

Said bid was from the San Diego Gas and Electric Company and was given Document No. 324691.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Fish, said bid was referred to the City Manager for report and recommendation.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing on the City Engineer's report and estimate of the cost of paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 83, City Heights, between the north line of Dwight Street and the south line of Landis Street, the Clerk reported that a written protest had been received from Albert B. King, which protest was presented and read.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

Mrs. Ada B. Beach, representing Lots 4, 5, and 6 in this block protested orally. Albert B. King protested orally. Mrs. Louisa B. Stoaks made an oral protest, representing the East 45 feet of Lots 1 and 2 in this block.

All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 72758, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, overruling and denying the protest of Albert B. King, filed in the office of the City Clerk on October 3, 1940, under Document No. 323431, the oral protests of Mrs. Ada B. Beach and Mrs. Louisa B. Stoaks, and all other protests against the City Engineer's estimate of the cost for the proposed work of paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 83, City Heights, was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman, Weggenman, adopted.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing of protests against the proposed construction of sewer mains and appurtenances in portions of the Alleys in Blocks J and K, Tract Number Two of Alta Vista Suburb, Franklin Avenue and Ocean View Boulevard; under Resolution of Intention No. 72570; the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. Mrs. Edna Ralph protested orally against the proposed work and improvement.

All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 72759, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, overruling and denying the oral protest of Edna Ralph, against the proposed work of installing sewer mains and appurtenances in portions of the Alleys in Blocks J and K, Tract Number Two of Alta Vista Suburb, Franklin Avenue and Ocean View Boulevard, under Resolution of Intention No. 72570; and overruling and denying all other protests; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing of protests against the proposed construction of sewer mains and appurtenances in portions of the Alley in Block M, Tract Number Two of Alta Vista Suburb, and Franklin Avenue; under Resolution of Intention No. 72572; the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received.

Whereupon the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing the request of Irving Bromberg for license to operate a Mechanical Play Device; the Chief of Police having denied his application; the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

Attorney O. A. Thorpe appeared on behalf of Irving Bromberg and explained the operation of this device; requesting that his client be granted a license to use same in San Diego.

All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 72760, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, denying the petition of Irving Bromberg for license to operate a Mechanical Play Device in San Diego, under Ordinance No. 1874, New Series, was on motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

Petition of Pearl White Sweet for zone variance at 4275 Hermosa Way was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 72761, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Pearl White Sweet, 4275 Hermosa Way, to convert a dwelling into a duplex, on Villa Lot 46, Mission Hills; with no material change in the exterior of the building; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 12990 on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Petition of Annasa L. Miles for zone variance on 49th Street was presented; together with conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 72762, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, was on motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted, granting permission to Annasa L. Miles and Edna A. Miles, 3264 Estrella Avenue, to erect a contractor's Shop and Garage, 24 feet by 30 feet in Zone R-4, on Lots 21 and 22, Block 46, Fairmount (Tract 1368), upon the following conditions:

1. That it be revocable by the City Council if it results in a nuisance.
2. That no signs be displayed on the premises.
3. That no work be performed at night or on Sundays.

This Resolution granted a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 13559 in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned.

RESOLUTION NO. 72764, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Ralph E. Whitney, 4431 - 34th Street, to erect a single residence and Duplex over garage, in Zone R-2, on Lots 3 and 4, Block 65, Park Villas; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 12889 on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

Petition of D. S. Simison for zone variance at 1222 West Arbor Drive was presented; together with conditional recommendation from the City Planning Commission that the request be approved.

RESOLUTION NO. 72765, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to D. S. Simison, 1222 West Arbor Drive, to erect two additional residences in Zone R-1, on Lots 7 to 12, Block 18, Arnold and Choates Subdivision; on condition that the Commission pass upon the architecture of the buildings to see if they are suitable for the neighborhood; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 12988 on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Petition of H. L. Nelson for zone variance on Estrella Street was presented; together with conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 72766, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to H. L. Nelson, 4130 Estrella Street, to convert a commercial chicken ranch at 4140 Estrella Street into a commercial nursery in Zone R-4 on the north 20 feet of Lot 32 and all of Lots 33 to 36, Block 31, Fairmount Subdivision; upon condition that the variance be revocable by the City Council, and that any signs to be erected be first approved by the City Planning Commission; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 13559 on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of August Kasitz for zone variance on 69th Street was presented; together with conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 72767, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to August Kasitz, 6948 Amherst Street, to erect two residences on a portion of a 2.24 acre tract facing on 69th Street in Zone R-1, on Lot 12 (portion) Ex-Mission Subdivision provided that an easement to widen 69th Street be granted to the City; the easement to be thirty feet in width to match the easement recently granted the City by the adjoining owner; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 117 (New Series) on the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 72768, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Lenora T. Petition of Kay Jewelers for special Christmas display permit at 1026 - 5th Avenue was presented and read. Mr. Albert A. Gabbs appeared on behalf of the Kay Jewelers and presented a drawing of the proposed display.

RESOLUTION NO. 72773, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, denying the petition of Kay Jewelers, 1026 Fifth Avenue, for a Christmas display on a pole at the edge of the sidewalk in front of said Kay Jewelers and Christmas display on top of the store front, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Communication from Walter S. Lieber relative to granting park land to the United States Government for Hospital purposes was read and on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Simpson, ordered filed.

Resolution of the San Dieguito Irrigation District relative to needed repairs at the San Dieguito Dam was presented and on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, ordered filed.

Communication from the Board of Supervisors approving the partial flood-lighting of the Administration Building, Civic Center, at a cost of not to exceed the sum of \$35.00 per month, was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, referred to the Building Control Committee.

Communication from the San Diego Highway Development Association urging the installation of Parking Meters was presented and read.

Communication from the San Diego Junior Chamber of Commerce favoring parking meters was presented and read.

Communication from Col. Ralph E. Jones, U. S. Army, retired, relative to parking meters was presented and read.

Thereupon, RESOLUTION NO. 72774, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring the matter of installation of parking meters in the City of San Diego to Conference in the Mayor's office; and requesting the Mayor to set the time of said conference and notify persons interested; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

A motion was made by Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, that Joe Brennan be requested for a written report on parking meters now installed near the foot of Broadway, on the tidelands. Councilmen Simpson, Housh, Fish, and Knox and Mayor Benbough voted "Nay" on the motion.

Communication from Mrs. I. W. Adams relative to traffic conditions in San Diego was read and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Flowers, referred to the Chief of Police, through the City Manager's office.

Communication from the Funds Commission recommending the acceptance of an offer from Mrs. Alice L. Nolan for purchasing Bonds 13 and 14, Series 814, held in the Mount Hope Cemetery Fund, was presented and read.

RESOLUTION NO. 72775, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, authorizing and directing interested City Departments to accept \$51.96 for delinquent street improvement Bonds 13 and 14, Series 814, on Lots 39 and 40, Block 194, Pacific Beach, held in Mount Hope Cemetery Fund, as recommended by the City Funds Commission, under Document No. 324673, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

Communication from the Traffic Commission relative to the lighting of Pacific Highway, from Harasthy Street to Barnett Avenue, was read and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Fish, referred to the City Manager.

Communication from the Traffic Commission relative to the need of a full time Traffic Engineer, and recommending that James E. Reading be assigned to that post, devoting his full time to engineering problems as they affect the use of city streets, was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, referred to the City Manager with power to act.

By unanimous consent, at request of Councilman Flowers, the matter of one and two hour parking restriction enforcement was explained by Morey Levinson of the Legal Department. He stated that a major traffic ordinance is to be presented in about two weeks time covering this feature.

Communication from the Traffic Commission suggesting the use of State Traffic officers on Highways within the City limits was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, referred to the City Manager.

Communication from the Traffic Commission suggesting that the aid of members of the Sheriff's office be enlisted in the enforcement of traffic regulations on City Streets was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, referred to the City Manager.

Communication from the Traffic Commission recommending that the taxicab driver's license of Carroll W. Weathers be revoked was presented and read.

RESOLUTION NO. 72776, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, revoking the license of Carroll W. Weathers to drive a taxicab, (taxicab driver's license #222), was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Communication from the Traffic Commission recommending boulevard stop signs on the east and west side of Park Boulevard, at the intersection of Upas Street Extension, stopping traffic before entering Park Boulevard at this point, was read and on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, referred to the City Attorney for preparation of the necessary ordinance.

Communication from the Traffic Commission recommending two-hour parking restrictions on the west side of Pacific Boulevard adjacent to the Civic Center Building, from Date Street to Ash Street, was presented and on motion referred to the City Attorney for preparation of the necessary ordinance.

Communication from the City Auditor reporting on the claim of A. J. Hopkins for \$16.00 was presented and read.

RESOLUTION NO. 72784, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting the claim of A. J. Hopkins, 1068 - 21st Street, against the City of San Diego, in the amount of \$16.00 alleged to be due on account of damage done to his automobile by a City truck; and authorizing and directing the City Auditor to pay A. RESOLUTION NO. 72779, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, partially granting the claim of Perry M. Watt, 3211 - 32nd Street, for alleged damages done to his properties by stopping of a sewer at 3211 1/2 to 3219 1/2 - 32nd Street on October 8, 1940; and authorizing and directing the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance in the sum of \$112.50 from the Unappropriated Balance Fund in full settlement of said claim; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

By unanimous consent, at request of the City Manager, a proposed Resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego to enter into a co-operative agreement with the City of San Diego for the grading of 28th Street, from Beech to Juniper Streets; and the improvement by oil surfacing of 28th Street, from the mean high tide line to Juniper Street, under certain conditions specified in said Resolution, was presented.

A motion was made by Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Simpson, to adopt the Resolution.

Attorney Harvey Atherton spoke, requesting a formal hearing before any movement was made to improve 28th Street.

Wynn L. Van Schaick spoke on behalf of a delegation of property owners in opposition to the use of 28th Street as a thoroughfare.

C. R. Cunningham, Roland Reed, and several unidentified property owners spoke on the subject.

A protest of Residents against the extending of 28th Street was presented and ordered filed.

All interested persons having been heard, a roll call on the motion to adopt the Resolution as presented showed: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Knox and Flowers. Nays--Councilmen Weggenman, Housh, Fish and Mayor Benbough. Absent--None.

By unanimous consent, at request of the City Manager, RESOLUTION NO. 72780, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, requesting the Board of Supervisors to enter into a co-operative agreement with the City of San Diego for the improvement by oil surfacing of 35th Street, from Main Street to National Avenue; Rigel Street, from Main Street to National Avenue; Cottonwood Street, from Pluto Street to Rigel Street, and Boston Avenue, from 35th Street to 36th Street, under certain conditions specified in said Resolution, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

By unanimous consent, Communication from the City Attorney relative to request for refund of weed cleaning contribution by the Pacific Beach Chamber of Commerce was read and ordered filed, on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox.

Thereupon, ORDINANCE NO. 1993, New Series, recorded in Book 48 of Ordinances, authorizing the refund of certain unexpended money deposited with the City of San Diego by the Pacific Beach Chamber of Commerce on account of Sponsor's Contribution to SRA Project No. 675, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, placed on its final passage at its first reading by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, said ordinance was adopted by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.
The final reading of such ordinance was in full.

By unanimous consent, ORDINANCE NO. 1994, recorded in Book 48 of Ordinances, appropriating the sum of \$5000.00 out of the Street Improvement Fund of the City of San Diego for the purpose of purchasing material, hiring labor and renting equipment for the repair of streets, bridges and culverts in said City, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, placed on its final passage at its first reading by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, said ordinance was adopted by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.
The final reading of such ordinance was in full.

By unanimous consent, Petition of the Bureau of Radio & Electrical Appliances of San Diego County for permission to install temporary wiring in the Federal Housing Building in Balboa Park for the Fourth Annual Electrical Exposition, was presented; bearing approvals from the City Electrical Inspector, the Chief Building Inspector, the Fire Marshal and the City Manager.

RESOLUTION NO. 72781, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to the Bureau of Radio & Electrical Appliances of San Diego County by W. C. Gill, 3853 - 6th Avenue, to install temporary wiring in the Federal Housing Building in Balboa Park for the Fourth Annual Electrical Exposition to be held from December 3rd to 8th, 1940, without fees; and providing that the installation and removal of the wiring shall be under the supervision of the City Electrical Department, and the wiring shall be removed when the electrical show closes; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Chamber of the Council of the City of San Diego, California,
Tuesday, December 10th, 1940.

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Present--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Flowers and Mayor Benbough.

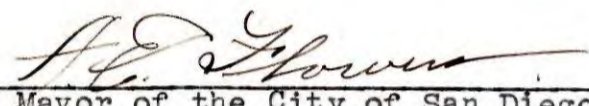

REGULAR MEETING

Chamber of the Council of the City of San Diego, California,
Tuesday, December 24th, 1940.

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Vice Mayor Flowers at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Present--Councilmen Weggenman, Fish, Knox and Flowers.
Clerk----Fred W. Sick.
Absent---Councilmen Simpson, Housh and Mayor Benbough.

In the absence of Mayor Benbough, Vice Mayor Flowers acted as chairman. On motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the minutes of the regular meeting of Tuesday, December 17th, 1940, were approved without reading.

At this time Councilmen Simpson and Housh entered and took their places on the Council.

Thereupon, RESOLUTION NO. 72963, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, abandoning the proceedings heretofore taken for the installing of a sewer main and appurtenances in portions of the Alleys in Blocks J and K, Tract Number Two of Alta Vista Suburb, and in a portion of Franklin Avenue, and in a portion of Ocean View Boulevard, under Resolution of Intention No. 72570, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing relative to a proposed ordinance adopting a Map entitled "Setback Lines, Curlew Street - between Palm and Redwood", and providing a penalty for the violation thereof, the Vice-Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

All interested persons having been heard, ORDINANCE NO. 2017, New Series, recorded in Book 48 of Ordinances, adopting a Map entitled "Setback Lines, Curlew Street - between Palm and Redwood", and providing a penalty for the violation thereof, was on motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, placed on its final passage at its first reading by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Fish, Knox, Flowers. Nays--None. Absent--Mayor Benbough.

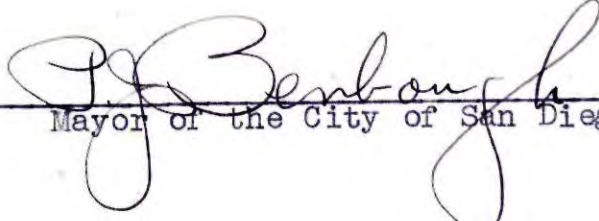

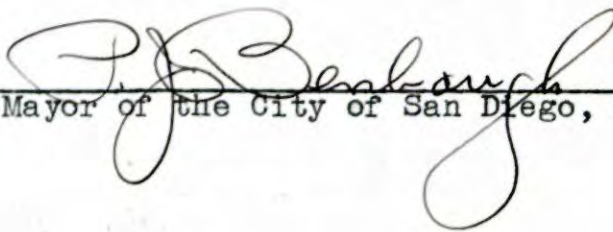

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

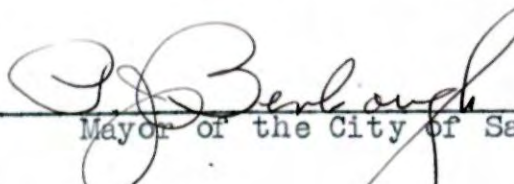

Said bid was from Griffith Company, endorsed, "Proposal for the improvement of FLORENCE STREET, San Diego, California."

All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, RESOLUTION NO. 73409, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, confirming the proposed assessment for furnishing electric current for Talmadge Park Lighting District Number Two, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing relative to a recommendation of the City Manager that certain licenses be revoked at 864 - 5th

Avenue, 915 - 7th Avenue, and 937 - 6th Avenue, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

Petition of Business Men on 7th Avenue for continuance of the license of Harry Phelps at 915 - 7th Avenue was presented.

Mr. D. McKee, representing Harry Phelps, spoke relative to the license of Harry Phelps at 915 - 7th Avenue.

A motion was made by Councilman Weggenman to uphold the City Manager's recommendation for revocation of this license. This motion lost for want of a second.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Flowers, the matter was referred to the City Attorney for an opinion on the Council's right to revoke food and cigar licenses. Petition of Veterans of Foreign Wars, by Thomas C. Ryan, for free inspection permits for Clark's Greater Shows to be exhibited starting February 20th, 1941, was presented; bearing recommendations for approval from the Chief Inspector, the Social Welfare Director and the City Manager.

RESOLUTION NO. 73413, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to the interested City Departments to issue free inspection permits for Clark's Greater Shows, to be exhibited February 20th to March 2nd, 1941; as petitioned for by the Veterans of Foreign Wars; on the condition that the regular \$50.00 per day carnival license fee be paid to the City; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

Petition of Card Room Operators for an ordinance to permit the card rooms to remain open until 2:00 A.M., instead of closing at midnight, was presented and read.

Communication from the Traffic Commission recommending signs and a light at the intersection of 47th Street and Federal Boulevard was presented and ordered filed.
