Class Information

The American Red Cross Basic Lifeguarding Instructor course is meant to train instructors to teach the basic-level American Red Cross Lifeguarding Course. This class will also include a Title 22 First Aid for Public Safety Personnel (FAPSP) orientation. This class requires pre-course and at-home preparation assignments. Candidates must meet all prerequisites, successfully demonstrate instructor-level skill competency, participate in all classes and activities and pass a final written exam with a score of 80% or better. Upon successful completion of this course, candidates will receive the American Red Cross Lifeguarding Instructor Certification which is good for 2 years. **Please contact the Instructor Trainer, David Fullen to receive more information: (619) 235 – 1143 or dfullen@sandiego.gov**
