COUNCIL VOTES FOR SINGLE USE PLASTIC BAG REDUCTION

The San Diego City Council approved a reduction on single-use plastic shopping bags. San Diego is the 150th municipality in the state of California to pass such a law. The vote was 6-3 with Councilmember Zapf supporting the ordinance. The ordinance will take affect this fall and includes a 6 month grace period for grocery stores and pharmacies, which will not begin charging for bags until March 2017. Other retailers, such as convenience stores and small markets, will have a one year grace period to implement the ordinance.

Many community groups attended and supported the proposal including speakers from Surfrider Foundation San Diego Chapter, Coastkeepers, San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce and the California Grocers Association.

BAY PARK COMMUNITY SIGNS INSTALLED



Last year, Bay Park resident Dave Potter decided it was time for the community of **Bay Park** to have entry signs. Although, the area is part of the Clairemont Mesa community planning area, Bay Park has maintained a separate identity for the last sixty-three years.

Petitions in support of signs at the southern boundary were circulated and the Clairemont Community Planning Group supported the request. On July 29th the community unveiled the first Bay Park entry sign on Morena Boulevard north of Tecolote Road.


