## A Victory for Councilmember Jennifer Campbell's Short-Term Vacation Ordinance

AFTER HARD NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY, RESIDENTS, AND COMMUNITY LEADERS, THE CITY COUNCIL OFFICIALLY APPROVES THE SHORT TERM RENTAL ORDINANCE

SAN DIEGO – For years, residents and community leaders asked for stronger city regulations on Short Term Vacation Rentals without clear or concrete answers. As a result, the number of vacation rentals had soared in recent years, especially in the beach communities. Councilmember Jennifer Campbell led the efforts to create regulations to cap vacation rentals at 1 percent, adding 16 new city enforcement positions and offering a lottery system for permits. The Ordinance will exclude bad-actor partners and have strong enforcement. Today, the City Council officially approved the Short Term Vacation Ordinance that Councilmember Jennifer Campbell authored.

Councilmember Jen Campbell said: "For years, San Diego residents and community leaders asked the City for help in regulating short-term vacation rentals - and now the City Council has officially approved the ordinance. The new regulations will hold nuisance properties accountable and keep neighborhoods safe and liveable. For over a decade, previous City Councils failed to act, but through honest compromise and putting community first, we've turned the corner on one of San Diego's thorniest challenges."

Highlights of San Diego's new short-term rental law include:

- Capping whole-home, short-term rentals at 1% of housing stock city-wide. This equates to a 47% reduction in whole-home rentals, according to an analysis by the California Coastal Commission.
- Requirement for rental properties to meet a "good neighbor" policy and post mandated contact information on-site.

- Stricter enforcement on nuisance properties by code enforcement officers whose sole focus is to uphold the Short Term Rental Ordinance.
- A city-wide lottery to be held later this year for short-term rental permits.
