# Botanical Building Naming Opportunities and Donor Acknowledgement Workshop





**Proposed Donor Acknowledgement Elements** Pavers (574 to 714) Benches (33) Interior water features (2) Pergola Statues (2) Reconstructed Urns and Pedestals (6) Drinking Fountain (1) Interior Planters (12) Promenade Pathway Pavers (5)





### Pavers on reconstructed pergola ground plane

- 720 Sq. ft. of pavers to be a blend of 4 sizes to create a more natural and random appearance of paver stones.
- Donor names on approx. 30%-40% of pavers
- Lettering approx. 1"in height
- Approx. 400-540 donor acknowledgement pavers at this location.









### **Central Rotunda Pavers**









#### Donor Pavers in Central Rotundra ground plane

- Donor acknowledgement pavers located around the perimeter of the concrete pavement.
- 100% of pavers engraved
- Rectangular Pavers and made from natural stone with lettering engraved approx. 1" in height.
- Approx. 174 pavers at this location approx. 8"x 24" in size



### Benches

- Bench donor acknowledgement would be engraved into the vertical face of each bench with letters approx. 1" to 1-1/2"
- Potentially up to 33 benches
- Located in the West Garden, East Garden and around the Lily Pond.
- An additional six benches located inside the Botanical Building.







#### Water Feature

- Donor acknowledgement to be in the form of engraved lettering with a height of 2"-3"
- Lettering would be located on the front face of the water basin of each fountain.







### Water Feature

- Donor acknowledgement to be in the form of engraved lettering with a height of 2"-3"
- Lettering would be located on the front face of the water basin of each fountain.











### Pergola Statues

- Donor acknowledgement in the form of approx. 15" x 10" cast plaster plaque with engraved lettering approx. 1" in height.
- There would be donor acknowledgement on each of the two pedestals.









### **Reconstructed Urns**

- Donor acknowledgement would be in the form of approx. 20" x 12"cast plaster plaque with engraved lettering approx. 1" in height.
- There would be donor acknowledgement on each of the urn pedestals.







### **Drinking Fountain**

- In the form of a bronze plaque set flush within the paving adjacent to the drinking fountain.
- •Lettering approx. ¼" inch to ¾" high and the plaque would be approximately 7" x 5" high.









### **Interior Planting Beds**

- Donor acknowledgement would be in the form of a small bronze plaque set within the cap, or top, of the planter walls.
- Lettering would be approx. 1" high and the plaque would be approx. 24" x 6"
- The plaque would be flush with the wall cap. These plaques would be approx. 12 locations within the Botanical Building.

 Naming recognition would be in the form of brass or bronze letters set flush in the pavement band between the two central columns.

 Lettering would be approximately 3"-5" in height.

 Naming recognition would be in the form of a bronze plaque placed on the wall on the north exterio of the building

The plaque will be approximately 24" x 12" with lettering approx. 1" in height.

- Central Rotunda Naming recognition would be in the form of brass or bronze letters set flush in the pavement.
- Lettering would be approximately 4" to 5" inches in height.

 Naming recognition would be in the form of a bronze plaque placed on the wall inside the lobby

 The plaque will be approximately 16" x 9" with lettering approximately <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"-1" height.

- Naming recognition would be in the form of a bronze plaque placed on the wall inside each room
- The plaque will be approx.
  16" x 9" with lettering approx. <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" - 1" in height



#### West & East Wing Gardens Naming



#### West & East Wing Gardens Naming





- Naming recognition would be in the form of brass or bronze letters set flush in the pavement
- Located at the base of the main central planter in each wing.
- Lettering would be approximately 3" to 4" in height.
- Naming would occur in two locations, one for each wing.



#### West Patio Naming



### West Patio Naming





- Naming recognition would be in the form of brass or bronze letters set flush in the pavement at the threshold of the doors on the west end of the Botanical Building.
- Lettering would be approximately 3" to 4" in height.

## **Reconstructed Historic Pergola Naming**

T FRONT VIEW

- Naming recognition would be in the form of a cast plaster plaque with engraved lettering approx. 1"-2" in height.
- Option 2 would be a bronze plaque
- The plaque would be approximately 28 inches wide and 10 inches high.
- The plaque would be located on the column of the pergola.







#### Western & Eastern Plazas Naming



### Western & Eastern Plazas Naming







- Two options for naming recognition in these spaces
- One option is for placement of brass or bronze lettering set flush with the new paving
- Lettering would be approx. 3"- 4" in height
- The second option would be in the form of a cast plaster plaque to be located on one of the existing planter urn pedestals located closest to the Plaza.
- The plaque would be approx. 20" x 12" with lettering ¾"- 1" in height



#### Western & Eastern Gardens Naming



## Western & Eastern Gardens Naming





- Naming recognition would be in the form of a bronze plaque set in a decorative natural boulder or engraving directly into the boulder and placed in the planter beds
- The plaque would be approximately 16" x 9" with lettering approx. 1"in height

- November 2020 -- Naming Opportunities Policy Presented to Historical Resources Board Design Assistance Subcommittee
- November & December 2020 Balboa Park Committee workshop
- January 2021 Balboa Park Committee Action Item
- January 2021 Naming Opportunities Policy Presented to Park and Recreation Board - Action Item
- February 2021 Naming Opportunities Policy Presented to City Council Committee
- March 2021 Naming Opportunities Policy Presented to City Council
