FY2024 BUDGET REVIEW HEARINGS

The City of San Diego's FY2024 Budget Review process kicked off on May 3, 2023, and go through May 10, 2023. Mayor Todd Gloria's Proposed FY24 Budget asks for more funding to support the City's core services, like homelessness programs, pedestrian safety, street paving, and climate action goals.

NEW STREETLIGHTS REPORT

City of San Diego Transportation crews have repaired 679 streetlights in District 2. The newly released "Streetlights Repair Report 2022" shows repairs by neighborhood and what the City is doing to improve response times to repair requests. The City is already working to improve the service response time by restructuring electrical maintenance crews by region, creating safety priority scores, has hired the 18 budgeted electricians needed, reducing the streetlight repair backlog as quickly as possible, and increasing salaries to recruit and retain qualified personnel. City staff maintains more than 65,000 streetlights. Currently, there are 5,390 streetlights that need repairs citywide. I want to thank Mayor Todd Gloria, the City's Homelessness Strategies and Solutions team, and the Jewish Family Services of San Diego for their constant work in coordinating the Safe Parking Lot program.

My staff and I toured the Pure Water San Diego facility in Miramar and learned how it will provide high-quality purified drinking water to San Diego residents. The Pure Water Program will use proven water purification technology to clean recycled water to produce safe, high-quality drinking water. When completed, Phases 1 and 2 will provide up to 80 million gallons of water per day for San Diegans. As the planet warms, San Diegans need a reliable water source, and Pure Water San Diego will offer that when it's completed in 2035.
