DISTRICT 2 ROAD REPAIRS



Road repairs in District 2 started last week, on September 20, 2023. Residents will notice a new slurry seal on nearly 25 streets in Clairemont, Bay Ho, and Point Loma. The slurry will extend the life of streets and make roads safer. The latest slurry project is expected to be completed, weather permitting, over the next three weeks. WATER RATE INCREASE



My council colleagues and I approved a water rate increase to continue to provide safe, reliable drinking water to San Diegans. The rate increase is due to the increased amount the City of San Diego's Public Utilities Department (PUD) must pay the San Diego Water Authority (SDWA). SDWA's prices have gone up due to the increasing cost of imported water, and those costs are passed down to us. Due to COVID-19 and inflation in the past three years, the PUD held off increasing rates to our customers, and now we must pay. This is why we have the Pure Water SD Projects, so we can get at least half of our water locally in the future. Putting off the raise would mean stopping repairs and stopping the replacement of our old infrastructure for drinking water. For more information, follow the link: **PUD**
