City launches new resident-driven website


checking the status of permits. It is also mobile friendly, optimized for smart phones and tablets. [Visit the new site...](#)

The City collects, produces and stores an enormous amount of data. A few examples include crime counts, parking meter revenue, traffic counts and capital projects. Community members are invited to vote on datasets they would like the City to prioritize releasing. City Council recently approved the allocation of \$7.6 million in Community Development Block Grant funds to infrastructure projects throughout San Diego. One of the projects is a new Teen Technology Center at Malcolm X Library. Others include rebuilding Park de la Cruz, repairing two police stations and energy efficiency projects. Leveraged with other public
