Gentleman:

I wish to advise your council as a citizen and tax payer for 21 years, I feel that it would be a gross injustice to myself and the surrounding community to allow a dance hall anywhere on Main ST. or in the Logan Height Area \_\_\_\_\_ due to the following reasons, transportation, has been a problem in this particular area ever since the war started.

THE 1800 block on Main street is too far away from the people directly that would patronize such an establishment, the Lowell School grounds located directly across the street from this proposed establishment has been been a center of Vibe for the Teen Agers after dark, the grounds are used for everything from a bar to a hotel, and such an interprise in this location would not add to the safety of our community.

Futher, the entire Logan Heights area is made of working people who have to get their rest in the early part of the evening and the people who would patronize such an establishment would ~~be~~ of necessity be forced to walk or drive from their homes to attend these dances and then walk or drive back through the same area after dancing had closed down, which would mean that it would be 2 or 3 o'clock before the community settled down to normal.
