#### 1. <u>General Announcements/Discussion</u>

- Paz Gomez, Deputy Chief Operating Officer called the meeting to order.
- Caryn Mcgriff, Deputy Director, Public Works Department thanked Mohsen Maali for his years of facilitating the meetings and introduced Sheryl Cyprian, Associate Management Analyst of Public Works and her team who will be assuming the facilitating responsibilities for CIPRAC.

#### 2. Approve CIPRAC Meeting Minutes of August 25, 2016

#### 3. Draft Revised CIPRAC Governance:

Paz Gomez summarized some of the suggested changes to the CIPRAC Governance. One of the major changes was that the CIPRAC committee meet four times a year with one or two additional meetings for the budget process.

## 4. ESD Energy Efficiency and SDG&E Financing Program:

Darren Greenhalgh, Assistant Deputy Director, Environmental Services, gave a presentation on Energy Efficiency and SDG&E Financing Program. Darren stated that they are in the process of awarding a MACC project for tentative improvements for \$30 million dollars and SDG&E will give a 0% loan up to

\$250 thousand and 1% payback with the saving from the project. Darren expects the RFT to be completed by November/December.

James Nagelvoort, Director, Public Works Department stated this is the 3<sup>rd</sup> time going through the Five-Year Capital Infrastructure Planning Outlook process. Mastaneh Ashrafzadeh, Associate Engineer-Civil, Public Works and Michael Clark, Budget Coordinator, Comptrollers will be working on this project. James stated that they expect to have the report completed by December, 2016.

# 6. Avenida de la Playa Infrastructure Funding:

Abi Palaseyed, Assistant Deputy Director, Public Works Department gave a presentation on the Avenida de la Playa Infrastructure Funding. He stated that they have identified three CIP projects in which funds will be transferred to Avenida de la Playa.

- a. Torrey Pines Road Phase II-\$1 Million
- b. University Mobility Project-\$2 Million
- c. Euclid Ave Interchange Ph. \$2 Million

The timeline for this is listed below:

- a. September transfer funds
- b. July 2017 Re-appropriate funding via FY2018 budget process to the three identified projects
- c. October 2017 funding needed for Construction, Contracts for the three identified projects.
