Your communication addressed to the City Council, regarding noise and disturbances enancting from the Morena Club on Porces Street, his been referred to this office.

We have had the Police Department investigate this establishment, and now have a report from the Chief of Police advising that the department has never received any calls or complaints of this nature from residents in the vicinity of the Morene Club, nor has it ever had to make an arrest, or take action of any kind, at the club, although routine checks have frequently been made by the officers patroling the district.

In view of this report action on your complaint would not appear to be indicated at this time. We would like to suggest, however, that, if any disturbances do occur in the future, you or your neighbors immediately contact the Police Department so that the matter can be investigated at the time of the disturbance.

We, the undersigned property owners and residents of the vicinity of Dorcas Street and Morena Boulevard, wish to notify you of a situation in our neighborhood which is objectionable to us and which is likely to become more objectionable unless some steps are taken to halt plans now under consideration.

The Morena Club, a public restaurant with on-sale heer licence, situated at Dorcas Street and Morena Boulevard, is open from approximately noon to 2 a.m., and although it stands on property zoned for business, it adjoins residential area, and is a source of annoyance to us by loud music and boisterous talk and patron's cars coming and going until the early morning hours.

We have recently learned that the owner plans to build an outdoor patio, to enclose a dance floor, and to hire a band to play. This is bound to increase the number of patrons whose cars will intensify the disturbance to our peace and rest, and the outdoor music will be louder than what we have put up with before.

We have tolerated existing conditions for some time, and even though the noise bothers us now, we would not mind if the business remains as it is, and some effort made to restrain the disturbing elements. If the business is permitted to expand by building a dance floor and patio, increased patronage and outdoor music is bound to increase the disturbance, and this we do object to.

We respectfully request that a thorough investigation by your Honorable Body be made before any permits for such expansion be allowed.
