## One-Year Anniversary of Peace Initiative Coincides with Vote on Privacy Advisory Commission

Last year, elected officials, community leaders & organizations joined forces to launch "The Peace Movement: Let's Live, Let's Love" and this work continues in reimagining public safety

SAN DIEGO, CA: Today marks the one-year anniversary of Councilmember Montgomery's launch of *The Peace Movement: Let's Live, Let's Love* campaign aimed at providing a holistic approach to public safety, with short and long-term goals, including policy solutions that promote economic justice and improved community policing relationships.

This seminal anniversary coincides the unanimous vote by the <u>Rules Committee</u> to send the <u>proposed Privacy Advisory Commission Ordinance</u> to full council for consideration.

"Recently, I released my <u>Road Map to Reimagining Policing and Public Safety</u>, which contains key components for accountability and transparency measures. Today's action by the Rules Committee is another monumental step towards achieving the goals of the <u>Let's Live, Let's Love</u> Movement," said Montgomery. "This is especially crucial, as the use of surveillance technology in San Diego has further eroded trust between our communities, city officials, and law enforcement. I am thrilled that my colleagues voted for transparency and look forward to hearing both the Surveillance Ordinance and the Privacy Advisory Commission Ordinance at City Council this fall."
