REGULAR MEETING Chamber of th

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Chamber of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, Tuesday, August 20th, 1940.

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

> Present--Councilmen Weggenman, Housh, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Clerk----Fred W. Sick. Absent----Councilmen Simpson, and Fish.

On motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the minutes of the regular meeting of Tuesday, August 13th, 1940, and the minutes of the adjourned special meeting of Thursday, August 15th, 1940, were approved without reading.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing of protests against the proposed paving and otherwise improving of the Alley in Block 27, Resubdivision of Blocks K and L, Teralta, between Orange Avenue and El Cajon Boulevard, under Resolution of Intention No. 71874, the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing appeals from the City Engineer's assessment for paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block F, McFadden and Buxton's North Park, and the Alley in Block 33, Park Villas, between the north line of Dwight Street and the south line of Landis Street, under Resolution of Intention No. 71062, the Clerk reported that no written appeals had been received.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 72052, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, Confirming the City Engineer's assessment No. 1700, covering the paving and otherwise improving of the Alley in Block F, McFadden & Buxton's North Park and the Alley in Block 33, Park Villas, between the north line of Dwight Street and the south line of Landis Street, under Resolution of Intention No. 71062; and authorizing and directing the City Engineer to attach his warrant to said assessment roll and record and issue the same in the manner and form provided by law; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

At this time Councilmen Simpson and Fish entered and took their places on the Council.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing on a proposed ordinance providing for the registration of solicitors, peddlers, hawkers and salesmen; providing a penalty for the violation thereof; and repealing Ordinance No. 605, (New Series), and Section 106 of Ordinance No. 915, (New Series); Communications from the Merchants Association of San Diego and from the Better Business Bureau of San Diego approving the proposed ordinance were presented and ordered filed.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

Mr. O. E. Mark, representing J. R. Watkins Company, objected to paragraph 8 of the proposed ordinance.

Mr. Allen Hitch, owner of J. R. Watkins Company in San Diego, objected to the proposed ordinance.

A Mr. Urquhart, representing three firms, objected to the proposed ordinance. Mr. Charles Gurley, of the Better Business Bureau of San Diego spoke in favor of the adoption of the ordinance.

A Mr. Hunt, of the Real Silk Hosiery Mills, spoke in favor of the ordinance.

Mr. Bruce Watt, President of the Merchants Association of San Diego, spoke in favor of the ordinance.

All interested persons having been heard, ORDINANCE NO. 1911, New Series, recorded in Book 47 of Ordinances, providing for the registration of solicitors, peddlers, hawkers and salesmen; providing for a penalty for the violation thereof; and repealing Ordinance No. 605, (New Series), and Section 106 of Ordinance No. 915, (New Series), was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Simpson, placed on its final passage at its first reading by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Knox, said ordinance was adopted by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.

Petition of Residents for architectural control for a portion of Mission Valley was presented; together with a recommendation from the City Planning Commission that an ordinance be prepared to establish such architectural control.

RESOLUTION NO. 72053, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, authorizing and directing the City Attorney to prepare and submit to the Council an ordinance requiring the Planning Commission to pass upon the exterior design of all new buildings in Mission Valley, as petitioned for under Document No. 319028, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Petition of Residents for zoning a portion of Mission Valley was presented; together with a recommendation from the City Planning Commission that an ordinance be prepared to place a certain area in Zone RLA in Mission Valley.

RESOLUTION NO. 72054, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, authorizing and directing the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance rezoning a portion of Mission Valley

into RLA Zone, as recommended by the City Planning Commission under Document No. 319029, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

Petition of J. E. Dodd for setback suspension on Panorama Drive was presented; together with a recommendation from the City Planning Commission, by a vote of 4 to 3, that the request be granted.

RESOLUTION NO. 72055, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, granting permission to J. E. Dodd, 737 - 18th Street, to erect a residence and garage on Villa Lot 378, Valle Vista Terrace, not closer to the property line on Panorama Drive than eleven feet; and suspending the provisions of Setback Ordinance No. 12321 on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of First Church of Christ Scientist, by Neil Nettleship, for an extension of time to start construction of a Sunday School building on Lot I, Block 278, Horton's Addition, was presented; together with a recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

Communication from Carmen Paularena favoring the paving of the Alley in Block 5, Chester Park, was presented and ordered filed.

Petition of D. M. Denton for permission to grade a portion of Dorcas Street at private contract was presented; together with communication from the City Engineer, approved by the City Manager, recommending that the request be granted. RESOLUTION NO. 72059, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, granting permission

to D. M. Denton, 4570 Pacific Highway, to grade a portion of Dorcas Street by private contract, at his own expense, to the official grade and in accordance with plat prepared by the City Engineer, attached to petition bearing Document No. 322227, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

Communication from F. E. Young favoring the retention of the present Building Code was presented, and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, filed without reading.

Communication from Harry P. Silverberg favoring the retention of the Building Code as it is at present was presented, and on motion of CouncilmanKnox, seconded by Councilman Housh, filed without reading.

Communication from C. F. Stephens favoring the present Building Code, and its' provisions relative to board and batton houses, was presented and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, filed without reading.

Communication from the Ocean Beach Coordinating Council urging the immediate construction of a Fishing Pier was read and on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, referred to the Harbor Commission.

Communication from the South of Broadway property owners' and business men's Association urging the improvement of the bulkhead east of the Ferry Slip was read and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, ordered filed.

Communication from the Funds Commission recommending the acceptance of offers

for certain street improvement bonds was presented and read. RESOLUTION NO. 72060, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, authorizing and directing the interested City departments to accept the amounts shown below for delinquent street improvement bonds held in Mount Hope Cemetery Fund, as recommended by the City Funds Commission under Document No. 322340, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted:

RESOLUTION NO. 72061, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, authorizing and directing the San Diego Consolidated Gas and Electric Company to install one 400 c.p. street light at the intersection of Monroe Avenue and Mission Avenue, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

Communication from the City Manager relative to Pacific Highway Lighting District No. 1, and submitting a Resolution of Intention for lighting the section of Pacific Highway between Harasthy Street and Broadway, was read and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, ordered filed.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 72062, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, for furnishing electric current for Pacific Highway Lighting District Number One for the period ending November 4, 1941, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Communication from the San Diego Unified School District relative to the need of a crosswalk on Chamoune Avenue was read; together with a communication from the City Manager stating that the Department of Public Works will construct a paved crossing on Chamoune Avenue between the Herbert Hoover School grounds and the gymnasium for the School Board, upon receipt of a check for \$100 to cover the cost of same; and on motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, ordered filed; the School officials to be notified of the City Manager's communication.

Communication from the City Manager relative to the Mission Beach Amusement Center lease was read and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, referred to the City Attorney.

Communication from John Burnham Company offering to sell certain land on Kettner Boulevard to the City was read; together with a letter from the City Manager stating that the City has no requirement for the use of this property, and is therefore not interested in the offer; and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Fish, ordered filed.

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Communication from J. W. Lindsay, dealer for Mack Fire Apparatus, relative to specifications for Fire Engines for use in San Diego was referred to the City Manager, without reading, for a report at the next regular meeting, on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Simpson.

Communication from the Hydraulic Engineer, approved by the City Manager. reporting on bids received for the Upas Street Pipeline Extension, was read and on motion ordered filed.

RESOLUTION NO. 72063, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, declaring H. H. Peterson to be the lowest, responsible and reliable bidder; and awarding the contract for construction of the Upas Street Pipeline Extension to said H. H. Peterson, at the prices named in his bid for doing said work; and authorizing a majority of the members of the Council to execute a contract for said work; was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Communication from the City Manager recommending the submission of a bond issue for Water Development at the November 5th, 1940, election was presented by unanimous consent.

A motion was made by Councilman Fish to refer the communication to the City Attorney for drawing the necessary papers to place the proposition on the November 5th ballot; and that the figures as to the amounts for specific projects be eliminated. This motion lost for want of a second.



Chamber of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, Tuesday, September 10th, 1940.

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the Clerk reported that in response to notice inviting bids for paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 8, Subdivision of Lots 20 to 50, Block N, Teralta, between the north line of Polk Avenue and the south line of Orange Avenue, under Resolution of Intention No. 71760, he had received four bids; which bids were on motion, duly and regularly, in open session, opened, examined and publicly declared.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing of protests against the proposed paving and otherwise improving of the Alley in Block 18, Subdivision of Lots 20 to 50, Block N, Teralta, under Resolution of Intention No. 72037, the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received. Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who

desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing appeals from the City Engineer's assessment for paving and otherwise improving Orange Avenue, between 37th Street and 40th Street, under Resolution of Intention No. 71163, the Clerk reported that written appeals had been received from Nellie Harrington and Minnie Davis, which appeals were presented and read.

Whereupon, the Vice-Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

All interested persons having been heard, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, the hearing was continued for one week; and the City Engineer authorized to revise the fronting assessments complained of in the appeal of Nellie Harrington.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing appeals from the City Engineer's assessment for paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 133, University Heights, between Tyler Avenue and Van Buren Avenue; and a portion of Tyler Avenue; under Resolution of Intention No. 71005, the Clerk reported that a writtem appeal had been received from C. C. Crisler and Edna E. Crisler, which appeal was presented and read.

Whereupon, the Vice-Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 72198, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, overruling and denying the appeal of C. C. Crisler and Edna E. Crisler, filed in the office of the City Clerk September 7, 1940, under Document No. 322894, from the City Engineer's Assessment No. 1704, made to cover the costs and expenses of the work done upon the Alley in Block 133, University Heights; and a portion of Tyler Avenue; under Resolution of Intention No. 71005; and overruling and denying all other appeals; confirming and approving the City Engineer's said Assessment No. 1704; and authorizing and directing the City Engineer to attach his warrant thereto and record and issue the same in the manner and form provided by law; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for the continued hearing relative to a proposed ordinance prohibiting trespass upon, and loitering about, certain classes of property, the Vice-Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

All interested persons having been heard, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, the hearing on said ordinance was continued until Tuesday, September 17th, 1940, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Petition of property owners and others for reconsideration of the "No Parking" regulation on 28th Street, between University Avenue and Wightman Street, was presented by unanimous consent.

Mr. Richard Seifert of 2729 University Avenue spoke on behalf of interested property owners.

On motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Fish, the petition was referred to the Traffic Commission for further study; with the recommendation that a public hearing be held relative to the matter of "no parking" regulation on 28th Street, south of University Avenue.

Petition of Lloyd H. Zimmerman for Setback Suspension on First Avenue was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 72199, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, granting permission to Lloyd H. Zimmerman, 4508 - 39th Street, to erect a residence and garage on Lot 17, Block 12, Cleveland Heights, not closer to the property line on First Avenue than nine feet; and suspending the provisions of Setback Ordinance No. 12321 on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Petition of Regular Veterans Assn., by Lloyd P. Olson, soliciting a page advertisement in the United States Fleet Magazine was presented.

Petition of John M. Atchaide for permission to grade a portion of Plum Street at private contract was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Engineer, approved by the City Manager.

RESOLUTION NO. 72201, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, granting permission to John M. Atchaide, 1229 Plum Street, to improve a portion of Plum Street, between Carleton Street and Byron Street, by private contract at his own expense; work to be done in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the City Engineer; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

Petition from residents of University Heights and Normal Heights Districts for improvement of New Jersey and other streets connecting with Sixth Avenue Extension and a connection with Mission Valley Road was presented; together with a report from the Acting City Engineer, approved by the City Manager, stating that the grade would be extremely steep and the entire project would cost a large sum, and that funds are not available at this time for the work; and that it would be almost impossible to get a 24 foot road on this hillside.

Petition of Property Owners for sewers to serve a portion of Alta Vista Suburb, under the provisions of the Improvement Act of 1911, was presented; together with a recommendation from the City Engineer, approved by the City Manager, recommending that proceedings be started for this work.

Mr. Isaac Whittle addressed the Council relative to the traffic situation at this intersection.

On motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, the communication was referred to the City Manager for a report.

Communication from the San Diego Historical Society thanking the Council for making available a location in the Civic Center Building for a placque of Father Horton was presented, and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, ordered filed.

Communication from the San Diego Symphony Orchestra Association thanking the Council for its cooperation during a recent series of orchestra concerts was presented, and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, ordered filed.

Communication from the Ocean Beach Coordinating Council urging the immediate construction of a Fishing Pier in the Sunset Cliffs District was presented; together with a communication from the Harbor Commission stating that plans for such a pier have been submitted to the WPA and approved, on the basis of a pleasure and recreational pier for the citizens of San Diego and vicinity. On motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, the Communication from the Ocean Beach Coordinating Council was ordered filed; and a copy of the Harbor Commission's letter sent to the secretary of this organization.

Communication from Andrew K. Weir relative to a convention of the Four States Highway Assn. to be held in Idaho; and relative to certain past conventions; was read. Councilmen Simpson, Flowers, Knox, Weggenman and Fish spoke relative to the subject matter of this communication. Andrew K. Weir addressed the Council regarding City representatives attending conventions, committee meetings, etc.

On motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, the Communication was ordered filed.

Communication from the Purchasing Agent reporting on the sale at public auction, on September 6, 1940, of the southerly 1/2 of Lot 4, in Block 436 of Old San Diego, for \$675.00 was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Fish, ordered filed.

Communication from the Traffic Commission recommending the revision of the City Traffic Ordinance was presented and read. On motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the communication was referred back to the Traffic Commission; pending receipt of detailed recommendation and report of a traffic expert.

Communication from the San Diego City and County Administration Building and Grounds, by W. E. Roberts, Superintendent, relative to flood lighting the Civic Center Building, was presented and ordered filed.

Supervisor John P. Faddis spoke, explaining the cost involved and the Supervisors attitude relative to additional lighting.

RESOLUTION NO. 72204, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, requesting the Building Control Committee to have the Civic Center building lighted under a modified flood lighting plan suggested by W. E. Roberts, Superintendent of Building and Grounds, on Saturday, September 14th; and a full lighting of the exterior of the Building from September 15th to 19th, inclusive, during the Convention of the League of California Cities, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Communication from the Hydraulic Engineer, approved by the City Manager, recommending certain changes in Hunting and Fishing Regulations at various Municipal Reservoirs, was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, ordered filed.

RESOLUTION NO. 72205, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, regulating hunting and fishing on Upper Otay, Lower Otay, Barrett, Hodges, El Capitan and Moreno Reservoirs was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Communication from the City Manager relative to sending the Chief of Police to the F.B.I. re-training school in Washington, D. C., was presented and read. RESOLUTION NO. 72206, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, authorizing Chief of Police Clifford E. Peterson to attend the Federal Bureau of Investigation re-training

school for National Police Academy graduates, to be held in Washington, D. C., during the week of September 30th to October 5th, 1940, inclusive; and authorizing the necessary expenses in connection with said attendance; was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

Communication from Paul B. Richardson relative to his license to peddle produce, and requesting a refund on same, was presented; together with an opinion from the City Attorney that it is impossible to make such a refund legally, and a recommendation

from the City Manager that the request be denied. RESOLUTION NO. 72207, recorded in Book 63 of Resolutions, denying the petit-ion of Paul B. Richardson, 428 Cuyamaca Avenue, for refund on unused portion of a Produce Peddler's License which was issued in this City on July 12th, 1940; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

For said proposition No. 2 61,912 votes Against said proposition No. 2 16,229 votes Void ballots 5,572

and said proposition has received the vote of two-thirds of all the voters voting thereon at said election.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Housh, the meeting was adjourned.


