

GENTLEMEN:

I am transmitting herewith the application of Harry M. Koehler, Richard Seatten and Roy E. Lorens, partners, for a municipal license to operate a cabaret to be known as the Schooner Music Hall at 1029 Second Avenue in the City of San Diego.

This application bears the approval of the Building Inspector, the Fire Department, and the Police Department, provided no scenery is used in the presentation of any show. I am advised, however, that this may not be an operation such as is commonly known as a cabaret, but that tickets of admission will be sold. If such is the case, in my judgment a license should be granted under the provisions of Section 101 of Ordinance 2484, which provides that such a place of public entertainment or amusement for which a fee is charged shall pay a license tax of one cent for every ticket sold, as well as the cabaret license.
