 - 1. Harold Klotz Brought to the public's attention the impact that the new San Diego Department of Development Services, who have adapted a 100% Digital Submittal Policy for new projects. It is a significant reduction in transparency and timely notification for public advisory groups addressing new development in San Diego. Pushed forward by the public health need to limit physical interactions, the city has converted the "Trails at CMR" project to this new process. As a result we are no longer able to view documents and plans in person downtown, and although all documents submitted by the developer are now digital, we are now only provided with the updated Design Guidelines and Complete Plan Set in PDF form. He did not know who selected these to be released. It is imperative that we all focus on understanding the content and implications of the Design Guidelines and the Complete Plan Set. Unless we are able to stop the use of SCR for building and site design approval, the content of these two documents will determine the future of our community. It is equally important that we write to the Planning Department (Jeffrey Peterson about the development, and Michael Prinz about the overall change to the community), the Planning Commission, and to the City Council, so that they know not only that we oppose many aspects of this project, but also why we oppose them. If anyone has ideas for changes that can be implemented, that would

- improve this project, then we should be letting them know what they are. (Copy of Harold Klotz's full commentary are on file).

 - 6. 50 Units; 58 parking spots. Fortress-like. Is this being addressed? Added 2 other renderings of the elevations and submitted to Tony Kempton.
 - 7. Kurt Carlson: Where are people going to park? In reality, probably going to end up with 2 cars per unit. Where would they park? Transit Priority area, so the market will ultimately dictate how the spaces are allocated. Out of 30 units 26 1 bed room 24, 2 bed room.
 - 8. 76 ½ ft. tall including the stairwell. Differing on the different elevations. This meets the zoning that is being proposed.
 - 9. Final reviews being completed, so that an environmental review can be completed.
 - 10. Consensus from community: Parking expectations are unrealistic. Height plans are outside of scope for this area.
