The Shared Mobility Device Regulations are Amended and Approved to Secure San Diegan's Safety

THE IMPROVEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS SUPPORT MORE REGULATIONS TO MAINTAIN STREETS AND SIDEWALKS SAFE

SAN DIEGO – The City Council approves the Shared Mobility Device Ordinance amendments today. The SMD Ordinance amendments will manage and enforce rules for new micro-mobility devices on public property and within the public right-of-way.

Councilmember Jennifer Campbell took the lead AND recommended regulations to reduce the number of SMDs in San Diego and approved a fee structure for companies providing Shared Mobility Devices.

Councilmember Jennifer Campbell said: "I'm pleased to hear that since permitting started in July 2019, staff has been analyzing ridership data, collecting resident and operator feedback, enhancing operations based on internal feedback from impacted departments, and enforcing violations to the Ordinance and the Vehicle Code."

Already improvements have been made since 2019 when the City Council passed the ordinance to permit, manage, and enforce the public-right-away. This will help keep San Diego's streets and sidewalks safe for San Diegans.
