

REGULAR MEETING

Chamber of the Council of the City of San Diego, California,
Tuesday, February 25th, 1941.

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Present--Councilmen Simpson, Housh, Boud, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough.
Clerk----Fred W. Sick.
Absent---Councilman Weggenman.

On motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Flowers, the minutes of the regular meeting of Tuesday, February 18th, 1941, were approved without reading.

At this time Councilman Weggenman entered and took his place on the Council.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the Clerk reported that in response to notice inviting bids for paving and otherwise improving Ivy Street, between the west line of Bancroft Street and the east line of 33rd Street, under Resolution of Intention No. 72991, he had received four bids; which bids were on motion, duly and regularly, in open session, opened, examined and publicly declared.

Said bids were from the following, to-wit:

Daley Corporation; accompanied by a bond from the Maryland Casualty Company; which bid was given Document No. 326950.

V. R. Dennis Construction Co.; accompanied by a bond from the Eagle Indemnity Company; which bid was given Document No. 326951.

Griffith Company; accompanied by a bond from the National Surety Corporation; which bid was given Document No. 326952.

R. E. Hazard and Sons; accompanied by a bond from the Pacific Indemnity Company; which bid was given Document No. 326953.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Flowers, said bids were referred to the City Manager and the City Attorney for report and recommendation.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the Clerk reported that in response to notice inviting bids for paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 6, Subdivision of Blocks 3, 6, 9 and 12, City Heights Annex No. 1, between the north line of Wightman Street and the south line of University Avenue; and a portion of Wightman Street, between the southerly prolongation of the west line of the Alley in Block 6, Subdivision of Blocks 3, 6, 9 and 12, City Heights Annex No. 1 and the southerly prolongation of the east line of said alley; under Resolution of Intention No. 72992, he had received three bids; which bids were on motion, duly and regularly, in open session, opened, examined and publicly declared.

Said bids were from the following, to-wit:

V. R. Dennis Construction Co.; accompanied by a bond from the Eagle Indemnity Company; which bid was given Document No. 326954.

Harry L. Foster; accompanied by a bond from the Massachusetts Bonding and Insurance Company; which bid was given Document No. 326955.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, said bids were referred to the City Manager and the City Attorney for report and recommendation.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing protests on the City Engineer's report and estimate of cost for paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 5, Chester Park Addition, between the north line of Orange Avenue and the southerly line of El Cajon Boulevard, the Clerk reported that a written protest had been received from property owners, contained in Document No. 326881; which protest was presented and read. A communication from the City Engineer was presented and read, reporting on the percentage of frontage property represented in said protest bearing Document No. 326881.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 73467, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, sustaining the protest of Forrest F. Davidson, et al., filed in the office of the City Clerk on February 20, 1941, under Document No. 326881, against the City Engineer's estimate on the cost for the proposed work of paving and otherwise improving the Alley in Block 5, Chester Park Addition, between the north line of Orange Avenue and the southerly line of El Cajon Boulevard; and abandoning the proceedings heretofore taken for the proposed improvement; was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing protests against the furnishing of electric current for Talmadge Park Lighting District Number Four for the period ending March 31, 1942, the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, RESOLUTION NO. 73468, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, confirming the proposed assessment for furnishing electric current for Talmadge Park Lighting District Number Four, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing protests against the furnishing of electric current for Talmadge Park Lighting District Number Three for the period ending March 31, 1942, the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, RESOLUTION NO. 73469, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, confirming the proposed assessment for furnishing electric current for Talmadge Park Lighting District Number Three, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing relative to the provisions of a proposed Ordinance incorporating portions of L. L. Lockling's, Zimmerman's, Horton's and Sheldon's Subdivisions, in the City of San Diego, into "C" Zone, a draft of said proposed Ordinance was presented; together with petition of property owners for such zoning, and a recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, ORDINANCE NO. 2066, New Series, recorded in Book 48 of Ordinances, incorporating portions of L. L. Lockling's, Zimmerman's, Horton's and Sheldon's Subdivisions, in the City of San Diego, into "C" Zone, as defined by Ordinance No. 8924 of the Ordinances of said City, and amendments thereto, and repealing Ordinance No. 12942, approved September 4, 1930, in so far as the same conflicts with this Ordinance, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, placed on its final passage at its first reading by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Boud, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, said ordinance was adopted by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Boud, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None. The final reading of such ordinance was in full.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing relative to the provisions of a proposed Ordinance incorporating Lots 1 to 12, inclusive, Block 66, and all of Blocks 71 and 76, Park Villas, in the City of San Diego, California, into "R-2" Zone, a draft of said proposed Ordinance was presented; together with a petition of property owners for such zoning, and a recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, Ordinance No. 2067, New Series, recorded in Book 48 of Ordinances, incorporating Lots 1 to 12, inclusive, Block 66, and all of Blocks 71 and 76, Park Villas, in the City of San Diego, California, into "R-2" Zone, as defined by Ordinance No. 8924 of the Ordinances of said City, and amendments thereto; and repealing Ordinance No. 12889, approved July 7, 1930, in so far as the same conflicts with this Ordinance, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, placed on its final passage at its first reading by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Boud, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, said ordinance was adopted by the following vote, to-wit: Yeas--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Boud, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough. Nays--None. Absent--None. The final reading of such ordinance was in full.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing relative to the provisions of a proposed Ordinance regulating nursing homes in the City of San Diego; requiring a permit therefor and providing penalties for the violation thereof, a draft of said proposed Ordinance was presented; together with a resolution from the Board of Supervisors urging the adoption of such an ordinance; communication from Mrs. Hans Peters relative to the proposed Ordinance; and communication from the City Attorney's office on the subject.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 73470, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring to Council conference the proposed Ordinance regulating nursing homes in the City of San Diego, requiring a permit therefor and providing penalties for the violation thereof, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing relative to license revocations recommended by the City Manager under Document No. 326686, a communication from the City Attorney submitting an opinion relative to the Council's authority to revoke certain types of licenses and permits was presented and read.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 73471, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring to Council conference the communication from the City Attorney, bearing Document No. 326942, being an opinion regarding the City Council's authority to revoke licenses, was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of J. Harold Peterson for permission to improve Coutts Street, between Pacific Highway and Kurtz Street, at private contract was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Engineer.

RESOLUTION NO. 73472, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to J. Harold Peterson to improve Coutts Street, between Pacific Highway and Kurtz Street, at his own expense, in accordance with plans submitted, as petitioned for under Document No. 326895, at a provisional grade was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

Petition of J. Harold Peterson for permission to grade and pave Coutts Street,

between Pacific Highway and Kurtz Street, to a provisional grade, with the understanding that Mr. Peterson will pay any expense involved in the grade change, was presented.

RESOLUTION NO. 73473, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, authorizing the City Engineer to prepare and present to the Council a Resolution of Intention for change of grade proceedings on Coutts Street, between Pacific Highway and Kurtz Street; with the understanding that J. Harold Peterson shall pay all costs of such proceeding; in accordance with petition bearing Document No. 326894; was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Petition of A. Schreiber for permission to grade Union Street, between Spruce and Sassafras Streets, at private contract was presented; together with conditional recommendation from the City Engineer, approved by the City Manager, that the request be granted.

RESOLUTION NO. 73474, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to A. Schreiber, 4220 St. James Place, to improve Union Street, between Thorn and Sassafras Streets; Sassafras Street from Union Street to a point one hundred feet westerly; and the intersection of Union and Sassafras Streets, by grading and surfacing and constructing of curbs and drainage structures; all to be done to grades established by the City Engineer, at his own expense; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Petition of A. D. Elder for zone variance on 47th Street, near A Street, was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73475, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to A. D. Elder, 1348 - 47th Street, to erect a second residence on a portion of the southeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Lot 18, Ex Mission Lands, on a parcel to be 75 by 300 feet; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 35, New Series, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

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Petition of Walter Andersen for an auto trailer camp on Gaines Street was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73476, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Walter Andersen, 3860 Rosecrans Street, to conduct an auto trailer camp, consisting of forty-eight units, on Lots 7 to 12, Block 372, Wehrman's Subdivision, provided the proposed camp is properly landscaped according to plans submitted to the City Planning Commission, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

Petition of Mrs. Bess G. Wicks, 3825 Eagle Street, for zone variance at 6453 Pacific Highway for maintaining dog kennels was presented; together with a recommendation from the Planning Commission that the request be denied, but that the owner be given a permit for six months only.

RESOLUTION NO. 73477, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, denying the petition of Mrs. Bess G. Wicks, 3825 Eagle Street, for variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 138, New Series, on part of Lot 10, all of Lots 11, 12 and 13, Block 3, Stephen's Addition, for the purpose of maintaining and operating dog kennels at 6453 Pacific Highway; and granting a permit for a period of six months only, to continue operation of the kennels on said property, in order that another location for such operation may be secured; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Communication from the San Diego Newspaper Guild requesting City advertising in the annual "Gridiron" edition now being prepared to go to press was presented and read.

RESOLUTION NO. 73478, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, authorizing an advertisement in the 1941 edition of the "Gridiron", published by the San Diego Newspaper Guild; and authorizing a requisition to be drawn on the newspaper allocation of the Advertising and Publicity Fund for the sum of \$160.00 in payment thereof; was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of Estate of Frances S. Rosie for zone variance on Plum Street was presented; together with conditional recommendation from the City Planning Commission that the request be approved.

RESOLUTION NO. 73479, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Estate of Frances S. Rosie, by Donald Simison, administrator, to replat Lots 1, 2, 11 and 12, Block 55, Roseville, into three lots facing Plum Street; the lots on the corners of Fenelon and Garrison Streets to be each 70 by 100 feet, and the center lot shall be 60 by 100 feet; providing the setbacks along Fenelon and Garrison Streets are maintained and that a setback of ten feet is maintained on Plum Street; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 32, New Series, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned above; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of James E. Restine for zone variance at 3559 Felton Street was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73480, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to James E. Restine, 4440 - 32nd Street, to erect a duplex on the south nine feet of Lot 9 and all of Lots 10, 11 and 12, Block 60, Park Villas; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 12820, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned above; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

At this time Councilman Boud was excused from the meeting.

Petition of Louise Harty for zone variance at 4424 Arch Street was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73481, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Louise Harty, 4424 Arch Street, to erect a third residential unit on the northerly portion of Villa Lots 236 and 237, University Heights; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Ordinance No. 12988, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of E. C. Sidwell for setback suspension at Rosecrans and Jarvis Streets was presented; together with conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73482, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to E. C. Sidwell to construct a bungalow court on the south half of Lots 1, 2 and 3, Block 92, Roseville, not closer to the property line on Jarvis Street than six feet, provided the fifteen-foot setback is maintained along Rosecrans Street; and suspending the provisions of Setback Ordinance No. 12321, in so far as they relate to the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

Petition of Louise W. Fletcher for variance to restrictions at 3527 Dumas Street was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73483, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Louise W. Fletcher, 3527 Dumas Street, to erect a one-room addition to the residence on Lot 10, Block 252, Roseville, at the address mentioned; with a side yard of four feet, a rear yard of sixteen feet, and with a lot coverage of 42 per cent; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Section 8a of Ordinance No. 8924, as amended, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Petition of Josephine A. Jackson, M. D., for variance to restrictions at 7817 Prospect Place was presented; together with conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73484, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to Josephine A. Jackson, M. D., 7817 Prospect Place, to construct a single-family residence on Lot 6, Block 46, La Jolla Park, with a side yard of five and a side yard of twelve feet, and a rear yard of fifteen feet, provided that the dwelling and garage are not more than two stories in height; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Section 8a of Ordinance No. 8924, as amended, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned above; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

Petition of San Diego Unified School District for setback suspension at Eta and 40th Streets was presented; together with a recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73485, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting permission to San Diego Unified School District, 825 Union Street, by R. C. Dailard, to erect a school building on Lots 1 to 28, Block 2, S. W. Switzer Tract, to the property line on Eta Street; and suspending the provisions of Setback Ordinance No. 12321 in so far as said provisions relate to the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Petition of H. W. Sharman, et al., for naming the Alley in Block 1, Roseville Heights, VALEMONT PLACE was presented; together with recommendation from the City Planning Commission that the request be denied.

RESOLUTION NO. 73486, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, denying the petition for naming the westerly seventy-five feet of the east and west alley in Block 1, Roseville Heights, VALEMONT PLACE, as petitioned for under Document No. 326487, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, adopted.

At this time Councilman Boud returned and took his place on the Council.

Petition of Mabel S. Ekhardt for closing a portion of Friar's Road was presented; together with recommendations for approval from the City Engineer and the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73487, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting the petition bearing Document No. 320603 for the closing of portion of Friar's Road south of the existing improved highway in a portion of Pueblo Lot 1173; and directing the City Engineer to furnish a description of the district of lands to be affected and benefitted by, and to be assessed to pay the costs, damages and expenses of said proposed closing; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Petition of Robert Conard for amendment to Resolution No. 73355, relative to sideyard on property in Block 195, University Heights, was presented; together with recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73488, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, amending Resolution No. 73355, adopted February 11, 1941; and granting permission to Robert Conard, 1930 University Avenue, to construct a garage with apartment above, on the west fifty feet of Lots 25 to 28, Block 195, University Heights, with a side yard of eighteen feet, a rear yard of four feet, and a lot coverage of thirty per cent; and granting a variance to the restrictions of Section 8a of Ordinance No. 8924, as amended, in so far as said restrictions relate to the property mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Petition of T. A. McClellan, et al., for extension of time on Zone Variance on 30th Street, granted originally by Resolution No. 67194, was presented; together with conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73489, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting an extension of two years' time from February 15, 1941, to T. A. McClellan, 1738 Dale Street, to operate a grocery, fruit and vegetable market on Lots 23 and 24, Block 97, E. W. Morse Addition, in accordance with variance to the provisions of Ordinance No. 12795 originally granted by Resolution No. 67194, adopted February 15, 1938; provided the building is painted and any signs are approved before erection on the property by the City Planning Commission; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Communication from R. C. Rose offering to dedicate certain land for road purposes was presented; together with a communication from the City Engineer recommending that the offer be accepted, and a conditional recommendation for approval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73490, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, adopting the recommendations of the City Engineer and City Planning Commission that the offer of R. C. Rose, agent and part owner, P.O. Box 46, La Jolla, to deed land in Pueblo Lots 1281 and 1280 for the extension of Avenida De La Playa be accepted; provided the owner grades, surfaces and drains the road in a manner acceptable to the City Engineer; and authorizing and directing the City Engineer to proceed to secure a deed to the property on the conditions mentioned; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Communication from C. Leon de Aryan relative to traffic congestion at 6th Avenue and University Avenue, and requesting that a proposition be placed on the ballot to vote out of Balboa Park Seventh Avenue Extension near Upas Street for street purposes, was presented; together with recommendation for disapproval from the City Planning Commission.

RESOLUTION NO. 73491, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, denying the petition of C. Leon de Aryan, P.O. Box 349, East San Diego, requesting the Council to submit a proposition at the coming general election to open Seventh Avenue south to connect with the existing Park Road in Balboa Park, parallel with Sixth Avenue, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Petition of Ralph E. O'Brien for a hearing relative to his application for taxicab driver's license, which was refused him by the Chief of Police, was presented.

RESOLUTION NO. 73492, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting the petition of Ralph E. O'Brien, 2053 Woden Street, for a hearing on his application for a City taxicab driver's license, denied by the Chief of Police; and setting a hearing on said application for March 4, 1941, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M.; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Communication from the Mission Bay State Park Association commending City officials relative to brief presented covering the San Diego River Flood Control matter was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, ordered filed.

Communication from the San Diego River Flood Control urging that Councilman Simpson and Hydraulic Engineer Pyle be sent to Washington, D. C., to appear before the Board of Engineers for rivers and harbors to advance the proposed flood control on the San Diego River, was presented and read.

Mr. J. I. Cahill, Major Gott and a representative of the North San Diego Chamber of Commerce spoke in favor of City Manager Walter W. Cooper and Councilman Frederick W. Simpson being sent to Washington, D. C., on this matter.

Communication from the North San Diego Chamber of Commerce relative to sending representatives to Washington, D. C., to secure flood control assistance on the San Diego River was read and ordered filed.

Communication from the Council of Chambers of Commerce and Civic Clubs relative to sending representatives to Washington, D. C., to secure flood control assistance on the San Diego River was read and ordered filed.

Thereupon, RESOLUTION NO. 73498, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, authorizing Councilman Fred W. Simpson to accompany the City Manager to Washington, D. C., in the presentation of the City's case before the Board of Engineers for Rivers and Harbors in connection with securing Federal aid for San Diego River flood control; and authorizing Councilman Simpson to incur the necessary expenses in connection therewith; was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted. Councilman Housh voted, "Nay" on the motion.

Communication from Council of Chambers of Commerce and Civic Clubs relative to unsanitary conditions along Chollas Creek was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman referred to the City Manager.

Communication from W. E. Severance relative to the proposed fencing of wrecking yards was read and on motion of Councilman Housh, ordered filed.

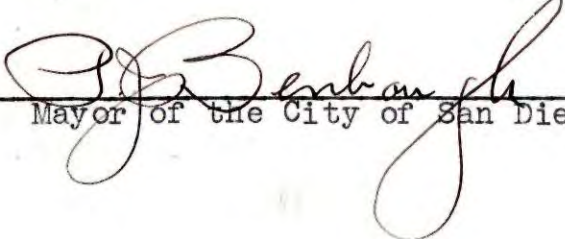

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Present--Councilmen Simpson, Weggenman, Housh, Boud, Knox, Flowers and Mayor Benbough.

On motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the minutes of the regular meeting of Tuesday, March 11th, 1941, were approved without reading.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the Clerk reported that in response to notice inviting bids for paving and otherwise improving the North and South Alley in Block 107, University Heights, between the south line of Meade Avenue and the north line of the east and west alley in said Block 107, under Resolution of Intention No. 73139, he had received four bids; which bids were on motion, duly and regularly, in open session, opened, examined and publicly declared.

Said bids were from the following, to-wit:

Daley Corporation; accompanied by a bond from the Maryland Casualty Company; which bid was given Document No. 327540.

V. R. Dennis Construction Co.; accompanied by a bond from Glens Falls Indemnity Company; which bid was given Document No. 327541.

Griffith Company; accompanied by a bond from the National Surety Corporation; which bid was given Document No. 327542.

R. E. Hazard and Sons; accompanied by a bond from the Pacific Indemnity Company; which bid was given Document No. 327543.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, said bids were referred to the City Manager and the City Attorney for report and recommendation.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing of protests against the proposed paving and otherwise improving of 32nd Street, between the northerly line of Cedar Street and the southerly line of Elm Street; and Date Street, between the easterly line of 32nd Street and the westerly line of Bancroft Street; under Resolution of Intention No. 73383; the Clerk reported that no written protests had been received.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. having arrived, the time set for hearing appeals from the City Engineer's assessment for sidewalking and otherwise improving Main Street, between the southeasterly boundary line of the City of San Diego and the east line of 32nd Street; under Resolution of Intention No. 72211; the Clerk reported that a written protest had been received from Mattie A. McIntire, which protest and appeal was presented and read.

Thereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard.

All interested persons having been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 73628, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, overruling the appeal and protest of Mattie A. McIntire, contained in Document No. 327407, and overruling all other protests against the City Engineer's assessment No. 1723, made to cover the cost and expenses of sidewalking and otherwise improving of Main Street, between the southeasterly boundary line of the City of San Diego and the east line of 32nd Street, under Resolution of Intention No. 72211; and confirming the City Engineer's Assessment No. 1723, for sidewalking and otherwise improving of Main Street under said Resolution of Intention No. 72211; and authorizing the City Engineer to attach his warrant thereto, and record the same in the manner and form required by law; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

1941, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

At this time a majority of the members of the Council signed the Bond of Allen B. Higdon as Cashier at the Golf Course.

Petition of the Original Ranchers Market Association, continued from the meeting of March 11th, 1941, was again considered.

After all interested persons had been heard, RESOLUTION NO. 73630, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, appointing Councilman Harley E. Knox as a representative of the Council to meet with the Health Department and members of the Original Ranchers Market Association to study and recommend to the Council on the matter of food inspection permits for the operation of the Ranchers' Market at Eighth Avenue and G Street, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

Petition of Peniel Mission for permission to hold street meetings at the corner of Sixth Avenue and Market Street was presented; together with recommendations for denial from the Chief of Police and from the City Manager.

RESOLUTION NO. 73631, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, denying the petition of Peniel Mission, 620 Market Street, by Miss Charlotte Warren and Miss Eleanor Bennett, for permission to conduct street meetings at the northwest corner of Sixth Avenue and Market Street, was on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

Thereupon, RESOLUTION NO. 73641, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, authorizing and directing the City Attorney to prepare and present to the Council a lease with Frank Evans on the Isolation Hospital building as headquarters for the San Diego County Sheriff Rangers; the term of the lease to be for five years, with a sixty-day cancellation clause, at a rental of twenty dollars per month; was on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.

At this time Councilman Boud returned and took his place on the Council.

Communication from Hugh F. Communication from the County Board of Supervisors relative to the Anza Park Extension, requesting the Council to file a protest with the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Washington, D. C., in the form of a resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. 73643, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring to the City Attorney for preparation of a resolution the communication from the Board of Supervisors of San Diego County, bearing Document No. 327461, together with a copy of resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors on March 10, 1941, in connection with the proposed inclusion of land in the Borego, Vallecito and Carriso regions in the California State Park System, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, adopted.

Councilmen Simpson and Housh voted "Nay" on the motion to adopt this Resolution.

Communication from Thomas H. Tulloch, secretary of the Board of Administration of the City Employees' Retirement System, advising the Council that the five year term of Mr. C. F. Atkinson as the Insurance member of said Board will expire on March 20, 1941, was presented and read.

RESOLUTION NO. 73644, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring to Council conference the communication from Thomas H. Tulloch, Secretary of the City Employees' Retirement System, bearing Document No. 327464, advising the Council that the five year term of C. F. Atkinson, the insurance member of the Board of Administration of the City Employees' Retirement System will expire on March 20, 1941, was on motion of Councilman Weggenman adopted.

Communication from the San Diego Symphony Orchestra Association requesting an appropriation of \$5000.00 to the Association to aid in carrying on a successful Midsummer Nights Series during 1941 was presented and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, RESOLUTION NO. 73645, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring to the budget the communication from Board of Directors, San Diego Symphony Orchestra Association, 918 San Diego Trust & Savings Building, by Donald B. 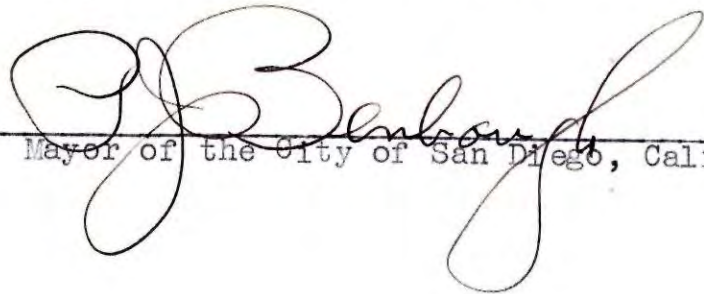

A regular meeting of the Council of the City of San Diego, California, was held this date, and was called to order by Mayor Benbough at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Whereupon, the Mayor inquired if any interested persons were present who desired to be heard. All interested persons having been heard, and no protestants having appeared, on motion of Councilman Knox, seconded by Councilman Boud, the proceedings were referred to the City Attorney.

Petition of Property Owners for paving the Alley in Block 158, University Heights was presented; together with a communication from the City Engineer, approved by the City Manager, recommending that the request be granted as it bears signatures of the owners of 66% of the frontage property.

RESOLUTION NO. 73877, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, granting the petition for paving the Alley in Block 158, University Heights, contained in Document No. 328246; type of pavement to be six inches of cement concrete; and authorizing and directing the City Engineer to prepare and submit a plat of the district to be assessed for the proposed improvement; was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Boud, adopted.

Mr. C. Leon de Aryan spoke relative to the subject matter in this communication.

RESOLUTION NO. 73882, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, referring to the City Attorney for report and opinion the communication from C. Leon de Aryan regarding initiative petitions contained in Document No. 328212; and requesting the City Attorney to prepare a resolution urging the State Senator and Assemblymen from this district to present and work for the adoption of legislation on this subject; was on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Housh, adopted.

Communication from Frank E. Atwood offering to purchase the old City Hall Building, including the lot, at the southwest corner of Fifth Avenue and G Street, for \$10,000.00 cash was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Boud, referred to the City Manager.

Communication from the San Diego Highway Development Association relative to the Cabrillo Freeway pavement was presented and read.

RESOLUTION NO. 73884, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Boud, adopted, reading as follows:

"RESOLUTION NO. 73884.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, as follows:

The State Highway Commission is about to commence the construction of the extension of Highway 395 through Balboa Park and across Mission Valley, tentatively known as Cabrillo Parkway, and said Parkway will carry a heavy load of traffic, and

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the meeting was adjourned.

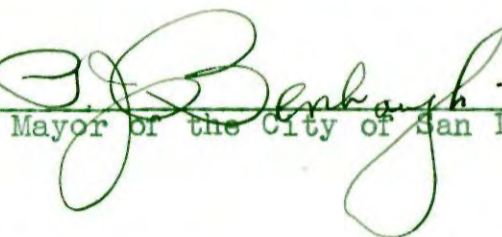

Communication from Local Defense Housing Committee suggesting regulations for rooming houses was read and on motion of Councilman Weggenman, seconded by Councilman Simpson, referred to the City Manager.

Communication from the San Diego Chamber of Commerce relative to recreation facilities needed at various Military Reservations was read and on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Housh, referred to the Mayor for a report.

Communication from the Local Defense Housing Committee relative to the appointment of a Fair Rent Committee was presented and read.
RESOLUTION NO. 74058, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, placing the Council on record as approving the appointment of a suggested Fair Rent Committee for San Diego by the Local Defense Housing Committee; which committee would serve without compensation, and work with the Defense Housing Committee; was on motion of Councilman Simpson, seconded by Councilman Flowers, adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 74059, recorded in Book 64 of Resolutions, authorizing Mayor P. J. Benbough and Councilman Fred W. Simpson to negotiate for the purchase of property in Ocean Beach for recreational purposes, was on motion of Councilman Boud, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, adopted.

At this time Councilman Addison E. Housh expressed his pleasure at having worked on the City Council for the past four years, and his appreciation at the cooperation of the City personnel.

Thereupon, on motion of Councilman Flowers, seconded by Councilman Weggenman, the meeting was adjourned.
