### Federal News

### President Signs Families First Coronavirus Response Act

President Trump has signed the *Families First Coronavirus Response Act* into law after passing the Senate yesterday in a 90-8 vote. This act provides paid leave, establishes free testing, protects public health workers, and provides important benefits to children and families.

#### ICE Enforcement and Removal Operations to Focus Enforcement on Public Safety

ICE has announced that their Enforcement and Removal Operations division will scale back their enforcement operations and focus enforcement only on public safety and individuals that are subject to detention on criminal bills. They also will not carry out enforcement activities in sensitive locations such as hospitals, clinics, and other healthcare facilities.

#### Tax Payment Deadline Extended, Filing Deadline Still April 15

Individuals can defer their federal income tax payments (including any self-employment tax) for the 2019 tax year from the normal April 15 deadline until July 15.

The IRS has not yet announced that the April 15 deadline for filing your 2019 Form 1040 will be automatically extended without you having to take any action. If you have not already filed your 2019 return, you can get an automatic filing deadline extension, to October 15, by filing IRS Form 4868. Your extension request will be automatically approved, but only if you file Form 4868 on or before April 15.

### State Proposes Extended Tax Filing Deadline of July 15

The State has postponed tax deadlines until July 15. The Franchise Tax Board announced the special tax relief for all California taxpayers due to the coronavirus pandemic. According to the board, they are postponing the filing and payment deadlines until July for all individuals and business entities for:

- 2019 tax returns
- 2019 tax return payments
- 2020 1st and 2nd quarter estimate payments 2
- 020 LLC taxes and fees
- 2020 Non-wage withholding payments

### 3/19 DMV Update

The California Department of Motor Vehicles announced the following actions it is taking to protect the health and safety of our customers and employees during the Coronavirus pandemic:

- Beginning immediately, behind-the-wheel drive tests have been cancelled for the next 30 days.
- Immediately suspending extended office hours and Saturday field office service.
- Appointment-only service for transactions that *require* an in-office visit.

• Requesting California law enforcement to exercise discretion in the enforcement of Driver Licenses and Vehicle Registrations expiring in the next 60 day.

Governor Newsom Requests Federal Assistance to Support CA Efforts to Prepare for COVID-19 Surge Governor Gavin Newsom sent a letter today to Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, Senate Democratic Leader Chuck Schumer, Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi and House Republican Leader Kevin McCarthy requesting additional federal assistance to supplement California's efforts to prepare for a COVID-19 surge.

- Tax Certificate Deferral Program
- Commercial Utility Deferral
- Extension of All Business Permits

Delivery will adhere to the following guidelines

- All drivers and food delivery staff will be wearing masks and gloves and following recommendations by the CDC
- Food delivery staff cannot enter client homes
- Food delivery staff will knock or ring doorbells and wait for clients to answer the door
- Food cannot be left on a doorstep unattended. If no one answers, a notice will be left that a meal delivery was attempted

Seniors without access to a deliverable address are able to go pick-up "to-go" meals at the Gary and Mary West Senior Wellness Center at 1525 4th Ave. 92101. Breakfast pick-up will be Mon-Fri, 7-8 am. Lunch pick-up Mon-Fri, 11-1 pm.

## Stimulus 2020: Privately-Funded Stimulus Program

Stimulus 2020 is a privately-funded stimulus program intended to support America's local businesses. They are curating stimulus packages and offers designed to help American businesses affected by COVID-19.

This program provides \$1,000 in interest-free capital and free access to financial benchmarking software to any local business in America. There are no fees, no interest, no credit check, and funds are made available to businesses in about 24 hours.
