RESOLUTION DECLARING SAN DIEGO SAFE CITY FOR REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM

This month, I ioined mγ colleagues spearheading a resolution that declares the City of San Diego A Reproductive Safe City for Freedom. This resolution doubles down on our city's commitment to improving equity as we defend the rights to reproductive freedom or women.

BUDGET REVIEW COMMITTEE & MAY REVISE

As part of the extensive budget review process, the Mayor's office released a May Revise that includes additional wins for Council District Four. Some of these wins are specific items that my office has advocated for, which includes funding for Gompers Prep Academy/47th Street safety enhancements, additional streetlight installation funding, and broadband access expansion. We are excited about these additions and look forward to collaborating for the adopted budget next month. You can view the full May Revise here.

SIDEWALK VENDING PERMIT FEE

In order for the City to begin processing applications and issuing permits in accordance with the newly created Sidewalk Vending Ordinance. On May 17th, City Council voted to establish a sidewalk vending permit fee that would assist in the newly created sidewalk vending ordinance. After bringing the conversation of accessibility and equity to the table, I pushed this fee to an affordable \$38 and reassessed after a period of 1 year. This fee was approved by Council and will go into affect in June 2022.

MAY 24 | CITY COUNCIL

IMPERIAL AVENUE STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

On May 24th, City Council approved the Imperial Avenue Streetscape Project, which would improve the pedestrian infrastructure of the area along Imperial Avenue between Euclid Avenue and 47th Street. This Project will include installation of bus shelters and benches, median fencing at the intersection of Euclid and Imperial avenues, wayfinding signage, and various street furnishings such as trash receptacles, bike racks and lighting at Huffman Plaza.

City of San Diego Cannabis Equity Listening Sessions Make Your Voice Heard!

The City of San Diego's Cannabis Business Division is partnering with the Department of Race and Equity to host eight in-person listening sessions citywide to hear from residents and communities disproportionately affected by the War on Drugs on how to reduce barriers to entry into the regulated cannabis market equitably.

Focusing on residents, communities, organizations and other impacted individuals in communities of concern, community surveys and listening session information will be used to help develop recommendations and policies for a Cannabis Equity Applicant Program to address disparities in the cannabis industry.

account from Adult to Youth. Or pick up a free Youth PRONTO card from the MTS Transit Store, NCTD Customer Service Centers, select community organizations, participating schools, or at special transit center

2. Get Ready

Use Trip Planner and Next Departure in the PRONTO app for real-time information. Or visit sdmts.com and gonctd.com websites to build your route and find the closest transit station.

3. Get Riding

It's time to go! Remember you must tap your card or scan your app every time you ride. Youth must be able to show proof of eligibility while riding such as a school picture ID, governmentissued photo ID with birthdate, or a birth certificate.


