San Diego, CA: On May 27, 2016, Councilmember Chris Cate issued a memorandum to the City Auditor requesting a Review of Quality Assurance Operations for Street Repair.

As the City works to meet the Mayor's goal of repairing 1,000 miles of streets in five years, it is critical that the work performed by Streets Division and private contractors meets City standards. The Councilmember called for the Audit Committee to review current City engineering standards, City inspectors operations, sign-off procedures, and quality assurance measures to ensure taxpayer dollars are protected.
