NO DRILLING OFF THE CALIFORNIA COAST



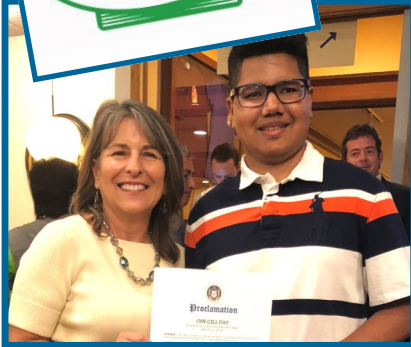
I was honored to be invited by Oceana to attend and represent the Pacific region in the fight against offshore oil drilling with elected officials and business owners from Alaska and the Atlantic seaboard. The San Diego City Council had just passed a resolution to oppose offshore drilling based on environmental, tourism, military and economic concerns. I was able to hand deliver a copy of this resolution to many elected leaders including the Trump Administration.

Oceana arranged meetings with many members of Congress and held a well-attended staff briefing to discuss our concerns. We also had the opportunity to sit down with Dr. Walter Cruickshank who serves as the Acting Director of Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM). I sent a clear message from Californians, that holding one hearing in Sacramento about offshore drilling was not engaging the stakeholders who are most impacted. I asked that the BOEM extend the comment period and hold more stakeholder meetings, especially in Southern California.

Additionally, Ret. Admiral Len Herring also represented the Pacific region and spoke eloquently about the impacts that drilling can have on the training mission of the US Navy and US Marine Corps.
