

How-To Create a Cork Planter Refrigerator Magnet

This one is as environmentally friendly as it is beautiful and addicting. Be careful, or you'll wind up with a never-ending garden hanging on your fridge! You'll need:

Corks

Small amount of soil

Succulent clippings, small

Magnets

Hot glue gun

Screwdriver

Paring knife

Start by using your screwdriver to punch a small hole in the top of the cork. The entry point of your corkscrew makes a great entry point. Use your knife to wiggle and break loose the corking, to about half way through the cork.

Use your hot glue gun to attach the small magnet to the back of your cork. While they're available, I don't recommend self-adhesive magnets, as the cylindrical shape of the cork makes it difficult for them to stay connected. Hot glue forms a much tighter bond.

Fill the tiny planter with soil and place your succulent clippings inside. Maintenance is easy, just a drop of water every now and again, and your fridge now looks like a living work of art!
