 - a. Projects Committee -
 - C. Jones reported activity and conversation with various planning groups.
 - T. d'Elgin reported on the progress of the 32nd Street Canyon project: still in design phase, \$21k grant received.
 - b. Staff Reports
 - Drew Potocki, Street Division Urban Forester
 - <u>Arbor Day April 26th</u>. Mayor to attend from 9:30 to 10:15am for the Tree City USA award presentation (Arbor Day is one of four requirements for receiving the designation).

Mayor awarded \$10mil for brush management activities.

- <u>SDRFC</u> has a budget to be spent by 6/31. Probably will be donating it to a local nursery that provides street trees.
- <u>Society of Municipal Arborists</u> (international) is holding its next meeting in San Diego. Local forestry issues to be discussed.
- <u>Utility Conversion Program.</u> A 20-minuite video regarding protecting trees during undergrounding is available.



<u>Paradise Hills.</u> Working to protect the 37 Jacarandas planted in honor of Charles Lewis during current sidewalk upgrades.

<u>Serra Mesa Undergrounding Project.</u> 150 residents requested free trees \$25,000 donation received for palm tree replacements at Scripps Cove.

- Michael Marika, Park & Recreation Dept. Arborist
 - The City is working with Palomar College on the restoration of the "historic" redwood benches in the Botanical Building in Balboa Park. Some redwood trees that were removed from Presidio Park will be milled and used by Palomar College on these benches.

The Old Globe eucalyptus is cut down with possibly an English oak to replace.

- Tony Gangitano, Development Services Dept. Senior Planner Contacted Stormwater division regarding funding issue
- c. Presentation by City Attorney's Office Diane Silva-Martinez presented a \$5,000 donation as a result of a criminal settlement. No board action required. Potocki noted that he is working with Daniel Weinberg at the City's Philanthropy division to establish a policy for accepting and accounting for donations.
