GOAL: Recovering "all" City legal Resolutions

Completed Storage Sites :

- 1. Cage
- 2. Store
- 3. Base

Why?

It is the goal of the City Clerk Archives to have a legal record of every Resolution produced by the City.

GOAL: Digitizing the conversion

of 1,195 magnetic reel to reel to an MP3 format

Why?

To preserve the inevitable decay and endangered audio of our Council's actions. Once the conversion takes place the Archives will upload to the City Clerk Digital Archives to maintain perpetual access through digitization. GOAL: Public outreach is educating, engaging and empowering the populace

Why?

Alice Birney Elementary, an International Studies Magnet made a field-trip to see our municipalities Archival holdings, special "THANK YOU" to Assemblymember Ward, of the 78th District and Councilmember Whitburn of the 3rd District

GOAL:

- 258 Historical and legal boxes in the Archives identified
- 222 Boxes have been successfully inventoried at item level
- Information is now in the City's Versatile system
- 14% Remaining for inventory
