. I have met people in wheelchairs, with walkers and with terminal illnesses, who have chosen to spend their time, with their dog, on Fiesta Island. It's a slice of paradise that supports community, health and healing.

I came upon a young man not long ago who was turning around in a 360 degree circle in the middle of the dog park. He looked lost, or like he had lost his dog. I asked him if he needed help. He said: "I can't believe this. I can't believe this exists...look, this whole place, I can't believe it, it's beautiful."

City Planners: This is why we plead with you to preserve what exists and not destroy it with so called "improvements". The early city planners had a vision to protect the precious asset that is Mission Bay Aquatic Park for all to share and enjoy and it is incumbent upon all of us to caretake that vision.

I implore you to visit Fiesta Island and walk the perimeter, see it in its natural form and beauty. Laugh, as I do, watching the gawking pelicans diving for fish, the dogs running full tilt into the water after balls and Frisbee's, then relax under the shade of the giant eucalypts and share some stories with total strangers. This is the watering hole, where owners gather and dogs drink water provided by caring individuals.

It's simple, it's free, it's open to everyone to experience and enjoy.

The Native American Heritage Commission has received the Notice of Preparation (NOP) for Draft Environmental Impact Report for the project referenced above. The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (Pub. Resources Code § 21000 et seq.), specifically Public Resources Code section 21084.1, states that a project that may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of an historical resource is a project that may have a significant effect on the environment. (Pub. Resources Code § 21084.1; Cal. Code Regs., tit.14, § 15064.5 (b) (CEQA Guidelines Section 15064.5 (b)). If there is substantial evidence, in light of the whole record before a lead agency, that a project may have a significant effect on the environment, an environmental impact report (EIR) shall be prepared. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080 (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 15064 subd.(a)(1) (CEQA Guidelines § 15064 (a)(1)). In order to determine whether a project will cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource, a lead agency will need to determine whether there are historical resources with the area of project effect (APE).

CEQA was amended significantly in 2014. Assembly Bill 52 (Gatto, Chapter 532, Statutes of 2014) (AB 52) amended CEQA to create a separate category of cultural resources, "tribal cultural resources" (Pub. Resources Code § 21074) and provides that a project with an effect that may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a tribal cultural resource is a project that may have a significant effect on the environment (Pub. Resources Code § 21084.2). Please reference California Natural Resources Agency (2016) "Final Text for tribal cultural resources update to Appendix G: Environmental Checklist Form," <a href="http://resources.ca.gov/ceqa/docs/ab52/Clean-final-AB-52-App-G-text-Submitted.pdf">http://resources.ca.gov/ceqa/docs/ab52/Clean-final-AB-52-App-G-text-Submitted.pdf</a>. Public agencies shall, when feasible, avoid damaging effects to any tribal cultural resource. (Pub. Resources Code § 21084.3 (a)). AB 52 applies to any project for which a notice of preparation or a notice of negative declaration or mitigated negative declaration is filed on or after July 1, 2015. If your project involves the adoption of or amendment to a general plan or a specific plan, or the designation or proposed designation of open space, on or after March 1, 2005, it may also be subject to Senate Bill 18 (Burton, Chapter 905, Statutes of 2004) (SB 18). Both SB 18 and AB 52 have tribal consultation requirements. If your project is also subject to the federal National Environmental Policy Act (42 U.S.C. § 4321 et seq.) (NEPA), the tribal consultation requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (154 U.S.C. 300101, 36 C.F.R. § 800 et seq.) may also apply.

The NAHC recommends lead agencies consult with all California Native American tribes that are traditionally and culturally affiliated with the geographic area of your proposed project as early as possible in order to avoid inadvertent discoveries of Native American human remains and best protect tribal cultural resources. Below is a brief summary of portions of AB 52 and SB 18 as well as the NAHC's recommendations for conducting cultural resources assessments. Consult your legal counsel about compliance with AB 52 and SB 18 as well as compliance with any other applicable laws.

#### AB 52

AB 52 has added to CEQA the additional requirements listed below, along with many other requirements:

- 1. Fourteen Day Period to Provide Notice of Completion of an Application/Decision to Undertake a Project: Within fourteen (14) days of determining that an application for a project is complete or of a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, a lead agency shall provide formal notification to a designated contact of, or tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, to be accomplished by at least one written notice that includes:
  - a. A brief description of the project.
  - **b.** The lead agency contact information.
  - **c.** Notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.1 (d)).
  - d. A "California Native American tribe" is defined as a Native American tribe located in California that is on the contact list maintained by the NAHC for the purposes of Chapter 905 of Statutes of 2004 (SB 18). (Pub. Resources Code § 21073).
- 2. Begin Consultation Within 30 Days of Receiving a Tribe's Request for Consultation and Before Releasing a Negative Declaration, Mitigated Negative Declaration, or Environmental Impact Report: A lead agency shall begin the consultation process within 30 days of receiving a request for consultation from a California Native American tribe that is traditionally and culturally affiliated with the geographic area of the proposed project. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.1, subds. (d) and (e)) and prior to the release of a negative declaration, mitigated negative declaration or environmental impact report. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.1(b)).
  - a. For purposes of AB 52, "consultation shall have the same meaning as provided in Gov. Code § 65352.4 (SB 18). (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.1 (b)).
- 3. <u>Mandatory Topics of Consultation If Requested by a Tribe</u>: The following topics of consultation, if a tribe requests to discuss them, are mandatory topics of consultation:
  - a. Alternatives to the project.
  - b. Recommended mitigation measures.
  - c. Significant effects. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.2 (a)).
- 4. Discretionary Topics of Consultation: The following topics are discretionary topics of consultation:
  - a. Type of environmental review necessary.
  - b. Significance of the tribal cultural resources.
  - c. Significance of the project's impacts on tribal cultural resources.
  - **d.** If necessary, project alternatives or appropriate measures for preservation or mitigation that the tribe may recommend to the lead agency. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.2 (a)).
- 5. Confidentiality of Information Submitted by a Tribe During the Environmental Review Process: With some exceptions, any information, including but not limited to, the location, description, and use of tribal cultural resources submitted by a California Native American tribe during the environmental review process shall not be included in the environmental document or otherwise disclosed by the lead agency or any other public agency to the public, consistent with Government Code sections 6254 (r) and 6254.10. Any information submitted by a California Native American tribe during the consultation or environmental review process shall be published in a confidential appendix to the environmental document unless the tribe that provided the information consents, in writing, to the disclosure of some or all of the information to the public. (Pub. Resources Code § 21082.3 (c)(1)).
- 6. <u>Discussion of Impacts to Tribal Cultural Resources in the Environmental Document:</u> If a project may have a significant impact on a tribal cultural resource, the lead agency's environmental document shall discuss both of the following:
  - a. Whether the proposed project has a significant impact on an identified tribal cultural resource.
  - b. Whether feasible alternatives or mitigation measures, including those measures that may be agreed to pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21082.3, subdivision (a), avoid or substantially lessen the impact on the identified tribal cultural resource. (Pub. Resources Code § 21082.3 (b)).

- 7. <u>Conclusion of Consultation</u>: Consultation with a tribe shall be considered concluded when either of the following occurs:
  - a. The parties agree to measures to mitigate or avoid a significant effect, if a significant effect exists, on a tribal cultural resource; or
  - **b.** A party, acting in good faith and after reasonable effort, concludes that mutual agreement cannot be reached. (Pub. Resources Code § 21080.3.2 (b)).
- 8. Recommending Mitigation Measures Agreed Upon in Consultation in the Environmental Document: Any mitigation measures agreed upon in the consultation conducted pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21080.3.2 shall be recommended for inclusion in the environmental document and in an adopted mitigation monitoring and reporting program, if determined to avoid or lessen the impact pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21082.3, subdivision (b), paragraph 2, and shall be fully enforceable. (Pub. Resources Code § 21082.3 (a)).
- 9. Required Consideration of Feasible Mitigation: If mitigation measures recommended by the staff of the lead agency as a result of the consultation process are not included in the environmental document or if there are no agreed upon mitigation measures at the conclusion of consultation, or if consultation does not occur, and if substantial evidence demonstrates that a project will cause a significant effect to a tribal cultural resource, the lead agency shall consider feasible mitigation pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21084.3 (b). (Pub. Resources Code § 21082.3 (e)).
- 10. Examples of Mitigation Measures That, If Feasible, May Be Considered to Avoid or Minimize Significant Adverse Impacts to Tribal Cultural Resources:
  - a. Avoidance and preservation of the resources in place, including, but not limited to:
    - i. Planning and construction to avoid the resources and protect the cultural and natural context.
    - ii. Planning greenspace, parks, or other open space, to incorporate the resources with culturally appropriate protection and management criteria.
  - **b.** Treating the resource with culturally appropriate dignity, taking into account the tribal cultural values and meaning of the resource, including, but not limited to, the following:
    - Protecting the cultural character and integrity of the resource.
    - ii. Protecting the traditional use of the resource.
    - iii. Protecting the confidentiality of the resource.
  - **c.** Permanent conservation easements or other interests in real property, with culturally appropriate management criteria for the purposes of preserving or utilizing the resources or places.
  - d. Protecting the resource. (Pub. Resource Code § 21084.3 (b)).
  - e. Please note that a federally recognized California Native American tribe or a nonfederally recognized California Native American tribe that is on the contact list maintained by the NAHC to protect a California prehistoric, archaeological, cultural, spiritual, or ceremonial place may acquire and hold conservation easements if the conservation easement is voluntarily conveyed. (Civ. Code § 815.3 (c)).
  - f. Please note that it is the policy of the state that Native American remains and associated grave artifacts shall be repatriated. (Pub. Resources Code § 5097.991).
- 11. Prerequisites for Certifying an Environmental Impact Report or Adopting a Mitigated Negative Declaration or Negative Declaration with a Significant Impact on an Identified Tribal Cultural Resource: An environmental impact report may not be certified, nor may a mitigated negative declaration or a negative declaration be adopted unless one of the following occurs:
  - a. The consultation process between the tribes and the lead agency has occurred as provided in Public Resources Code sections 21080.3.1 and 21080.3.2 and concluded pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21080.3.2.
  - **b.** The tribe that requested consultation failed to provide comments to the lead agency or otherwise failed to engage in the consultation process.
  - c. The lead agency provided notice of the project to the tribe in compliance with Public Resources Code section 21080.3.1 (d) and the tribe failed to request consultation within 30 days. (Pub. Resources Code § 21082.3 (d)).

This process should be documented in the Cultural Resources section of your environmental document.

#### SB 18

SB 18 applies to local governments and requires **local governments** to contact, provide notice to, refer plans to, and consult with tribes prior to the adoption or amendment of a general plan or a specific plan, or the designation of open space. (Gov. Code § 65352.3). Local governments should consult the Governor's Office of Planning and Research's "Tribal Consultation Guidelines," which can be found online at: https://www.opr.ca.gov/docs/09\_14\_05\_Updated\_Guidelines\_922.pdf

#### Some of SB 18's provisions include:

- 1. <u>Tribal Consultation</u>: If a local government considers a proposal to adopt or amend a general plan or a specific plan, or to designate open space it is required to contact the appropriate tribes identified by the NAHC by requesting a "Tribal Consultation List." If a tribe, once contacted, requests consultation the local government must consult with the tribe on the plan proposal. A tribe has 90 days from the date of receipt of notification to request consultation unless a shorter timeframe has been agreed to by the tribe. (Gov. Code § 65352.3 (a)(2)).
- 2. No Statutory Time Limit on SB 18 Tribal Consultation. There is no statutory time limit on SB 18 tribal consultation.
- 3. Confidentiality: Consistent with the guidelines developed and adopted by the Office of Planning and Research pursuant to Gov. Code section 65040.2, the city or county shall protect the confidentiality of the information concerning the specific identity, location, character, and use of places, features and objects described in Public Resources Code sections 5097.9 and 5097.993 that are within the city's or county's jurisdiction. (Gov. Code § 65352.3 (b)).
- 4. Conclusion of SB 18 Tribal Consultation: Consultation should be concluded at the point in which:
  - a. The parties to the consultation come to a mutual agreement concerning the appropriate measures for preservation or mitigation; or
  - b. Either the local government or the tribe, acting in good faith and after reasonable effort, concludes that mutual agreement cannot be reached concerning the appropriate measures of preservation or mitigation. (Tribal Consultation Guidelines, Governor's Office of Planning and Research (2005) at p. 18).

Agencies should be aware that neither AB 52 nor SB 18 precludes agencies from initiating tribal consultation with tribes that are traditionally and culturally affiliated with their jurisdictions before the timeframes provided in AB 52 and SB 18. For that reason, we urge you to continue to request Native American Tribal Contact Lists and "Sacred Lands File" searches from the NAHC. The request forms can be found online at: http://nahc.ca.gov/resources/forms/

#### NAHC Recommendations for Cultural Resources Assessments

To adequately assess the existence and significance of tribal cultural resources and plan for avoidance, preservation in place, or barring both, mitigation of project-related impacts to tribal cultural resources, the NAHC recommends the following actions:

- 1. Contact the appropriate regional California Historical Research Information System (CHRIS) Center (http://ohp.parks.ca.gov/?page\_id=1068) for an archaeological records search. The records search will determine:
  - a. If part or all of the APE has been previously surveyed for cultural resources.
  - b. If any known cultural resources have been already been recorded on or adjacent to the APE.
  - c. If the probability is low, moderate, or high that cultural resources are located in the APE.
  - d. If a survey is required to determine whether previously unrecorded cultural resources are present.
- 2. If an archaeological inventory survey is required, the final stage is the preparation of a professional report detailing the findings and recommendations of the records search and field survey.
  - a. The final report containing site forms, site significance, and mitigation measures should be submitted immediately to the planning department. All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum and not be made available for public disclosure.

**b.** The final written report should be submitted within 3 months after work has been completed to the appropriate regional CHRIS center.

#### 3. Contact the NAHC for:

- a. A Sacred Lands File search. Remember that tribes do not always record their sacred sites in the Sacred Lands File, nor are they required to do so. A Sacred Lands File search is not a substitute for consultation with tribes that are traditionally and culturally affiliated with the geographic area of the project's APE.
- **b.** A Native American Tribal Consultation List of appropriate tribes for consultation concerning the project site and to assist in planning for avoidance, preservation in place, or, failing both, mitigation measures.
- **4.** Remember that the lack of surface evidence of archaeological resources (including tribal cultural resources) does not preclude their subsurface existence.
  - a. Lead agencies should include in their mitigation and monitoring reporting program plan provisions for the identification and evaluation of inadvertently discovered archaeological resources per Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, section 15064.5(f) (CEQA Guidelines section 15064.5(f)). In areas of identified archaeological sensitivity, a certified archaeologist and a culturally affiliated Native American with knowledge of cultural resources should monitor all ground-disturbing activities.
  - **b.** Lead agencies should include in their mitigation and monitoring reporting program plans provisions for the disposition of recovered cultural items that are not burial associated in consultation with culturally affiliated Native Americans.
  - c. Lead agencies should include in their mitigation and monitoring reporting program plans provisions for the treatment and disposition of inadvertently discovered Native American human remains. Health and Safety Code section 7050.5, Public Resources Code section 5097.98, and Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, section 15064.5, subdivisions (d) and (e) (CEQA Guidelines section 15064.5, subds. (d) and (e)) address the processes to be followed in the event of an inadvertent discovery of any Native American human remains and associated grave goods in a location other than a dedicated cemetery.

The future Tecolote light rail station on the San Diego Trolley's Mid-Coast extension is located only a quarter of a mile from the entrance to the Fiesta Island causeway. However, a circuitous pedestrian path is required between the two, due to Interstate 5 and the heavy rail tracks.

For purposes of the Environmental Impact Report, MTS recommends consideration of how access to Fiesta Island via public transit could be improved; specifically, better connecting Mission Bay Park and Fiesta Island with the future Trolley service on the east side of Interstate 5. This might include improving the path-of-travel along the Tecolote Road/Sea World Drive bridge, or a new pedestrian overpass or underpass.

A convenient pedestrian connection to the Trolley would alleviate traffic congestion and parking demand on busy weekends and during special events, reduce the need for off-site event parking and shuttles, provide better coastal access to disadvantaged populations, and help maximize the return on the regional \$2 billion Mid-Coast transportation infrastructure investment.

MTS would be happy to assist the City in evaluating and planning any such improvements.

Hi,

I am writing to explain why I believe we should both not develop Fiesta Island, and why we should also preserve the large, fenced-in, off-leash dog training area that exists there. My concerns are these:

- What is the source of funding for the construction and long-term maintenance of the project?
- How would the <u>inevitable increase in traffic</u> on and off the island be handled/mitigated? How would <u>different use areas be segregated</u>?
- What would be the \*effective\* reduction in leash free area? Not the calculated loss in area, but how much would still be usable by current users.

I'll admit that some of the changes proposed look enticing at first glance, for example the public restrooms with dog wash, but the more you look at it and think about it, the more obvious it becomes that the changes should be made somewhere else

ECONOMICS: Without funds for maintenance, there will be no; upkeep of the proposed bridges, tunnels and fencing, no salary for the proposed lifeguard, no "native vegetation" area, no "parkland with turf", no effective bio-swale constructs protecting water quality, etc. And anyone with a dog will tell you that maintaining "native vegetation" or fancy "turf" in a dog park is not only expensive, but impossible. I do not believe income from the changes could possibly offset the cost of maintaining them. As shown, the plan is fiscally irresponsible.

USABILITY: The bridges over, tunnels under, roads through, fences everywhere suggest that we are trying to co-locate things that don't play nicely together. While it is obvious that a lot of thought has been put into the logistics of making the area more useable by a wider variety of San Diegans, the result is still a nightmare from a usability standpoint. I have, at times, had to wait 20-30 minutes to get off the island, or had it take 20 minutes to get around it to where the dog park is.

AFFECT ON CURRENT USERS: <u>The dogs that \*need\* Fiesta Island</u> are <u>dogs</u> <u>that run fast and play hard</u>. They bark at boats. They knock over small children. They splash without regard to, well, pretty much anything. Some of them startle at skate boards, bicycles and the like. Many, if not most, of these dogs would have

to avoid areas now being shared, not only with Least Terns, but now with swimmers, boaters and, presumably, bikers, roller blade skaters, small children, etc.? Also, these dogs need space and when you pile more of them into a smaller space, you risk having more "incidents". What is proposed is a compromise, but one where both sides lose. Everyone would always be a little bit unhappy. The modifications would never live up to the hype. In exchange, the current users will have lost, not the calculated 6.5% of their area, but more like 50% of their area.

On a personal note, **Fiesta Island's \*large\* off-leash area has directly reduced stress and improved physical fitness in our family**. Please don't change it. As I'm sure you know, having a pet and exercising are two things known to make people happier, but the transition in our family since we rescued "Indi" and began taking her to Fiesta Island has been significant. We discovered first-hand that our entire family is happier if our dog gets to run and play with other dogs, not in a tiny neighborhood dog park where we sit on a bench and play with our respective cell phones, but at Fiesta Island, where we can talk to each other while she zooms around showing us how to make friends with total strangers.

The City's public notice states, "The intent of the options is to develop a plan that respects long-term existing uses on the island, reduces environmental impacts, reduces the acreage of developed parkland thereby reducing water use, and is economically feasible to implement."

**Option B, retaining the dog park, clearly fulfills this promise.** I have been taking my dog to Fiesta Island minimally 5 mornings a week for the last 4.5 years, which clearly fits the "long term existing uses of the island" category. The island is a community, I know many of the people that walk daily at the same time as me. And many of the people have been taking their dogs to the Fiesta Island fenced dog park even longer than me (5+ years!).

Building a road through the island and further development of the land will cost the city a large sum of money in addition to reducing access for pet owners. Moreover, construction and development of the Fiesta Island fenced dog park will generate large amounts of noise, trash, and fumes very near the protected least tern nesting areas.

As a renter in a city with premium real estate, I do not have a yard and need somewhere large to exercise my dog offleash.
