Kate O. Sessions wrote in *California Garden*:

I dug from the field five small palms . . . and brought them to San Diego Later a few thousand seeds were planted.

In 1914, 325 were planted in Balboa Park . . . just outside of the Rose Garden The Park bought 175, and I donated 150.

This group was planted in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Brandegee
