SUBJECT: Appointments to the Citizens' Review Board on Police Practices

It is my pleasure to appoint Mr. Tom Lincoln, Ms. Joyce Mohrlock, Ms. Diana Dent, Mr. Brandon Hilpert, Ms. Charlene McAdory, Mr. Pieter O'Leary, Mr. Taury Gentry, Ms. Mary O'Tousa, and Mr. Larry McMinn to the Citizens' Review Board on Police Practices. These appointments are not subject to City Council confirmation.

It is also my pleasure to reappoint Mr. William Beck, Mr. Douglas Case, Mr. Joe Craver, Mr. Godwin Higa, Mr. Jim Hurl, Jr., Ms. Kathy Vandenheuval, Ms. Ernestine Smith, Ms. Lisa Sorce, Ms. Pauline Theodore, Ms. Nancy Vaughn, and Mr. Martin Workman.

Mr. Lincoln is a Judge Pro Tem as well as an arbitrator for the Supreme Court of California. He was formerly a prosecutor for San Diego City Attorney's Office and as associate with McCormick & Royce as well as a partner with Bacalski & Lincoln. Mr. Lincoln was honored with winning the Larry Syhre Award in 2001 for providing education and ethics to the legal profession. He received a B.A. from San Diego State University and a J.D. from the University of San Diego.

Ms. Mohrlock served as the Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff for the Marine Corps Installations West and for the Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton. She previously served as the Deputy Director and then Deputy Assistant Chief of Staff in the Marine Corps Community Services. Ms. Mohrlock was also a Training and Operations Officer in the United States Army Reserves for 15 years before being honorably discharged. She continues to be an active community member as a volunteer worker for the Superior

Court Criminal Division. Ms. Mohrlock received a B.A. from San Diego State University and since then has pursued further education through the U.S. Army Officer's Advance Course, a Strategic Business Planning program, and an Executive Skills Development Course.

Ms. Dent is a fourth grade teacher at Cherokee Point Elementary School and a mentor teacher for San Diego Unified School District, where she develops programs and facilitates training with the school district. She is involved in the International Studies Education Project at San Diego State University and the Video in the Classroom project for San Diego County Education. Ms. Dent received a B.A. and M.A. from San Diego State University.

Mr. Hilpert is the current Director of Marketing at GDC Communities, a real estate developer in Carmel Valley, where he manages all aspects of corporate marketing for the company. His professional experience focuses on internet marketing and includes work with multiple companies throughout the dot-com boom. Mr. Hilpert is a current member of the North Park Planning Committee. He received Bachelors of Arts in Psychology and Political Science from San Diego State University with a minor in Sociology.

Ms. McAdory is a labor compliance professional with over twenty years of administrative and technical experience. She is a retired contract compliance administrator and equal employment administrator with the Centre City Development Corporation. Ms. McAdory also worked as a Humans Resource Analyst for Southwestern Community College where she assisted with recruitment and selection of professors and adjunct instructors among many other tasks. She received a B.S. from National American University, a M.A. from Concordia University, and is currently a Doctoral Candidate at Nova Southeastern University.

Mr. O'Leary is an attorney at Burdman & Ward where he practices civil litigation with an emphasis on fraud and misrepresentation, contract, and general tort disputes in state and federal court. He has been a practicing attorney since graduating from California Western School of Law with a J.D., after having received a B.A. in history from Wilfrid Laurier University and a M.A. in history from Pepperdine University. Mr. O'Leary is a current member of the San Diego County Bar Association as well as a volunteer at San Diego Legal Aid Society, V.I.P. Mentors, and San Diego Volunteer Lawyer Program.

Ms. Gentry is currently a supervisor of training and IT support and is the Principal Training and Support Programmer Analyst for UCSD Health System Information Services. She has also worked with companies including; UCSD Business and Financial Services, Kaiser Permanente, USCD Healthcare Nursing and UCSD Administrative Professional Programs. Ms. Gentry received her high school education from University City High School and has completed and received certificates from

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educational courses provided by the University of California, San Diego and industry specific companies.

Ms. O'Tousa is a retired corporate executive with a focus on benefits management and financial consulting. She is an active member of the community through local volunteering with the San Diego Humane Society as well as at Words Alive, where she serves as a site manager for a Juvenile Court and Community School. Ms. O'Tousa earned a B.A. from the University of California at Irvine and a M.B.A. from the University of Chicago Graduate School of Business, and she is currently enrolled in the Citizens' Academy through the District Attorney's Office.

Mr. McMinn is a volunteer and board member for the Stonewall Citizens' Patrol, an organization that provides a general security presence in Hillcrest, North Park and University Heights. He is an experienced surgical technologist with most of his experience coming from his service in the United States Navy. Mr. McMinn is a disabled veteran and a member of the LGBT community.
