April marks Arts, Culture, and Creativity Month in California. In honor of this month, my office presented the Black Arts and Culture District Resolution to the Economic Development and Intergovernmental Relations (ED&IR) Committee for the first time.

The San Diego Black Arts and Culture District would allow the Imperial Corridor, located in Council District 4, to brand itself as a Black cultural center to honor the hard work and contributions of members of the Black community. This designation would also revitalize a historically disinvested community while advocating for social and economic opportunities, benefiting not just District 4 but also the entire City of San Diego.

On April 13th, the resolution unanimously passed the ED&IR Committee and it will now move forward to full Council.

APR 4 | CITY COUNCIL

NEW INDEPENDENT BUDGET ANALYST (IBA)

On April 4th, City Council voted to select Charles Modica as the new Independent Budget Analyst for the City of San Diego. This decision by the Council follows a robust hiring process, including input from Councilmembers and the public. We congratulate Mr. Modica and look forward to continuing the work with the IBA.

MORATORIUM ON NO-FAULT EVICTIONS

On April 5th, City Council voted to extend the moratorium on no-fault evictions until September 30th. No-fault evictions happen when tenants who are paying rent and obeying the lease are served an eviction notice because the landlord wants to leave the rental market, move into the property or substantially remodel. After many hours of public input, Council passed this extension as an attempt to assist tenants who must find housing during the pandemic recovery.

CREATION OF PRIVACY ADVISORY BOARD

After several years of advocacy from my office, the TRUST SD Coalition, and the community for the improvement of transparency of the City's surveillance technology, Council approved the **creation of a Privacy Advisory Board** earlier this month. As the City purchases, uses and maintains surveillance technology data, **it is imperative that we first protect the civil liberties of our community members.** The Privacy Advisory Board is a small yet necessary step in **bridging the intersection of public safety, surveillance, and transparency.**

FISCAL YEAR 2023 BUDGET

On April 18th, the Mayor **released a proposed budget for the City's Fiscal Year 2023.** Over the next couple weeks, my office will thoroughly review this budget to prepare for City Council Budget Review Committees from May 4th through May 10th, and we invite you to provide your input in this process. STOP ADOLESCENT ADDICTION TO FLAVORED E-CIGARETTES (SAAFE) ACT

Approximately **85% of African Americans** who smoke use menthol cigarettes, and African-American men have the highest death rates from lung cancer when compared to other demographic groups. This alarming fact led to my vote to pass the SAAFE Act ordinance this month. Beginning January 2023, the City of San Diego will no longer permit the sale of flavored tobacco products, including the menthol (mint) flavor. This ordinance does not include shisha (hookah) or cigars. You can read the full ordinance here.


SAFE AND HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

Since day one, my staff and I have continuously advocated for not just equality but true equity in the City's annual budget process. My office has invested in our communities by advocating for change through our important measures, including **the Office of Race and Equity**, which we secured funding for in 2020. Through this office, the City has committed to helping address the **systemic issues that affect the residents who call San Diego home**.

Now, there is an imminent economic recovery in our midst: the use of ARPA funds is mitigating our shortfall from previous years, and sales tax revenue is increasing much quicker than we initially anticipated. The City cannot divert from investing every resource available to achieve the equity we've committed to addressing.

As your Councilmember, my highest priority is to designate resources that align with my Pillars of Governance: **Economic Opportunity for All, Reimagining Public Safety, and Clean, Safe, and Healthy Communities.** It is time for us to invest in projects that will improve our residents' quality of life, including **paved and well-lit sidewalks, updated parks, efficient libraries, and adequate traffic signals.** Read more about my <u>budget priorities in my office's detailed budget memo.</u>

SANDAG has teamed up with MTS, NCTD, and the County of San Diego to connect youth to school, jobs, entertainment, and more!

Starting May 1, anyone aged 18 and under can ride transit for free in San Diego County through the SANDAG Youth Opportunity Pass pilot program.

1. Get PRONTO

Already have a Youth PRONTO card or app on your phone? All rides will automatically be free starting May 1! If you're new to PRONTO vou can:



Download the PRONTO app and register for an account. Then visit sdmts.com/youth-opportunity-pass to convert your account from Adult to Youth.



Or pick up a free Youth PRONTO card from the MTS Transit Store, NCTD Customer Service Centers, select community organizations, participating schools, or at special transit center events during April and May.

2. Get Ready

Use Trip Planner and Next Departure in the PRONTO app for real-time information. Or visit sdmts.com and gonctd.com websites to build your route and find the closest transit station.

3. Get Riding

It's time to go! Remember you must tap your card or scan your app every time you ride. Youth must be able to show proof of eligibility while riding such as a school picture ID, governmentissued photo ID with birthdate, or a birth certificate.

You're all set! We can't wait to see what the Youth Opportunity Pass connects you to next.


