Necessity is the mother of invention, and that saying was brought to life yesterday at the grand opening of Avenida de la Playa's new al fresco dining set-up. Each day through September, from 11 a.m.-10 p.m., La Jolla Shores' main drag (from El Paseo Grande to Calle de la Plata) will be closed to vehicles to create an elegant al fresco dining experience for the community.

I'm grateful to City staff and community activists Phil, Janie and Coco from the La Jolla Shores Association for willing this dream into reality. I was genuinely blown away by how well it came together when I visited on opening night.

Now that al fresco dining is up and running, it's up to us to do our part to help our local restaurant industry. City Council Approves New Concrete Panels On Coast Boulevard

San Diego City Council approved the much-needed replacement of concrete street panels on Coast Blvd. from Prospect St. to Girard Ave., as well as Cave St.

This was the site of last summer's emergency road-stabilization work to fill a subterranean sea cave. The project (No. 651033, Item 334) includes the installation of new ADA-compliant curb ramps, driveways and parking spaces, and a new 24-inch storm drain.

7/22 Rules Committee

The Rules Committee convened this week, voting to advance a proposal for an ordinance establishing a Privacy Advisory Commission. Next, this proposal will go to the City Attorney for legal analysis, then the full City Council.

7/21 City Council

The City Council voted on several items this week. Some key items were:

- Item 330 Consideration of a Proposed Ballot Measure to Amend the City Charter to Establish Ranked Choice Voting in the City of San Diego.
 - The Council voted on whether to place this measure on the November ballot; it was not to vote on the measure itself.
 - This item failed (4-5) and will not be on the November ballot.
 - I voted "Yes" on this item I am disappointed the measure failed to get majority support. Adopting ranked-choice voting would have opened the political field to more candidates and would have further accomplished clean election goals by eliminating taxpayer cost and empowering grass-root candidates.
- Item 335 Amendments to the Land Development Code and the Local Coastal Program to Add Movable Tiny Houses to the Ordinance for Companion Units and Junior Units
 - This item passed.
 - I voted "Yes" on this item.
- Item S501 Consideration of a Proposed Ballot Measure to Exclude the Midway-Pacific Highway Community Plan Area from Coastal Zone Height Limits.
 - The Council voted on whether to place this measure on the November ballot; it was not to vote on the measure itself.
 - This item passed, and will be on the November ballot.
 - I voted "No" on this item

7/20 Executive Order Expands Outdoor Options for San Diego Gyms, Churches and Salons

Mayor Faulconer signed an <u>executive order</u> expanding outdoor options for businesses and places of worship following state restrictions on indoor operations. The Mayor's executive order allows businesses – including gyms, churches, barbershops and nail salons – to expand their operations into private parking lots effective immediately.

In the coming weeks, similar to restaurants, City Council will vote to further expand outdoor options for additional businesses to include sidewalks and on-street parking.

7/20 New County Budget Released Amidst Pandemic and Economic Crises

The County's recommended \$6.4 billion budget for fiscal year 2020-21 was released July 20. The total shows an increase of \$159 million or 2.5% over last year and includes \$100 million to fight the COVID-19 public health crisis.

Also, to address major revenue shortfalls and expenditure needs, the County's budget calls for dipping into the County's reserves and slowing down or stopping non-essential services and projects.

7/22 - Governor Newsom Announces Enhanced State Stockpile, Purchase of 420 Million New Protective Masks

Governor Newsom announced new actions to strengthen the state's response to COVID-19. These new plans include maintaining a stockpile of 100 million N-95 respirators and 200 million surgical masks and securing an additional 120 million N-95 masks and 300 million more surgical masks to distribute to front-line workers through a new bridge contract.

7/17 - Governor Gavin Newsom Lays Out Pandemic Plan for Learning and Safe Schools

Governor Newsom announced his plan for learning and safe schools ahead of the 2020–2021 school year, as the California Department of Public Health issued a framework for when and how schools should reopen for in-person instruction.

The Governor's plan centers on five key areas:

- Safe in-person school based on local health data
- Strong mask requirements for anyone in the school
- Physical distancing requirements & other adaptations
- Regular testing and dedicated contact tracing for outbreaks at schools
- Rigorous distance learning

COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program

Applications for the COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program are now open to low-income residents through August 7.

Through this program, which the City Council passed unanimously on June 30, households earning 60% of SD's median income (\$64,200/year for a family of 4) that were impacted by COVID-19 can qualify to receive up to \$4k in rental support.
