A Reason To Survive	\$ 5,000	ARTS, in collaboration with The Front Arte & Cultura (Casa Familiar), will engage youth from San Ysidro Middle and High Schools in a project called "Making Our Mark: Trans-Border Stories for Rebuilding Community". Through workshops and design charrettes (free), participating artists, educators, and youth will engage community members, civic leaders, and cross-border collaborators to realize a mural and temporary gathering place / exhibition space at a site along San Ysidro's Cultural Corridor.
Adams Avenue Business Association	\$ 18,956	The Annual Adams Avenue Street Fair (AASF) is San Diego's largest FREE music festival & street fair, scheduled on September 24th & 25th 2022. The celebration is held on seven blocks of Adams Avenue and on Adams Ave Park in the community of Normal Heights. The AASF features 100 bands performing on 7 stages, 300 vendors, beer gardens & beer tasting, festival food and giant carnival rides. 10 am-10 pm on Saturday, 9-24-22 & 10 am-6 pm on Sunday, 9-25-22. Armed Services YMCA - San Diego Branch	\$ 115,636	The Port of San Diego Big Bay Boom July 4th Fireworks show is a Tidelands Signature Event that requires extraordinary pyrotechnics choreographed with adapted musical selections on TV and radio on up to four barges across North San Diego Bay. This event is free to the public with an expected 500,000 viewers around the bay in the parks, boats, hotels, restaurants, and homes. It can be viewed live on Fox5SD and KTLA (Los Angeles) television.
Asian Culture and Media Alliance	\$ 5,000	Produced by ACMA, the 2nd Annual Asian Pacific Islander Cultural Showcase is a live event scheduled for September 10, 2022 at the Four Points by Sheraton featuring traditional Asian American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander (AANHPI) cultural dance performances. Provided free of charge to the public, the purpose of this event is to promote our community's diverse cultures and heritage, while serving to sow better solidarity, understanding and friendship among all of San Diego's communities.
Asian Story Theater	\$ 5,000	Asian Story Theater will lead a troika of arts producers in the development and production of a new musical play: "NOT WORKING: Essential, Fired, and Forgotten Workers in the time of Covid-19." In partnership with Teatro Mascara Magica and the San Diego Black Ensemble Theatre, company directors will build on relationships with community organizations to identify stories, themes, and interviewees, and rotate hosting a public discussion immediately after each performance.
Bayside Community Center	\$ 5,000	Bayside requests funding for its 90th Anniversary Celebration main event in September 2022 in Little Italy where Bayside was founded in 1932. The event will feature a short documentary video highlighting the history of Bayside and the diverse communities it has served - Little Italy, City Heights, and currently Linda Vista. The event will also include multiple culturally-relevant performances - such as Ballet Folklorico, Taiko drumming, and more - in a 90-minute event.
Best Practice	\$ 5,000	Over the course of a one-year exhibition and event series at its location in Logan Heights, Best Practice will present six 5-week long exhibitions of visual art from regional, national, and international artists. Some of these exhibitions and events will be the work of one artist while others will be group exhibitions presented by guest curators. These free events will be organized to engage with the local community and to collaborate with other culture creators in the immediate region.
Bocón	\$ 12,492	Bocón's first full season of Theatre for Youth including a world-premiere, a musical, a bilingual play and the development of a new work. A 20 week arts residency at Balboa Elementary where teaching artists will implement social justice and social and emotional learning through the arts for grades K-5. Admission to plays will be free Balboa students and accessible prices for all.
Bodhi Tree Concerts	\$ 5,000	Bodhi Tree Concerts presents its fifth annual free music festival, Music en la Calle. In the heart of culturally rich City Heights, local artists representing the wealth of diversity in our city will perform from 12noon to 6:00pm. Local vendors selling their handiwork as well as free arts, crafts and carnival games will add to the festive atmosphere. Music en la Calle embodies the core value on which Bodhi Tree Concerts was founded – creating community and understanding through music.
Boys & Girls Clubs of San Diegoito	\$ 15,698	Boys & Girls Clubs of San Diegoito's Youth Arts Academy will present a year-round music education program to the youth of San Diego which will culminate in a public event to showcase their work. The project will include year round private instrument and composition instruction, small group rock and jazz bands and community outreach performances for area youth. This project will serve over 300 youth and reach nearly 500 audience members through community performances and the culminating event.
Cabrillo National Monument Foundation	\$ 5,000	In Their Eyes, is a free project for middle school aged students that develops (1) structured comic-based lesson plans; (2) connects students to conservation and cultural themes at Cabrillo National Monument; (3) connects students to diverse female scientists; (4) incorporates arts and comics into a poster session display at Cabrillo National Monument where students present conservation action plans to peers and public, and more.
California Lawyers for the Arts	\$ 59,865	CLA will strengthen legal services for the San Diego arts community by increasing outreach to the community, while continuing to provide a robust schedule of free and low-cost educational programs, including monthly workshops and a binational symposium on Art and Law at the Border. We will also implement a new creative workforce development project, "Designing Art Futures," that will provide job training and paid employment within the arts sector for previously incarcerated persons.
CARPA San Diego	\$ 5,000	La Carpa De La Frontera is a site-specific tent-like vaudeville touring show that will be taken into communities in most need of healing from the current pandemic situation. This performances will address issues such as immigration, race, human rights, accessibility, and culture in comedic form using the concept of the old carpa style used in Mexican during the 1930s, 40s, and 50s. We are currently, as a troupe, bringing the project to life.
Casa Familiar	\$ 31,578	A full season of arts + culture programming for San Ysidro + South San Diego, including: 4 major exhibitions, 2 festivals, 6 mos. of "Sidro Saturday" art market events, a 12 mo. podcast season, + our paid young artist education / job training program. All activities are free and aim to engage a wider array of audiences and artists with the goal of providing better access to arts, culture + creativity in our community.
Chicano Park Steering Committee	\$ 5,000	Chicano Park Day is a free cultural event held annually to celebrate the history, art and culture of the park, captured in just under 100 murals in and around this National Historic Landmark. 2022 will mark the 52nd year of the event which draws between 10,000-15,000 people from around the region, and beyond to the Logan Heights neighborhood. This day-long event includes cultural presentations, music, dance, art and food vendors and the largest free low-rider car show on the west coast.
City Heights Community Development Corporation	\$ 5,000	The Characters Sculpture Garden & Workshop Series ("Characters") will provide free art workshops to emerging artists in City Heights, culminating in a public, outdoor exhibit hosted at Tierra Central, an open-air creative community space, on August 27, 2022. Both the workshop series and the outdoor exhibit will be free.

San Diego State University Research Foundation for KPBS	\$ 18,797	One Book, One San Diego is the region's premier community reading program, attracting thousands annually. Festivities run from early Oct- Nov. 2nd and are open to the public. Participation is free with the exception of the craft workshops and fundraising events.
Spirit of the Fourth Inc.	\$ 6,178	This day-long event begins with a Community Fair which includes a Motor Show, a Patriotic Pet Contest, a food court, a Military Ceremony for veterans, kids' games, a quilt show and vendor booths. In the afternoon a parade is held over a 1.25 mile route with over 80 entries including veterans, high school bands, community groups and elected officials. In the evening we have a fireworks show. Total attendance is estimated to be 20,000. All events free except the Motor Show has an entry fee.
