

## Statement from Councilmember Monica Montgomery Renouncing Violence and Calling for Peace in the Community

SAN DIEGO, CA – San Diego Councilmember Monica Montgomery issues the following statement:

"We have seen an increase in violence, including the death this weekend in our Bay Terraces Community. My office has been in constant contact with the San Diego Police Department. As investigations move forward, I am calling for peace within our community. My desire is for our community to remain safe -every street and every neighborhood. We will continue to work with the Mayor's Office, the San Diego Police Department, and the community to ensure that we have a safe city for all."

"The San Diego Police Department is working diligently with the community to solve the recent homicides and bring those responsible for these tragic deaths to justice. We join Councilmember Montgomery to ask the community for peace as the investigations move forward," added Chief David Nisleit.
