V. Law enforcement, elected officials, business district, SDSU

A. Steffen, SDPD.

- 1. March statistics: Crimes: 0 violent, 26 property, 23 moving violations, 16 arrests
  - 11 first response notices, 1 new house CAPPed, 2 nuisance noise citations.
- 2. College Area Party detail (formerly C squad)
  - a. Sergeant position for C Squad is currently unbudgeted. We won't request funds for the position until 2022 budget.
  - b. We have begun to set up a system for dealing with College Area noise. Monthly, 4 officers & a sergeant will work overtime on this.
- B. Link, SDSUPD. SDSU is involved in drug take back program.
- C. Rosas, for Council member Elo-Rivera: Budget process is under way. Get-it-done has been updated & works better.
- D. Gris, for Assembly Member Ward: Reported committee assignments & state-wide legislation.
- E. Schneider, Business District. We have an open position, & are planning future activities.
- F. Sepulveda, Associated Students: ARC is open at 25% capacity; we are planning for fall.
- G. Gregg, SDSU: Fall classes will be in person with virtual option. Covid tests & vaccinations are available on campus.

## VI. New Business

- A. SDSU Restorative Justice Program: Adam Adams & Derek Brendel
  - 1. Program seeks to strengthen relations between campus & community, in large part by addressing SDSU students' violations in the community in non-punitive manner. It will operate year around, providing services specific to request. Services include:
    - Patrols Thursday Sunday nights & high impact times, looking for & reporting violations.
    - Educational & training programs aimed at preventing disruptive behaviors
    - Restorative Justice programs, mediation services.
  - 2. Implementation
    - Program is based on collaboration with multiple campus units and community groups
    - Weekend patrols are in service now. Other elements will be introduced summer & fall 2021.

- C. City's Election protocol for next 5 months: Jennings.
  - 1. Governor says we can meet in person beginning June 15. We can have an election after that.
  - 2. We might have virtual option when meeting in person, outreach committee can decide.
- D. Discussion of Accessory & Junior Dwelling Units (ADU & JDU)
  - 1. PDF of basic ADU, JADU information for San Diego (4-2021) is found at:

- 2. Main points
  - ADU can be attached or separate, JADU must be contained within existing house
  - Both ADU & JADU are permitted on single family lot in addition to main dwelling unit.
  - JADU:Owner must live in it or primary house. ADU: owner not required to live on property.
- 3. Problems with ADU permits: *Hoeger*

DSD has been questioned on 5 permits representing 2 kinds of problems; 2 permits are on hold, 1 from each scenario, the remaining 3 permits are being checked for same issues.

• Properties with a separate ADU either in process or already completed & a second or combined permit to convert the garage to rooms (not as ADU or a JADU) with no

replacement parking on the plans as required by Code.

This permit has tier 1 hold: *Proposed garage conversion of SDU*. *Replacement parking provided within setback on (e) driveway*. Must submit plan to provide garage parking.

• Properties with a separate ADU either in process or completed & a second or combined permit to convert the garage to a JADU with intention of the owner of the property living in the main house or the JADU as required by Code

This permit has a hold requiring a plan change: *Combination building permit for garage conversion to junior unit and a 2-story companion unit to an existing SD*.
