# Parks and Recreation Releases Process for Rescheduling of Special Events

As a result of the COVID-19 virus, many special events have had to cancel or postpone their events that were scheduled in City of San Diego Parks. # 4/26 Proactive Testing to Detect and Contain COVID-19 Identifies Two Positive Individuals at Shelter to Home Operation

As part of a proactive testing effort to detect anyone who may have COVID-19 but do not show symptoms, two individuals were identified Saturday as positive for the virus at the emergency homeless shelter within the San Diego Convention Center. These are the only positive tests to date after more than 660 have been administered to shelter residents, staff and volunteers.
