### Crime-free Multi-Housing Program

The Crime-free Multi-housing Program is a state-of-the-art, crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs and gangs on apartment communities.

The International Crime-free Multihousing Program has spread to nearly 2,000 cities in 44 U.S. states and in Puerto Rico, five Canadian Provinces, Mexico, England, Finland, Japan, Malaysia, Nigeria, and Afghanistan.

The Program uses a three-phase approach to crime prevention designed for apartment communities.

<u>Phase I</u>: Management Training—can include security and maintenance staff.

<u>Phase II</u>: Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) Inspection.

<u>Phase III</u>: Property Certification and Resident Engagement.
