Dear Community Members,

On Monday, March 30 at 5 p.m., I will host a COVID-19 webinar with two experts, Dr. Thomas R. Martin and Dr. Erica Ollmann Saphire, who will demystify the science and explain what we know so far about the novel coronavirus pandemic.

Additionally, yesterday City Council approved a \$6.1M relief package for small businesses. Financial assistance, in the form of grants and loans, will range from \$10,000 to \$20,000 and will be allocated to eligible, qualified small businesses based on the availability of funds, program guidelines, and the submission of all required information and supporting documentation.

To apply, businesses can access the application at <u>https://www.sandiego.gov/SBRF</u>. The application will be available on Friday, March 27, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.. Businesses may only apply once, and after the applicant submits the online form, an Economic Development Department staff member will contact the applicant within 1-3 business days to obtain the required supporting documentation.

Park Bathrooms to Stay Open Despite Park Closures

Per Parks and Recreation, all comfort stations in City parks will remain open regardless of park closures, as a sanitation and safety issue.

City officials said Thursday that they are likely facing budget cuts because the pandemic will cost San Diego an estimated \$109 million in projected revenue through June 30 — the end of the ongoing budget year.

Medi-Cal, CalWORKS, CalFresh, and General Relief Benefits Continue without Interruption

County HHSA also announced that Medi-Cal, CalWORKS, CalFresh, and General Relief benefits will continue for April, May, and June without interruption. This decision will provide some additional stability to the social safety net in this uncertain time. The County will contact recipients at a later date if any information is required for their cases.

Treasurer-tax Collector To Accept Penalty Cancellation Requests In Response To Coronavirus

For those who are directly impacted by the coronavirus and are unable to pay on time, they can file a <u>penalty cancellation request</u>. All such requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis after April 10. This will require documentation of how the taxpayer was impacted by the virus that interfered with their ability to deliver the payment by April 10 (e.g. hospitalization). Requests will be approved as allowed by law.

Senate COVID-19 Stimulus Deal Agreed On

The Senate unanimously approved a \$2 trillion package to provide a jolt to an economy struggling amid the coronavirus pandemic.

Under the bill, single Americans would receive \$1,200, married couples would get \$2,400, and parents would see \$500 for each child under age 17.

The agreed upon framework includes the following:

- \$500 billion in aid for corporations, including the airline industry, cruise industry, and hotels
- \$375 billion in forgivable loans and grants to small businesses and nonprofits
- \$260 billion to expand unemployment insurance
- \$150 billion in grants, PPE, testing supplies, and workforce training for hospitals
- \$150 billion in relief to state and local governments
- Direct cash payments to individual Americans (estimated between \$250-\$500 billion)
