Dear Sirs;

I understand a new anti-noise-law will be passed shortly and I would appreciate calling your attention to the following conditions in this neighborhood.

The Jewett Hotel, which we operate, is across the street from "Paul's Inn".

The patrons of this night club, when leaving, are more or less intoxicated and have no consideration for people who live in this district and have to be at their places of employment in the morning and who have already retired for the night. People drive up in front of the club and honk the horns of their cars to attract the attention of people inside and from 11:00 PM until 2:30 and 3:30 AM it is a continual honking of horns, yelling, screaming, racing of motors and other disturbances to numerous to mention.

Practically every night we are forced to call "Paul's Inn" and ask them to close the doors of the club as the noise of the orchestra, entertainers and etc sounds like a carnival booming in the windows.

It is almost impossible for us to keep guests on the 4th St., side of this building and I can hardly blame them for moving, as I personally have a room on that side and am continually kept awake by these unnecessary noises.

This condition is a detriment, not only to us but to San Diego at large and this neighborhood is not the only one who has this disturbing element to combat.

Surely something can be done about this deplorable condition.

I have been in the hotel and apartment business in San Diego for over twenty five years and never before have I had such a condition to contend with and one that is such a detriment to business.
