District Five Business Profile: The Cork & Craft

Tucked away in a Rancho Bernardo business park, The Cork & Craft is San Diego's only restaurant, winery and brewery all in one. Established in 2013, the owners started out with their first love: wine and Abnormal Wine Co. was born. In 2014, The Cork & Craft was built, adding a gourmet casual menu to the

already existing wine tasting room where everything is made in house. Then, one year ago, the owners launched Abnormal Beer Co.

Recently, they announced a \$1 million expansion investment in 2016 to fulfill growing demand by expanding the brewing facility and creating a private event space. The current fermentation capacity will grow from 80 barrels to 440 barrels, increasing production by 550 percent. The expansion will add 2,000 sq. ft. on to the existing 5,000 sq. ft. building.

Local Software Development Industry Growing



San Diego's tech industry is thriving. A new study from the San Diego Regional Economic Development Corporation shows San Diego's software development industry ranks No. 7 in the nation, ahead of Austin, Los Angeles and New York City. The study also showed that the industry impacts more than 100,000 jobs in the regional economy. With employers anticipating 18.1 percent growth rate in software jobs over the next year, software is one of San Diego's most rapidly growing employment sectors.



Two Major District 5 Streets Repaved

As the City continues to work toward its goal of repairing 300 miles of streets this fiscal year, San Diego's Fifth District saw two major streets repaved. Sabre Springs Parkway and West Bernardo Drive both received complete asphalt overlay in the past few weeks. The Mayor has laid out a plan to repave 1,000 over five years. I know these two streets both were in need since they had

below average street assessment ratings and hadn't seen major repairs in many years.

Since I took office, we've pushed for the repair of our major thoroughfares and have succeed in repairing Camino del Norte, Pomerado Road, Scripps Ranch Blvd. and Rancho Bernardo Road, among others. I know there are many more in need of repairs as well and I will continue to work with our Streets Division to ensure that roads in poor condition get attention.



The City's pothole crew is expected to be in District Five again on April 20 and May 5. Please use the Street Division online request

system at <u>apps.sandiego.gov/streetdiv/</u> to report potholes in your neighborhood so they can be repaired. You can also report potholes to my office at <u>markkersey@sandiego.gov</u> and we will send the information to the Street Division for attention.

Primary Election—June 7

It will finally come on Tuesday, June 7 when the Primary election finally takes place. But the presidential candidates aren't the only ones on the ballot. There will be a number of local propositions and candidates on the ballot as well.



- Propositions A-G: City Charter Amendments
- Proposition H: Charter Amendment: Infrastructure Fund
- Proposition I: Earned Sick Leave and Minimum Wage
- Elections will also take place for the odd number Council Districts, Mayor and City Attorney.
