Gentlemen:

Referring to Document No. 19315, being a message from the mayor in reference to railroad crossings and licensing bowling alleys, etc., I beg to inform you that herewith is handed you an ordinance providing for the licensing of bowling alleys, pool rooms, &c.

I also inform you that I have been requested by the mayor to delay action in reference to railroad crossings, as he understands the railroad companies intend to submit to your Honorable Body a plan for the protection of the public at such railroad crossings as are now considered dangerous, and until then further action on the part of this office is not considered advisable.
