The Community Review Board on Police Practices (CRB) was established in 1988 to review citizen complaints against San Diego Police Officers, review all officer-involved shootings and in-custody deaths, and review the administration of discipline in cases of sustained allegations. The Board also recommends changes in policy, procedure and training to the Chief of Police and the Mayor.

The volunteer board members average 20- 30 hours per month on case review, Board meetings, committee work, ride-alongs, and training, amassing over 5,000 hours annually. Over the past five years, the Board has reviewed an average of 75 cases each year.
